From the Parish Council

Drainage problems

People who live in Over Road, Haden Way and Rook Grove will remember the problems a few weeks ago when the drains were unable to cope with the heavy rainfall. The Council has now written to Anglian Water and the Environment Agency pointing out that the present drainage system in Willingham is not able to cope with the current level of use, much less the extra load it will have from all the new building. Urgent information has been requested on any plans to upgrade the system. Responses and any developments will be reported in future Parish Magazines.

Village footways

An officer from County Highways has agreed to walk round Willingham with members of the Parish Council, to note for himself the very poor state of the footpaths and painted road signage. The Council intends to press the County Council for action.

Shared cycle/footway between Willingham and Longstanton, and traffic calming proposals



County Highways have analysed the responses to questionnaires circulated at the recent open meeting on traffic calming and the proposed shared-use cycle/footway, and letters written by

some who could not attend it. The Council will have had to make its recommendation to County Highways by the end of October, in order to take advantage of the available finance; and there will be a further report on this next month.

The Council is grateful to those who attended the meeting and completed questionnaires, or who wrote in if they could not attend. Unfortunately the attendance and response was less than hoped for. The Council is taking account of the questionnaire responses and letters in formulating its recommendations; but in the awareness that, due to the small response, this is less representative than it would have wished.

Connections youth bus

The Council is supporting an offer for the Connections Bus Project to attend weekly at the Ploughman Hall from 19 October to the end of July



2006. Discussions are in hand for the long-term future of the youth club.

Street lights in surgery road

County Highways have informed the Parish Clerk that the new street lights in the road off Long Lane to the surgery should be connected by the end of November.

Flu vaccinations

Have you had your flu jab yet? We booking remember to tell reception that the appointment is for a flu vaccination. It is recommended for all people aged 65 or more, and people with chronic medical conditions such as heart, liver or kidney disease, diabetes, asthma or



other lung diseases. If in doubt ask the doctor or nurse for advice.

Pneumonia vaccination is also available for the same group of people, but is only required once, so if you have never received a pneumonia vaccine it can be given at the same time.

Yellow Fever Clinics

We have recently renewed our licence as a Yellow Fever Centre. We have organised a direct contract with the supplier to ensure regular supplies following a national shortage of the vaccine. Non-registered patients are welcome to use the Yellow Fever Clinic.

Please note the phone number for ordering repeat prescriptions is **01954 260073** and we would be grateful if you could have your repeat prescription order form to hand when requesting your repeats. We

now have a new Dispensing Trainee, Ami, who is working towards her NVQ 2 qualification. It will take her several months to get to know our regular patients, and your help would be much appreciated as she learns the ropes!

From 21 November we will be issuing two months' supply of repeat medication to ensure you have sufficient supplies to tide you over Christmas and New Year.

We have two new receptionists, Helen and Yvonne, in training so please bear with them until they become familiar with our patients and our way of working. They will always be supervised by one of our experienced receptionists.

Well Man and Woman Health Checks

St Mary & All Saints Church Restoration Appeal



We have been telling you about a series of events organised by the Restoration committee. In October there were two: the quiz night, and the Sacristy talks and drama. The committee is most grateful for the support and encouragement which people offer.

It is a good time to tell you how the Appeal is going.

Since the Appeal began in 2001 we have raised about **£38,000** (including about **£5,700** from Rene Gould's bric-a-brac stall, and including also a **£2,000** grant from Cambridgeshire Historic Churches Trust)

We have spent about **£22,500** on the Sacristy and **£5,500** on the chimney.

We still need to raise money to repair the north aisle roof, and to carry out work on the organ.

Cakes

One regular and continuing source of money for the Appeal is the monthly cake stall. It takes place at the church on the first Saturday in each month. It is very popular, and produces an income of well over £100 each month (in September it actually raised £200). There is a small team who provide the cakes unfailingly month by month. They welcome buyers,

Pastoral Letter

Remembering: Shortbread with chocolate custard!



I sat at my Mother's bedside recently, called there by the excellent nursing staff at Bideford Hospital. As she slept, at times almost too soundly, I remembered. There was so much to remember. As I looked at her hands I remembered the many many jumpers and tank tops she had knitted me as a child with those hands that now looked so worn and twisted by arthritis. I looked at her face and remembered the way in which every night as a child she had said the Lord's prayer with me as I curled up in bed, ready to fall off to sleep. I sat there for hours, looking and remembering, remembering, remembering.

My thoughts wandered to other aspects of my childhood, dens built in the woods at the bottom of the garden, picnics in the countryside, days on the beach on the wonderful North Devon coast. As I remembered, it gave me hope. Mum had been a good Mum, no, she hadn't got everything right, but her interaction with me had a positive influence. She had always carried good wholesome values with her- she had not led me astray in her gentle way she had guided me in good ways although I didn't realise it at the time. It was so good to remember.

I suspect that it was childhood memories of Sunday School that resulted in my interest in Christianity at the age of 27. Having well and truly left the church behind at the age of 13, I faintly remembered that I had touched on something special in those Bible stories and the people I had met at church. Memories gave me hope for the future which I had come to realise it was impossible for me to guarantee. Remembering there was something better made me find out more about the Christian faith and it was in Jesus that I found the hope and promises I needed to secure my life. Remembering had brought hope found in a love that will never fail.

It's crucial that we spend time remembering, isn't it, and this month gives us an important opportunity to do just that. On the 11th day of the 11th month the nation will remember those who have given (and continue to give) so much in serving our country. Time marches on, but memories remain and sometimes become more valuable than we could ever have anticipated. As we remember with thanks in our hearts I pray that we would be given hope for the future, recognising that our actions today will be the basis for memories in the future.

And as for that 'Shortbread with chocolate custard? Little did those 1960s school dinner ladies realise what fond memories would be carried though my life as a result of their dedicated cooking of real school dinners (be encouraged Willingham Primary)!
