Two Decades of Willingham Gardening Club

It seems amazing that Willingham Gardening Club is now 20 years old. While similar clubs in other villages are closing down or running with very small numbers, we still boast a membership of more than 80 and offer a full programme of speakers, garden outings and the annual holiday as well as the Willingham Horticulture and Craft Show.

The club was formed in October 1985 and the first meeting was held on the second Thursday in January 1986, with the first AGM in March of that year. The

annual subscription was set at £3.00, although this was raised to £5.00 in 1988 and to £6.00 in 1991 with reductions for senior citizens, before being set at £5.00 for all members in 1993 - which is what it is today. There cannot be many instances of prices that have remained the same for the past 12 years, or any better value for money.

The first chairman to be voted in at the 1986 meeting was Lyn Curtis, who, although she is no longer on the committee, remains very active in the club and the Horticultural Show. Tony Halsey, who has been Chairman since 1991, is the only member still on the committee since that meeting in 1986.

The gardening club membership is drawn primarily from the village, although we welcome members, guests and friends from outside the village to join in our activities and outings and to enter flowers, plants, produce or crafts in the Horticultural Show. The show has been a regular feature of the first Saturday in September for many years and has raised thousands of pounds for charity. It is a busy day for the competitors and helpers alike, starting at 8 30 am with staging the entries and going through until about 5 o'clock for the Auction of Produce and the Grand Draw, followed, of course, by the grand clear up. If you haven't been to the show and auction yet, make a date to come along this year – there are some great bargains and all the profits go to Cancer Research.

Another opportunity to find some bargains and perhaps get some free gardening advice from club members is the annual plant sale. This is held in the High Street, next to the Post Office. Watch out for details of the time and date in Willingham Parish Magazine.

We no longer meet on the second Thursday, but the first

Monday of every month in the Social Club. Meetings start at 7 30 pm and the £5 membership covers the entrance to the meetings, a members' evening outing in August and a Christmas Party with entertainment and supper at the December meeting - and all for £5.00 a year!

The new membership year starts in April and let's hope that this will be the start of another 20 years.

Come along and join us. You will be made very welcome.

Housing and Parish Council 'Surgeries'

There will be a joint 'surgery' with the Housing Advice Centre on 1 February, 10 am to 12 noon, at the Baptist Church in George Street, where you can bring any questions or concerns you may have about village matters. The Parish Council would still like to know if people would find a different time or venue to hold these 'surgeries' more acceptable.

Police Community Support Officer

The new Police Community Support Officer, John Mason, started work at the beginning of January. He has already been on patrol around the village a number of times. Do make him welcome if you see him, and let him know of any public order, crime, or traffic concerns you may have. He is out and about much of the time in one of the four villages he covers (Over, Swavesey and Longstanton as well as Willingham) but messages can also be left for him via the Police Customer Service Centre on 08454-564-564, or via Community Beat Manager Alison Jones's E-mail, alison.jones@cambs.pnn.police.uk. Cycle theft

The police have asked us to pass

on the information that they have recovered many stolen bicycles in police operations over the past few weeks, which are so far unclaimed. If you



have reported your bicycle as stolen, the cycle store at Parkside Police Station in Cambridge is well worth a visit, or a phone call via 08454-564-564. The Cambridgeshire Constabulary website www.cambs.police.uk also has details of recovered cycles, but allow for some delay in entering recentlyrecovered bikes on to the site. NB:- The police do not have space to keep stolen cycles indefinitely; they keep them for a month and then if they are not claimed they send them off for auction; so do keep checking if you have lost a bike recently. (To check on cycles for sale, go to www.auctions.freeserve.co.uk or E-mail cambsauctions@vahoo.com .)

The police advise owners of cycles to keep a record of identifying details: make, model, colour and (most importantly) frame number, in case of theft. Finally, they stress that if you have a bicycle stolen, it is always worth reporting this to the police (giving all these details especially the frame number). They do stop people on bikes they suspect are stolen, and all too often have the frustration of having to let them go if they do not have a report of those thefts.

Cambridgeshire County Council – B1050/Hatton's Road Junction

The County Council reports that the works at this junction and at Bar Hill are running one week ahead of schedule and are due to finish by the end of March. The works are part of a scheme to reduce the number of accidents at the junction, which has one of the worst accident records in the County. It should also reduce congestion.

When work started in November there were initial problems with traffic congestion, and it was therefore agreed that the early parts of the roadworks would be carried out by different methods and that the contractors would work through the night on several occasions.

To make the connections from the existing road to the new roundabout, the A 14 eastbound off-



slip will be closed for two weekends betweem Saturday 4 February and Monday 6 March. It is expected that the work will be undertaken from 8 00 pm on the 5 Saturday until 6 00 am on the Monday. The dates will be published nearer the time on www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/hattonsroad or by calling 01223 718362. A diversion will be in place via the Oakington off-slip on the A 14 eastbound, and back on to the A 14 westbound.

Longstanton surgery open

Our long awaited branch surgery in Longstanton opened to the public on 3 January and is already proving to be very busy, which shows that there was definitely a need for the service. This new surgery should also help to relieve the pressure on the main surgery in Willingham. There have been some initial problems with the computer links to the main surgery which meant that for the first few days we were unable to book appointments there and prescriptions were delayed. However we hope that the problems are now resolved and things will run more smoothly now.

We held an Open Morning for villagers on 7 January which was very popular and we had a very positive response. Patients were shown around the new facilities. At the moment it is very new but we will gradually add more homely touches with pictures of the local area and I am sure it will soon feel owned by 'Longstantoners'. All four doctors and nurses will hold one surgery session per week at Longstanton.

We are sorry that we are unable to continue our weekly session at the Dale Community Centre but we do have to consider the whole village. Any older people who are unable to get to the new branch surgery can request a visit from the doctor as has always been the case. Repeat medication will now be sent to the new branch surgery for collection during opening hours or you can choose to collect your medicines from the Willingham surgery which is open later in the evenings. An information letter has been sent with all medicines over the last month but if anyone needs further details please contact us.

Computer problems in Dispensary

We would like to thank you all for your patience during



the recent problems we were experiencing with our new computer system which has been installed to provide links to the new branch surgery. As often happens with computer upgrades there were some 'teething problems'. This caused major disruption to the work in the dispensary and as a result a few prescriptions were not ready for collection as speedily as usual. We apologise for any inconvenience and thank you for your understanding.

Use it or lose it... your library needs your support

In the year ahead Cambridgeshire County Council anticipate a 'huge' gap between what is needed to maintain existing services and what is likely to be available. Pastoral Letter

Respect? What does it mean for us in Willingham?

There is much talk about respect in these days. I imagine it's because many of us sense that things aren't quite what they used to be. Our society is changing rapidly and often seemingly for the worse. Actor David Oyelowo, star of the TV series 'Spooks' recently made the point that 'respecting others is the cornerstone of a healthy society'. The Government's Respect website (www.respect.gov.uk) states 'Respect cannot be learned, purchased or acquired - it can only be earned'. Respect is about tolerance, acceptance and showing common decency to our fellow human beings - all this seems reasonable and desirable.

Although, I'm not so sure about that statement that 'Respect cannot be learned'? ASBOs, curfews and tougher prison sentences probably all have their place as we tackle crime in our communities but I question whether they are the answer in the longer term. I'd like to suggest that 'Respect' CAN be learned and that we need to get to grips with our need to teach it in our families, in our homes. Our urgent need is to educate the adults of the future, only then will we turn the tide. At a recent Sunday morning service we reflected on the words printed below as we considered how the smallest and simplest of positive actions can often have a massive impact. Have a read and ask how they might encourage you and those around you to learn more about respect, truly valuing your fellow human beings:

If I knew it would be the last time that I'd see you fall asleep, I would tuck you in more tightly, and pray the Lord your soul to keep.

If I knew it would be the last time that I saw you walk out the door, I would give you a hug and kiss, and call you back for one more.

If I knew it would be the last time I'd hear your voice lifted up in praise, I would videotape each word, so I could play them back day after day.

- If I knew it would be the last time, I could spare an extra minute or two to stop and say 'I love you', instead of assuming you would KNOW I do.
- If I knew it would be the last time I would be there to share your day, well I'm sure you'll have so many more, so I can just let this one slip away.
- For surely there's always tomorrow to make up for an oversight, and we will always get a second chance to make everything right.
- There will always be another day to say our 'I love you', and certainly there's another chance to say our 'Anything I can do?'
- But just in case I might be wrong, and today is all I get, I'd like to say how much I love you and I hope we never forget.
- Tomorrow is not promised to anyone, young or old alike. And today may be the last chance you get to hold your loved one tight...
- So if you're waiting for tomorrow, why not do it today?
- For if tomorrow never comes, you'll surely regret the day, that you didn't take that extra time for a smile, a hug, or a kiss, and you were too busy to grant someone what turned out to be their one last wish.
- So hold your loved ones close today, whisper in their ear, tell them how much you love them and that you'll always hold them dear.

Take time to say 'I'm sorry', 'please forgive me', 'thank you' or 'it's OK'. And if tomorrow never comes, you'll have no regrets about today.
