Despite the gloomy forecast and morning showers, the sun shone on the WSA Summer Fete on the afternoon of 5 July, which this year took 'Spectacular Sports' as its theme. The afternoon started with a parade of children from the school, Tigger Toddlers playgroup and Honeypot Preschool to the Arena where the 'Spectacular Sports Flame' was lit and the fete opened by Anne Clews, Chair of the WSA.

Continuing the theme, there was a heptathlon competition for the children and Space Hopper racing – which may not have made it into the official Olympic Games yet, but it is surely only a matter of time. Other attractions included a crockery smash, face painting, bouncy castle and the traditional barbecue, bar and cream teas. Visitors were entertained by a gymnastics display and arena displays from young dancers from the Ladybird Borland School of Dance and the impressive Tang Soo Do group.

The afternoon raised in excess of £3100 which will go towards providing a trim trail for the school grounds. Thanks to extensive fundraising efforts, the WSA have continued to purchase equipment for the Learning Landscape Project at the school, including an Outdoor Classroom and a Storyteller's Corner, and have funded the coach travel for school trips this year.

# Jottings from you county councillor

My campaign for a bypass for Willingham has received some support from a neighbouring councillor – actually two! Steve Criswell who represents Earith has joined my calls for a wider scheme that bypasses Willingham and Earith – and particularly the bank along the river. I have also been supported by Phil Read who represents Sutton and who also thinks a Willingham bypass is essential. What we need now is the outcome of the study and then to identify how such a bypass is funded. The Transport Innovation Fund would have been one source of funding, since it was expected to bring in over £40m for transport projects annually, as well as the initial £500m of government funding, but that has gone back to the drawing board to look further at the merits of the scheme.

I had a meeting with representatives from the Highways Agency at the end of June to discuss their current plans for upgrading the A14. They still expect to hold an exhibition later this year when their plans will be made public. At present there are a lot of questions as to how the local access road will work – particularly between Girton and Swavesey - and how many lanes there will be. One thing I am certain of – it is an immensely complicated scheme, especially the junction design, and the costs are continuing to spiral. We have to maintain pressure on central government to ensure that the scheme is fully funded.

Finally, on another transport-related issue, I had a request to ask for the timings of the traffic lights at the Berrycroft junction to be changed, so that there were only two green phases as opposed to the current three. This would mean that both Over Road and Berrycroft would be green at the same time. Some people think this would be a good idea, others are not so sure – so if you have a view, please let me know.

Saturday morning surgeries We are currently trialling a Saturday morning surgery session for three months during July, August and September to gauge demand. We will be open from 8 30 am - 11 45 am each Saturday morning. Government policy dictates that these sessions should be **reserved for 'routine** book in advance doctor appointments' and will not be walk-in emergency sessions. We regret that it would not be viable at present for us to open the pharmacy and you will not be able to collect your repeat prescriptions on Saturdays. These surgeries are intended for people who work and cannot attend during the week. There are no laboratory facilities available to allow for blood tests on Saturdays. Emergencies will be covered by CAMDOC in the normal way over the weekend. We would welcome your views on whether you feel we should continue with this service after the trial period.

#### **Runner bean chutney**

2lb (900g) runner beans,	1½lb (675g) onions, peeled
sliced	and chopped
1½ pints vinegar	2lb (900g) demerara sugar
½ teasp. salt	1 teasp. turmeric
1 teasp. dry mustard	1½ tablesps. cornflour (if

	increase this amount)

Cook the beans in salted water till just soft Cook the onions in ½ pt vinegar till just soft Place the beans, onions and sugar in a pan together with the remaining vinegar and boil for 15 minutes. # Willingham Feast

Long-standing members of the Willingham village community will remember when the Village Feast was a major event in the village. In the days before the NHS, this was also 'Hospital Sunday' when money would be raised for Addenbrookes Hospital, so that local people could be treated there.

Some local villages still make a big feature of their Feast Weekends, but in Willingham over recent years it has become a Sunday event only, with an annual visit from a Salvation Army band which plays on the Green in the afternoon, and for a joint churches service in the parish church in the evening. The Willingham Feast is always on the weekend before the 11 October, so this year it will be on 4 and 5 October.

This year there are plans to revitalise the Feast as a weekend of events, with something for everyone in the

village. It will kick off on Saturday morning with a Farmers' Market and car boot sale. There will be events including a puppet show for children and families, plus a sketch show by WAMADS; and in the evening there will be a ceilidh and also an event for young people. On Sunday the Letchworth Salvation Army Band, who have joined us for previous Feast Sundays, will be at the Salvation Army Citadel in the morning, on the Green in the afternoon, and in the Parish Church in the evening.

In keeping with the 'Hospital Sunday' tradition, money will also be raised through the weekend's event to support local hospitals and medical facilities.

Put the date in your diary now, and look out for further information in the Parish Magazine and around the village nearer the time. If you want to book a Farmers' Market stall (£10 a stall) or car boot pitch (£6 per car), ring 01954 205157.

#### USE THE MOUSE, TO SAVE YOUR HOUSE

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service has launched a brand new interactive website.

As well as having a make-over, the new-look website contains far more information and is packed with latest news and incidents, fire safety advice for in the home and workplace, and information on job opportunities, the Service itself, its fire stations, equipment and vehicles and lots more!

Accessibility has been a key consideration behind the design, ensuring that more people in the community are able to use the site to access information.

Core information can be accessed in 11 different languages, pages can be adjusted to increase the text size and background colours at the click of a button, and a text-speaker has been added which reads aloud highlighted text.

Head of Media and Communication Hayley Buzzel said: 'There is also plenty to keep our younger users entertained. They can meet some of our firefighters in the interactive area. By clicking on different parts of a fire engine, fire station and firefighter, they can bring up short clips of firefighters explaining what the item or place is for.

There's also an animated leaflet, controlled by the user, with information about arson, hoax calls, road safety and the dangers of playing with fire.'

The website will enable users to go online to book an appointment for a free home fire safety check. This is where a member of the fire service visits a person's home, provides advice about keeping safe from fire and will put up smoke alarms in the property free of charge if they are needed.

Chief Fire Officer Graham Stagg said: 'The new website

provides us with many more opportunities to spread our messages about fire safety and provide information to the people of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough at the touch of a button. It will also give people a way of contacting us to tell us what they think of our service and to tell us their opinion on issues we seek feedback on at different times of the year such as our Service Improvement Plan and budget.

"The new website has a simple layout and is easy to use. We hope that users will enjoy logging on and that it helps keep them safer in their homes, at work or when out and about in the county."

The site also contains information about the Fire Authority - the governing body of the fire and rescue service – and includes Fire Authority and committee meeting dates, agendas, papers and minutes, as well as corporate plans and information on the Authority's budget and performance.

Councillor Roy Pegram, Chairman of the Fire Authority, said: 'We are working hard to ensure that we communicate as effectively as possible with everyone in our community and the new website provides new and exciting ways for us to do that.

More and more people have internet access at home and use it as a first step to finding the information they want. It was important that our website could be the first port of call for people wanting to find out more about their local fire service or seek advice about fire safety and prevention, and our new website delivers that.'
