Whilst village shows such as ours may be on the decline we hear, ours seems to go from strength to strength and long may it remain so. It is a long standing village tradition.

A special mention must be made of the children of the Willingham School who entered the begonia growing competition. The Club provided the small plants, pots and compost earlier in the year together with larger pots and more compost later in the year but it was down to the children to grow the begonias at home. What a splendid array of entries we had and what a splash of colour to the school hall on show day they provided. Jessica Clark was awarded a first in this class for her spendid begonia. Well done to all who took part and we hope that they and others will take part next year too.

We are always amazed by the quality of some of the craft exhibits such as woodwork, stitchcraft and paintings. It always gives us special pleasure too to see the proud looks on the faces of the young exhibitors when they make their way through the throng of people present to accept their trophies or simply when they see the rosettes on their exhibits. The award for the best entry by a junior was won this year by Lauren Rowney.

This year we awarded two new trophies in addition to the usual ones:

1. The Keith Hodkinson trophy was awarded for the Art category and was won by Richard Lingham

2. The Auctioneer's trophy - a discretionary award in the sole gift of the auctioneer at our show to be given to the exhibitor whose work most inspired the auctioneer whether or not the exhibit had been singled out for any other award. This award which was commended by the judge was won by John Blunt.

This year was no exception when it comes to major successes. David Smith won the Marriott's Newsagents shield for collecting the most points on show. He won total of six trophies or awards, a truly magnificent performance.

Lynn Curtis too had been busy over the summer months creating another exquisite craft entry. She won the Best in Show (Crafts) for her elegant and beautifully crafted umbrella.

Flu vaccinations These will be available from the second week in October. Please ring reception to book your appointment and remember to tell the receptionist that the appointment is for a flu vaccination. Due to the large number of people needing this protection we plan to hold some flu vaccine only sessions and ask that people wear short-sleeved clothing for easy access to arms! Many thanks. **Flu vaccination** is recommended and is free under the NHS to all people of 65 years and over, and to those of any age with a long term medical condition, for example diabetes, heart disease, kidney or liver disease, asthma or any breathing disorder. Carers (in receipt of Carers Allowance) are also eligible. Please enquire if unsure.

Private flu vaccinations Patients registered with this surgery wishing to have a flu vaccine privately (i.e. those not eligible under the NHS 'at risk' groups) can do so while stocks last. You will not be charged for the private prescription but you will have to pay for the vaccine. Please ask at reception or pharmacy for details.

Advice from the police - Autumn/Winter burglary advice

Normally when the clocks change and the darker nights arrive there is an upturn in dwelling burglaries. Thieves tend to use the darker nights to commit offences as they know the darkness will provide them with increased opportunities to offend.

- * Residents should consider outside lighting that is triggered by movement and always place a security chain on when answering the door.
- * Burglars do tend to knock doors to see if they get any answer before breaking in.
- * Remember to keep sheds and garages locked as burglars will use tools from these locations to force doors and windows.
- * Burglars can also be quite brazen and will try doors to properties at night time hoping to find the door unlocked so remember to lock downstairs windows and doors.
- * If you are going to be out consider leaving a light on or having lights on a timer.

Winter time also sees a rise in distraction burglary offences. Last autumn and winter time saw a change in the methods being used by these distraction burglars to gain entry into addresses. Usually these offenders claim to be from the Waterboard or claim that there is a water-related problem at the address. However increasingly on a national basis these burglars are now claiming to be Police Officers. Their plan is always to disconcert the home owner by claiming that there is an emergency. Always remember to ask for identification before letting anyone into your home. **NO ID NO ENTRY.**

Other common tricks used by distraction burglars are building or gardening work. One offender will keep the householder talking while a second searches the property or they use a youngster who claims their ball has gone in the rear garden. The youngster goes through the house leaving the door open for an accomplice to slip into the property. The younger offender keeps the householder talking while an accomplice searches the property.

REMEMBER CLOSE THE DOOR ON STRANGE CALLERS In the run up to Christmas be careful about leaving presents etc on show and post Christmas if throwing boxes and packaging away that presents have arrived in make sure the packaging is not left on show. A computer or Playstation box left by the bin is an advertisement to a burglar that new items are most likely in the property.

It has four unisex changing rooms, two official rooms, a clubroom, kitchen and disabled facilities. The building has been in constant use since it was completed and handed over by the builders.

Willingham Sports Council would like to thank all of the above groups for their support for this project and hope that it will inspire even more children and adults to participate in sport in Willingham.

Pastoral Letter

The Greater Splendour

One of the most beautiful times of the year must surely be autumn, when the leaves of the deciduous trees change colour before falling from the trees, displaying a rich variety of reds, golds and russets.

Some people want to travel to Canada or New England to enjoy the vibrant colours of 'the fall', spending two weeks on holiday to drink-in and absorb the splendour.

My travels have taken me to a much nearer venue to view the autumn leaves. That place is far more accessible to many more of us, and is pictured with Canada and New England on a website. It is called Westonbirt Arboretum in Gloucestershire. My day visit there was wonderful, the sights spectacular, leaving a lasting memory to treasure.

But as I was checking information about 'the fall', I came across articles about another 'fall' which was considerably further from my mind at that moment! That is 'the fall of man', Adam's sin and its result.

I can see some similarities: There is an attractiveness we are drawn to in the exquisite colours of the leaves before they fall from the trees; this phase is followed by bare trees, wet, messy and decomposing leaves on the ground, cold, wet, dark days, and the winter months which a number of people find somewhat challenging.

Adam recognised the attractiveness of beautiful fruit in the Garden of Eden. He and Eve ate the fruit from the forbidden tree, going against the command of God. That act of disobedience to God's law is 'the fall'. What follows is rather like degeneration and the gloom of winter; it is separation from our Maker.

I like to encourage myself as autumn 'fall' leads to winter, that in due time there will be spring. New life will emerge again, new leaves will grow and the thrill of the awaking of nature will uplift us again.

Yet also in 'the fall of mankind', disobedience and wrong doing is not the end of life, for in due time the Lord God sent His Son Jesus into the world to show us how to live life to the full. He became the sacrifice for all sin whereby we can be forgiven for all our wrong decisions and actions. New life follows 'the fall', hope springs eternal. That is the greater splendour!
