Willingham Feast Weekend 2008



A BIG THANK YOU to all who supported our Feast Weekend.

Feedback from the Parish Plan Questionnaire highlighted an interest in Farmers' Markets and other community events for the village and this year's Feast Weekend organised by the Parish Council and Churches Together tried to respond to this challenge.

In the past, Feast events included an Agricultural Show down West Fen Road and a football match against Cambridge Police as well as the more familiar concerts and services by the Salvation Army Band. The oldwillingham.com website includes a photo from 1920 of local children dressed for a feast parade.

Longstanding members of the Willingham village community will recall that the village Feast coincided with Hospital Sunday and money was also raised for Addenbrooke's Hospital so that local people could be treated there. This year the fundraising supported Willingham Community First Responders. A total of £156.25 was raised, thanks to £38.67 donated directly at the Farmers' Market and a further £117.68 raised from

Dog fouling problem

The County Council's grass cutting contractors have been completing the last cut of the season on the public rights of way.

If you walk along the path behind the Recreation Ground from Pound Lane you may feel the quality of the cut is less good than it should be. You will be right – and the reason is simple. The cutting was severely compromised by the amount of dog fouling left by thoughtless dog owners along the path.

Please note: Dog owners have a duty to clear up after their dogs. Those who fail to do so could attract a \pounds 50 fixed penalty imposed by the District Council. Anyone who wants to report suspected dog fouling should call 0845 0450063.

The Green & Boundaries Committee recommended to the full Parish Council that the alterations on the Village Green go ahead. This was voted on and agreed at the 1 October meeting. Work is due to start on 27 October.

Jottings from your County Councillor

The Willingham Parish Plan is due to be published at the beginning of November and I know that a huge amount of work has gone into its preparation. It is a detailed and very well researched document and I am grateful to those who have spent so much time putting it together. I was able spend some time with the committee chairman earlier in October to discuss the recommendations that are relevant for the County Council. Many relate to traffic and the need for better public transport. Over the coming months I will be working with officers in the County Council to see how we can address the concerns raised in the parish plan. I have already asked officers to investigate a weight restriction on the B1050 to try to limit the damage to the bank on Shelfords Road and plan to ask a question at the next full council meeting about the cost in maintaining this road – and how these costs compare to the rest of the B1050. I am also investigating what monies might be available to improve the cycle network, particularly between Willingham and Rampton; some work has been done, but more is needed.

Finally, as some of you may know, I am about to embark on an enforced period of intermittent sick leave for treatment for breast cancer. I will still be working and doing my best to represent you and your interests, but may not always be quite so readily available as previously. Hopefully I shall be back to full health in about six months.

Flu vaccination clinics Please ring reception to book and remember to tell the receptionist that the appointment is for a flu vaccination. We are holding some flu vaccine only sessions and ask that people wear short-sleeved clothing for easy access to arms!

Flu vaccination is recommended and is free under the NHS to all people of 65 years and over, and to those of any age with a long term medical condition, eg diabetes, heart disease, kidney or liver disease, asthma or any breathing disorder. Those in receipt of Carers Allowance are also eligible. Please enquire if unsure.

Private flu vaccinations Patients registered with this surgery wishing to have a flu vaccine privately (ie those not eligible under the NHS 'at risk' groups) can do so while stocks last. You will not be charged for the private prescription but you will have to pay for the vaccine. Please ask at reception or pharmacy for details.

Repeat prescriptions Patients ordering repeat prescriptions late November/early December will be offered 2 months' supply to cover Christmas and New Year. **To prevent wastage please only order those items you need from your repeat medication list.**

MMR Catch-up There has been a recent national increase in the number of measles cases. Two doses of MMR are required to ensure immunity against measles. The government is keen to ensure that all those under 17 years of age have had these two vaccinations. If you are unsure about your child's vaccination status please contact the surgery and the

records can be checked. If you know that your child has not had these vaccinations please contact the surgery to make an appointment.

Support NHS General Practice Our thanks to all of you who signed the petition which was presented to the Prime Minister in June 2008. However the threat to general practice has not gone away. If you are concerned please call into the surgery and pick up a leaflet from reception which will explain why it is important to make your individual views known and how to do this.

A Week Behind The News

I have always wanted to train as a journalist and so, I was delighted to be offered a work experience placement at the *Cambridge Evening News* in Milton. I was there for a week, and here is an account of what I did.

I arrived with mixed emotions on the first day. On the one hand I was excited about the prospect of working behind the scenes. On the other, I was also very apprehensive, as I didn't know what to expect of the people who worked there. I met my two mentors who worked in Newspaper Sales. We basically spent the whole morning opening envelopes with competition winners inside. Next, I went out with a sales executive to visit local stores to ensure correct deliveries were made.

Advertising was my next port of call. I worked in Retail in the morning selling commercial advertising space. Afterwards, I went into Motor Sales and helped place an advert to sell a car. Finally I found myself in Recruitment, selling Job Vacancy space.

Wednesday was the day I had been waiting for since I started work experience – the Editorial Newsdesk. I came in feeling the most excited I had since I started. I wasn't disappointed. I was invited to attend the Editor's Conference to decide what news would appear



on every page. I started off by writing some News In Brief (NIBs) for the paper. These are the little sideline pieces of news seen at the edge of the page. In the afternoon, I actually experienced life as a journalist and went out with a reporter to Arbury Park to see what was happening about the lack of building work there. This was the best day by far!

I wasn't particularly sure if I'd enjoy this next activity - Photography. I need not have worried. I kicked off the action by going out with a photographer to a local primary school. This was predominantly to take pictures of the Reception Class. What happened next completely astonished me. I was told that I was going to meet a Paralympics Bronze/Silver Medalist. We went along to Anglia Ruskin University to take pictures of the local hero as she came home for her celebratory party.

Accounts were my last stop. I predicted that this would be particularly boring. I was pleasantly surprised as it was actually a lot of fun. This was generally because of the staff who worked there, as they were extremely welcoming.

To summarise, I had a very pleasant week and it really opened my eyes to what life as a journalist could be like. I am absolutely sure that I now want to pursue this career.

Pastoral Letter

I was thinking about the month of November, 'Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness' (John Keats), shorter days, cosy evenings by the fire, Bonfire Night, when we ooh! and aah! as we enjoy the colours and sparkle of the fireworks. Bonfires burning across the country, as we recall that attempted treason centuries ago, that could have destroyed the Houses of Parliament, and all those members present.

Remembrance Sunday; as we remember those who gave their lives for our freedom in two World Wars. Not just those, but also the many sacrifices of fathers, sons, husbands, wives, mothers, daughters in the many conflicts since 1945, and indeed at this moment in Iraq and Afghanistan. So for many, Remembrance Sunday is particularly poignant. We are not only remembering the past, but the present. Let us not forget those who have given their lives for others. Jesus once said "Greater love has no-one than this that he lay down his life down for his friends" St. John 15 v 13. When Jesus died on the cross, he sacrificed his life for all of us, that we might be forgiven.

Also, November brings the beginning of Advent, with Nativity rehearsals at school and church, as we start to prepare for Christmas, although many shops would have us thinking about Christmas as early as the beginning of September. In the 5th Century, Advent began on 11 November (St Martin's Day) and took the form of a six week fast leading to Christmas, but during the 6th century, Advent was reduced to its current length of 4 Sundays leading up to Christmas, and later the fasting was dropped. During the season of Advent, Christians across the world prepare for the celebration of the arrival of the Lord into the world through the birth of his Son Jesus Christ. Advent is a time to celebrate light in the midst of darkness. It is also a time to look forward to when Jesus will come a second time.

The Great Flood 1947 - when it all went wrong

A talk will be given on Saturday 29 November at 7 30 pm in Rampton Village Hall by local historian Mike Petty. Entrance costs \pounds_3 50 and includes light refreshments

The 1947 flood is the flood by which modern floods are measured. In March 1947, exceptionally heavy snowfall lying up to 1.5 metres deep across much of England and Wales was rapidly melted by a sudden thaw. This was followed by very high winds and some of the heaviest rain ever recorded. Most of the rivers in the south, Midlands, East Anglia and North Yorkshire broke their banks. Weeks of frost had left the ground frozen hard, meaning rain and meltwater could not soak into it. By the evening of 11 March 1947, vast areas of southern England were under water. An area of almost 300,000 hectares was damaged, at a cost estimated at £12m, equal to around £300m today. Valleys turned into lakes in 40 counties and East Anglia's fens were a sandbagged inland sea. More than 100,000 properties were damaged.
