### Parish Plan: the end of the beginning!

Aptly for Remembrance Day, Churchill's well-known words from 1942 set the tone of the public meeting on 11 November at which the Parish Plan was presented to the residents of Willingham in a packed school hall. The evening was a celebration of the completion of the Plan, representing the views of over 60% of the village, but also a first step towards its implementation. Following a short presentation by members of the Plan committee there was a brief discussion on the list of actions in the Plan, the main focus being on traffic problems, including the need for a bypass, weight restrictions on the B1050 to Earith and safer cycling. The lack of a youth club and the impact of Northstowe were also raised. Parish and District Councillors were present to listen to the comments and answer questions, and so was Andy Campbell, the Managing Director of Stagecoach in

Cambridge. Also present were representatives from the primary school, medical practice, library, churches and many of the village clubs and organisations. Lively discussion continued informally, aided by wine provided by Willingham Co-op, and a superb cake, made by Julie Ferguson.

Earlier in the day a steady stream of people had visited a display at the Three Tuns and indicated their priorities for the action plan – see next month's *Willingham News* for more details. The public meeting marked the end of the task that the original Parish Plan committee had set itself, and the members stood down. A new committee will be set up to oversee the implementation of the actions, and several people put their names forward at the meeting. It has a very important job to do: all the work put into the production of the Plan will have been in vain if it just gathers dust on shelves.

The actions can be split into two categories: those that must be done by the relevant local authority where the main role of the committee is to press for action and monitor progress, and those that villagers can do themselves, such as putting on community events. Many volunteers agreed to help. The Plan was presented to the Parish Council on 5 November, to South Cambridgeshire District Council on 14 November and Cambridgeshire County Council on 21 November. They will all have a key role to play. The members of the original Plan committee, and the 100 or so volunteers who had contributed to the Plan through delivering questionnaires, inputting data and drafting chapters,

were thanked, and it was agreed that the final Plan was a document to be proud of. A summary version had been delivered to every household and the complete version, which, including annexes and a full data analysis, runs to about 200 pages, is available in Willingham Library. also It is available on a CD which can be purchased for £1 from Mike Tidball (m.tidball@ btinternet.com, 01954 260647) or the Post Office, or can be downloaded free from www.newwillingham.org. More volunteers are needed, so if you missed the meeting but would like to be involved with the implementation of the Plan, whether as a committee member or by helping with local events, you can volunteer via the website or contact Mike Tidball, details above.

are invited to make a donation of £2. which goes towards equipment. They have raised nearly £500 in the first year, and are planning to buy a music system for the Social Club. which will simplify the complex process of setting things up each month.

People attending

Steve is a professional musician, with wide international experience. He began his professional career as a vocalist, then learnt to play harmonica at what is now Anglia Ruskin University – taught by the great harmonica player, Larry Adler. He lectures, and teaches privately, as well as performing. He has toured the world with his own band.

Andy was a keen amateur keyboard player, running a computer business – until, on New Year's Eve 2000 he suffered strokes, and then, three years ago, lost his sight. He asked Steve to teach him to play the harmonica, and then formed his own jazz band. This meets on the first Sunday of the month, and, like the Jam Night, is raising money for equipment.

They collaborate in running the Jam Nights. Steve is the musical director, who meets and greets people as they come in, discusses their particular interests – and makes sure everyone has a chance to play. His aim is to make sure the evening is one of contrasts, for example with jazz alongside Irish folk music. Andy looks after the financial side, and acts as the 'doorman' for the events. Lindy, Andy's wife, serves as the company secretary, and John Sibley, the president of the Social Club, is a 'silent partner' in the group.

How do Steve and Andy sum up the first year of the Jam Nights? They have done well at providing opportunities for disabled people. They have encouraged at least a dozen performance debutants. They have brought together professional musicians, teachers and complete beginners.

Their long-term goal is to 'provide more of the same'. They are providing music for the Club and for village functions, and they hope to be able to direct performers to other possible outlets, such as churches and the school. Mick Venning, of the Orchard Cottage recording studio, will be offering a prize for a recording in January 2009.

They currently have a mailing list of 100, and have a website:

http://www.myspace.com/willinghamjamclub and are planning to create, through My Space, an online community of musicians. Steve, who has two young children, is thinking of starting a music club for under four-year-olds.

Meanwhile, he says: 'We'd like more musicians and more audience. And we need more volunteers to help. Oh, and we could do with a keyboard and a drum kit'.
