## **Mrs Nancy Collett**

On 28 June Mrs Nancy Collett will celebrate her 104th birthday. As she talks about her time in Willingham (she came in 1928) her sense of humour and her remarkable memory quickly become apparent.

She was one of the first people to move into Millfield, in 1931. She lived there until the early 1970s, when she was one of the first to move to Wilford Furlong, then still being built.

She came from Dullingham, where she was born, having met Canon Hair, then Rector, at Ely. She came to work for him at the Rectory, then at Willingham House. She still speaks warmly of his kindness.

Her husband died in 1953, but she has a son and six grandchildren still living.

It is fascinating to hear her talk abut Willingham as it was, but what comes across most strongly in a conversation with her is that she is someone with a very positive approach to life as it is now.

# Jottings from your County Councillor

Much of this year has been taken up with pursuing a bypass for Willingham. The County Council finally produced its study earlier this year, but it was disappointing to say the least. It merely concluded that further work needed to be done. One important result, however, was that it did also acknowledge that the Northstowe development would have a negative impact on what is already an overcrowded road. I believe that there is now a tacit acknowledgement by the County Council that a bypass for Willingham is certainly justified by the volume of traffic.

I have agreed that further modelling work on the impact of Northstowe is important, particularly as we try to work out how the bypass might be funded. This will be the real sticking point. Much as I would like, I don't think that Northstowe will be able to fund the entire bypass, but it may be possible to fund a significant part that way. However, there will still be a large gap and finding the remaining money will be a real problem. I would have argued that revenue from a potential congestion charging scheme should be used, but I very much doubt that this will now happen. Once the further work on the bypass has been done, I will meet with officers to try to resolve this sticking point. Whatever happens I still think the bypass will be many years off, but acknowledgement of its need by the County Council is a major step forward.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone who has sent cards and messages of support during my recent illness. I am now well on the road to recovery and look forward to playing a full part in representing my constituents, particularly in dealing with the challenges ahead.

**Travel Abroad** As the holiday season approaches if you are travelling abroad please remember to contact the surgery at least five weeks in advance. Some vaccinations require a course of injections over 4 weeks and others have to be specially ordered. Charges apply for some immunisations (rabies, cholera, meningitis ACWY, yellow fever, Japanese B encephalitis, tick borne encephalitis and hepatitis B). The pre-travel form can be collected from the surgery or emailed.

Travel health information can be found on websites such as www.nathnac.org and www.fitfortravel.nhs.uk. The Foreign and Commonwealth Office website has information about other aspects of travel such as safety, security, political instability and other factors.

**Hayfever** Common symptoms- are a runny and itchy nose, blocked nose, sneezing, itchy and watery red eyes, and an itchy throat. In some cases only nose symptoms occur, and in some cases only the eye symptoms occur. Treatment - Antihistamines such as cetirizine and loratidine can be bought without prescription and offer 24 hour protection, they are non-sedating. Nose sprays and eye drops are also available without prescription, please speak to a pharmacist for more information.

**Telephone numbers** If you change your phone number please let the surgery know, this is especially important if you have had blood tests or swabs taken.

# Photo Mystery from www.OldWillingham.com



Last month's mystery photo (shown here) was a tough one because the building no longer exists. However, several people gave the right answer.

The house with the large windows is on the current site of Berrycroft Stores. It was actually used as a storeroom for the business but burned down by accident during the second world war. Fire engines came from the Oakington Bomber station but could not save it. The current Berrycroft Stores was then constructed on the site using concrete because bricks were hard to obtain during the war.

Marion Harrington wrote: 'The boys standing outside, are my dad, Roland Jeeps (left) who had just left school at 14 and his cousin Eric Easy. This was 1932 and the shop had just been built. Millfield was built the same year. The older shop on the left was built in 1925. According to Milford Jeeps, the petrol being sold was 'Power' and cost 1s 2d. (6p a gallon) The car was a Humber and belonged to Sir Frederick Hyam, a landowner from Stretham.'

Gordon Spackman recalled the 27 years he worked in the shop. He has lived in the Berrycroft / Mill Rd. area since 1922 and made the window frames for the shop. He remembers one time in the 1960s when the fireworks on sale in the stores went off by accident with much noise - but fortunately the building did not catch fire.

#### . Pastoral Letter

We watched the Yesteryear Road Run, recently, with so many old vehicles processing through the village, all looked after by their owners to keep them in good working order.

What a life some of these vehicles have had. At some time in perhaps the distant past, they would have been purchased as brand new from the show room, all shiny, the pride and joy of their owners, but then what? Well, for many of the Agricultural vehicles there was a hard life ahead with years of faithful service to bring a profitable return on the initial investment. Then as the years went by, the once pride and joy became worn out and superseded by a new more powerful, more productive model with advanced features which rendered the old one too inefficient to keep up with the demands of the day. So what then? Retirement to lighter duties, or just put to one side in a shed or under an old tarpaulin collecting cobwebs and providing an undisturbed nesting site for a pair of sparrows or starlings.

Then, perhaps years later, in a moment of nostalgia the owner, or someone else with an eye for restoration and a desire to breathe new life into the old fellow, drags it out of the shed. The cobwebs are dusted away. The birds nest, long abandoned, is removed from the tool box and restoration begins with new parts to replace the worn and broken ones, and that all essential lick of paint, slowly brings the once abandoned work horse back to full working order, and something to be proud of.

But it is no good just painting and polishing the outside, so that it looks like new, without bringing the engine and other moving parts up to scratch, so that it works again.

As the Lord said to Samuel, when he went to choose a new king for Israel, 'Do not consider his appearance or his height. The Lord does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart.' (1 Samuel 16 v7). Unless we accept the lord in our hearts, we cannot live the lives he wants for us, and thus find fulfilment.

# Willingham drama – before WAMADS

In May we described how WAMADS had become Willingham Stagecraft and looked back on its birth and growth. Now Amy Robinson tells the story of drama in Willingham from the 1930s.

Drama societies are no new thing in Willingham. There was a very successful group run from the old school in Fen End and led by the Headmaster, Mr Hounsell, during the thirties. Mr Cecil Gleaves remembers being taken to see various one-act plays – for example, *The Ghost Train, Bishop's Candlesticks*, etc.

Mrs Jessie Smith (née Raven) did much drama work with the youth of the village at this time. She lived in the little cottage near the Co-op, which has recently been rebuilt and thatched. Her rooms were full of dressing-up costumes.

Mrs Rose Manning (Ray Manning's grandmother) also had a collection of costumes, some of which she gave to me. I still have them. She also gave me some programmes and a photograph from those times.

However, Mr Hounsell moved on, and I guess the drama group faded, until the fifties.

At that time evening classes were encouraged and a drama class was introduced, to join the very popular woodwork class in the old school. In charge was Donald Doggett, a qualified teacher, who unfortunately was drowned on holiday a few years later.

Then Swavesey Village College was finished (it opened in 1958), and offered the Willingham group the use of the college drama facilities. There was a free bus run for evening classes in those days, so the offer was accepted. It was there that I produced my first play. Swavesey Drama Group is still very active.

I spent some very happy years there, and appreciated the qualified directors etc, all provided by the college.

Back in Willingham, in 1976 I directed *Cinderella*, written by Mrs Win Goffin, with music by Martin Yates – as mentioned in May's *Willingham News*. Following its success, Win and Martin wrote another play, *The Golden Bell*, performed in the old Church Hall. WAMADS was formally set up at a meeting on 22 June 1976. Jim Potter wrote the constitution and a committee was formed, consisting of: Chairman – Amy Robinson; Secretary – Peter Hayman; Treasurer – Frank Burdett; Committee members – Anita Allen; Win Goffin; Tony Norton.

Long may the tradition of drama in Willingham continue.

Footnote: Martin Yates has built a musical career with a broad range of repertoire and genre. He has conducted widely across Europe.
