## Blue bins will be hitting the streets of South Cambridgeshire by 6 October

The new service will prove to be a more cost-effective way of collecting and recycling waste with an estimated saving of £400,000 by the third full year of operation. On delivery, residents are asked to be aware that the blue bin lids may not close properly owing to the way in which they were stacked for storage. The lid should settle after a week or so.

**THE BLUE BIN** will be for the dry recyclables that residents currently place in their green boxes, including plastic bottles, glass bottles and jars, and food and drinks cans, as well as new materials, including plastic pots, tubs, trays, film (eg carrier bags and clean food wrapping) and cartons (eg tetra packs). Residents will also now be asked to place cardboard in the blue bin for recycling, instead of in the green bin for composting. Items must be placed loose in the blue bin (not in plastic bin bags or other containers) and should be rinsed to remove any risk of food contamination. The blue bin will come with an inner caddy specially designed to keep paper - magazines, directories, envelopes and junk mail - separate from the rest of the recycling. This is because paper is more valuable when it is kept separate. Residents are asked to keep the caddy in the blue bin as it prevents people from heavy lifting and does not need to be removed.

The blue bin will be delivered with an information pack, which will be placed in the caddy, giving residents all the information they need about the new recycling service. In the pack, residents will find a battery bag for recycling domestic batteries. This will need to be put out for collection with the blue bin and will be replaced each time it is used. There will be clear instructions on the bag to demonstrate how to attach it to the bin. If residents fill their blue bin, excess dry recyclables will be collected when placed in a returnable container and left alongside the bin. Similarly, excess paper will be collected when kept separate and left in a returnable container alongside the blue bin.

**THE GREEN BIN** will continue to be used for garden and food waste. Residents are asked not to put cardboard and paper in the green bin any longer but to put both in the blue bin for recycling instead.

**THE BLACK BIN** will now only be for waste that cannot be recycled or composted. Excess black and green bin material cannot be collected. Residents are asked to take any such excess to the recycling centre at Milton.

Residents are reminded to ensure their bins are out by 7 00 am on their designated day of collection. Residents are welcome to keep their green boxes if they have a use for them. For those residents not wanting to keep them, there will be drop off points at Morrison at Cambourne, Tesco at Bar Hill, Fulbourn or Milton where they will be picked up and sent for recycling.

**Flu vaccinations** will be available from the beginning of October. Please ring reception to book your appointment and state that it is for a flu vaccination. We will be holding special clinics and ask that people wear short-sleeved clothing for easy access to arms! **Flu vaccination is recommended and is free under the NHS to all people of 65 years and over, and to those of any age with a long-term medical condition**, for example diabetes, heart disease, kidney or liver disease, asthma or any breathing disorder. Carers (in receipt of a Carer's Allowance) are also eligible. Please enquire if unsure.

**Mobile telephone numbers:** Please can we ask you to provide a mobile telephone number in case we need to contact you urgently or on occasions if we have to reschedule an appointment due to unforeseen circumstances. You can either fill out a form at reception or give us your up-to-date number by telephone. Many thanks.

**Text messaging:** We have introduced a system of reminding patients about their appointments by text message. This has proved successful for other NHS Organisations and Practices so we decided to run a trial to see if this would be of benefit to our patients. If you have provided us with your mobile number and have an appointment booked at the surgery, you will receive a text message marked NHS Mail the day before to remind you. If you no longer need the appointment, we ask you to let reception know. This will allow these unwanted bookings to be released for other patients to use. If you would prefer not to receive a reminder in this way, please let reception know. We would welcome your feedback on this new initiative so we can make a decision on whether to continue it long-term.

**Pharmacy Survey:** A big thank you to all patients who filled in our Pharmacy annual service questionnaire. We were delighted with all the positive feedback you gave us and we will endeavour to provide the same level of service this year. Your comments are always important to us and we are always available if you need to discuss any issues. If you would like to see a copy of our questionnaire results, please ask in the Pharmacy.

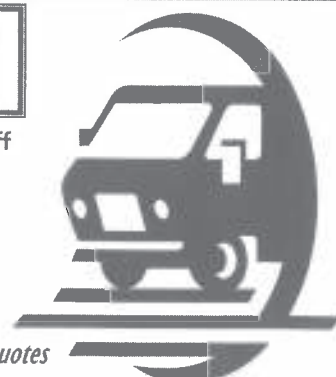

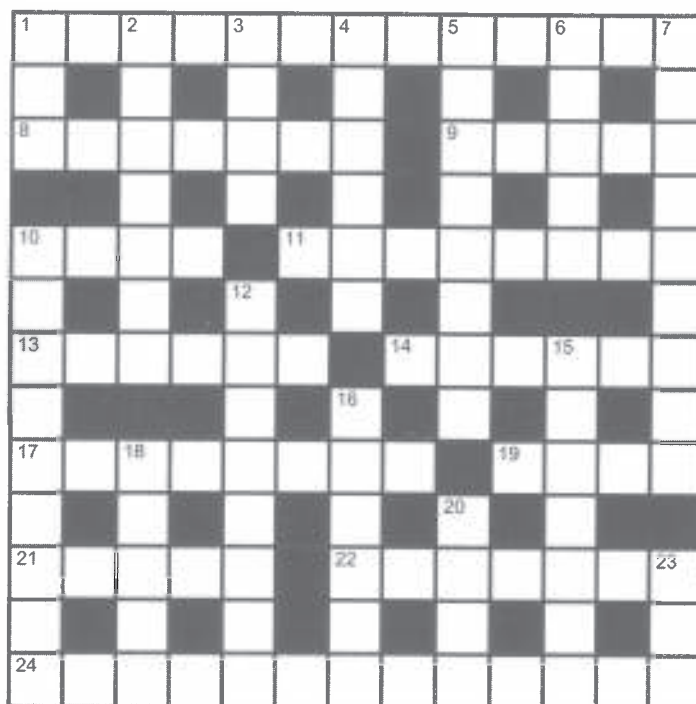

'Thank God it's Sunday!' I say it often enough, but then, that's the bit of the job that I am expected to fulfil, and I get paid for it. How many of us have ever looked forward to Mondays? The Boomtown Rats had great success with a song declaring loudly that they didn't like Mondays. For many that's the day when we go back to work, college or school after a weekend break. We do like Fridays though! I will confess that in the days when I did a 'proper job' I did look forward to weekends. That's when I had the chance to spend time with my own kids instead of other people's. Do you get the feeling that, in general, people don't like work? I have always enjoyed my work, well, nearly always, but I have still enjoyed time off.

Did you realise that a day off was actually God's idea? You discover that in the Ten Commandments: 'Six days shall you work but on the Sabbath (the seventh day)..... "take a break"'. (Perhaps even enjoy the luxury of a

(A bit of chocolate also helps but is not a substitute!)

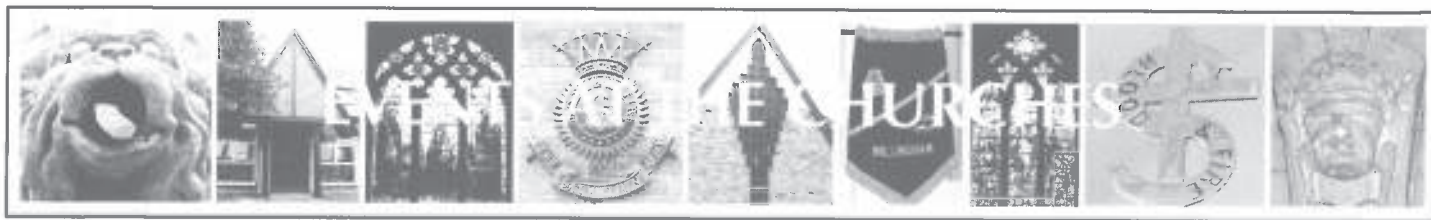

Having just left Hills Road, and talking to friends from many other colleges in the area, this level of theatre appears to be unrivalled in the local area.

Food of the month. Fennel – an excellent source of vitamins A and C, potassium and fibre. It is also believed to help purify the body of free radicals.

Of course exercise is for both adults and children so take every opportunity to get out and have fun. Walking or cycling to school, work or nursery starts the day off well, and all before 9 am! A trip to the park can be a great workout, not just for the kids but adults can play catch too! Each time you go to get into the car – stop and think – 'Could I walk there?' Then, still on Friday (7 30 pm), the **Social Club Music Night** features **Godfrey Williams & Friends**, **Mojo Triangle** ([www.myspace.com/mojotriangle](http://www.myspace.com/mojotriangle)), Steve Lockwood's and Chris Newman's **Hot Lips & Chilli Fingers** ([www.myspace.com/hotlipsschillifingers](http://www.myspace.com/hotlipsschillifingers)) and **The John Verity Band** ([www.johnverity.com](http://www.johnverity.com)). You think you've never heard John Verity? Think again, my friend!

The music continues on Saturday (7 30 pm) with the **Ceilidh** at the Ploughman Hall with live band **Pigeon English**, back by popular demand after their resounding(!) success last year.

If there is a theme to this year's event, it has to be Youth. The newly-formed **Willingham Youth Trust** is our chosen charity for 2010, and we will be collecting at all events, as well as donating all sponsorship monies and, hopefully, some of our surplus from the paying events as well. We are involving the school much more this year. The **Prologue Week** (4 – 8 October) sees long-established residents – Janet Hart, Milford Jeeps and Andrew Cook – speaking to pupils of their lives and times in the village,

with special emphasis on childhood experiences. Then, on Thursday, 7 October, four ensembles from the school – the choir, the school band, the ukulele club and the recorder group – are giving a **Children's Church Concert**. Admission is free (6 30 pm), so let's fill the space!!

The school has also kindly allowed us to hold the **Feast Market** – combined with a **WSA Car Boot Sale** – at its premises, so we have shelter if it rains (we were lucky last year that it was only howling a gale on the Green!). This is the keynote event (9 am till 1 pm) in that it will hopefully be the one that most villagers find time to support! Not that you should need any persuading, for on offer will be farm produce, natural whole foods, Sri Lankan specialities, Cambridge beef, relishes, jams, handmade chocolate and biscuits, jewellery, eco-friendly cosmetics and detergents, fancy shoes, pottery, Christmas gifts, stained glass, children's toys and gifts, books and garden plants, plus all those fantastic bargains you get from a car boot sale. Saturday sees **Scalextric Grand Prix** and **Treasure Hunts** at/from the Ploughman Hall (with refreshments – and a bar!), and our talented photographers are putting on a **Photo Exhibition** of their work in the Library (also on view Sunday). Free admission and with a kids' corner featuring submissions from the schoolchildren.

So what else is there? If you fancy a trip to Ely on Sunday, we have various ways of getting you there, all of which require physical exertion on your part. Yet the reward is heavenly for, as **Willingham Pilgrims**, you too can be blessed at the **Shrine of St Ethelreda inside Ely Cathedral** (12 45 pm). This will be followed by cheesy chips and other refreshments at the Cutter Inn, with transport home for the marchers and runners. Riders will be required to do the round trip!

And then on the Green (or in the Church if the weather is inclement), also on Sunday, it'll be time to wind down and mellow out with the **Salvation Army Band** and the **Lighthouse Worship Gospel Singers**. This is followed by a Church service – **Songs of Praise** – on Sunday evening, and then, during the next two days, it's **all the Fun of Thurston's Fair**. So give of yourself to the Village – your presence is requested!!

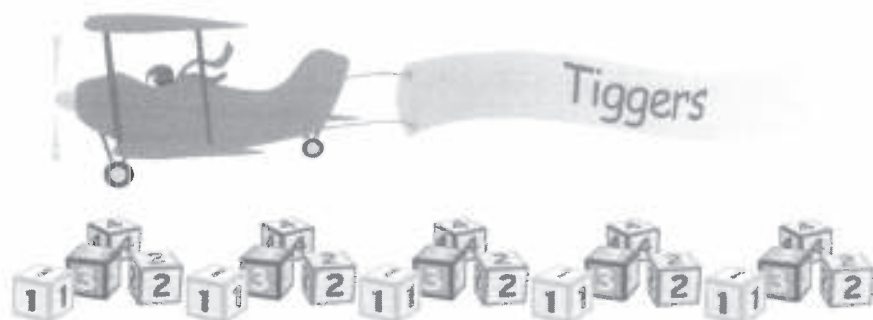
