You can use the information to help make sure you do not become a victim of similar crimes.

Evidence from around the county shows that a village-wide Neighbourhood Watch group helps to reduce crime. We now have over twenty street coordinators in Willingham but need double that number to cover the whole village. The job is not at all onerous for, once the scheme is set up in your street, all it entails is forwarding emails to your members about once a fortnight as well as being vigilant and reporting any suspicious behaviour to your local police - generally by phoning 101. Our police need intelligence from the general public so they can be in the right place when needed. If you are interested please contact Claire details above. If you don't want to be a street coordinator then join ECOPS. One scam reported recently in this area involves people posing as delivery drivers who need money for petrol. They will approach people in car parks and offer to exchange jewellery such as watches for cash, asking for amounts of £20 or much more. The jewellery is worthless.

### **Old Willingham**

This month we see the staff of Haynes Bros standing outside their shop - the shop that is now Co-operative Stores opposite the end of Church Street. This photo has been dated at 1927 by the grandson of the girl in the picture whose name was Olive Dodd (later Raven). In 2008 we heard that she was 97 and living near York but we don't know if she made her centenary. As was customary in those days there is a grand window display, but inside all the goods would have been behind counters and the shop assistants would get items from the shelves on request. Haynes had two shops in Willingham, this one and another further down the High Street roughly where the entrance to Bourneys Manor Close is now. That shop burned down in a huge fire that was reputedly so hot it caused paint to peel on the railing of the house on the other side of the street.

### Pastoral Letter

Are you ready for Christmas? Shopping all completed? Presents wrapped, cards posted? But Christmas is more than just the decorations, food and of course, a visit from Father Christmas himself! Are you excited about the coming event, or perhaps a little apprehensive? For some it's a happy, joyous occasion. For others a time of sadness, or perhaps loneliness. For Christians, Christmas is celebrated as being Jesus' birthday. Something to look forward to - a promise fulfilled. The promise that's found in Isaiah 9:6-7 says, 'for unto us a child is born, to us a son is given and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government there will be no end and over his kingdom, establishing it and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and for ever.'

So this Christmas, lets take a step back, look into the stable and remind ourselves of the Prince of Peace, see beyond the tinsel and the decorations, the presents and all the trimmings to look again at the baby in the manger – The son of God who grew to be a man and died for each one of us simply because God loved and loves us.

The photographs were loaned from the Cambridgeshire Collection, and Christopher Jakes, who looks after it, gave a fascinating talk on that theme. ### Willingham Originalz Youth Club

Have you ever noticed the lights on in the Baptist Hall on Wednesday and Thursday evenings?

If you have, you've discovered Willingham Originalz Youth Club which runs throughout the school term from 6 30 until 8 pm. Each session costs just 50p, and we offer activities like pool, table tennis, table football, arts and crafts, Xbox 360 with Kinect, music centre and laptops with internet access and more. There are also voluntary structured activities – such as a recent one in October; we had a very successful session where the young people prepared, cooked and ate apple crumble to celebrate National Apple Week.

Previous activities have included:

- Visiting the Community Farm and seeing how it's run.
- Curry night. Cooked from fresh with the help of a skilled Indian cook.
- Internet safety. Our lead youth worker is trained in internet safety.
- Celebrating National Farmhouse Breakfast Week by cooking breakfast and talking about healthy options.
- We always offer cooking at least 3 or 4 times a term, for example pizza or cup-cakes.

We have a well stocked tuck shop where club members can buy snacks and drinks and we even do hot snacks like noodles, nachos with cheese and hot chocolate. Very importantly this service is manned by the club's young people, giving them an important role in responsibility towards the club and the activities in it.

Our doors are always open with the first session being free for newcomers. If you would like to pop in and take a look at what we offer then you're most welcome.
