# Pastoral Letter

Spring is on its way! The buds are poking up, and by the time you read this may well be appearing. The daffodils are in the shops. Can you believe it's nearly Easter already! How do you feel as we enter Lent and the lead up to Easter? Maybe you feel as if you are ready for a holiday? Maybe feeling distracted, under pressure or even disillusioned?

I'm not sure there was much excitement that first Easter morning, as the women set off to go to the tomb. Sadness maybe, but not excitement. I wonder if they chatted as they walked or were they silent? As they approach the tomb, there was an earthquake, the guards fall into a dead faint and an angel speaks. I'm not so sure they would have been excited at this point - terrified maybe! But then, maybe a glimmer of hope rises within them, the angel speaks – he is not dead, he is risen! Go and tell the others. They are invited to look inside the tomb. They need to see that it is empty. They rush off but as they leave, Jesus speaks. 'Greetings'. Then they know, and then the excitement comes. They kneel and worship him, bowing in adoration at his feet. Then go, to tell the disciples, to share the joy. In the early part of this century, a group of lawyers met in England to discuss the biblical accounts of Jesus' resurrection. They wanted to see if sufficient information was available to make a case that would

hold up in an English court of law. When their study was completed, they published the results of their investigation. They concluded that Christ's resurrection was one of the most wellestablished facts of history. In his little book, Countdown, G B Hardy has given us some thought-provoking questions about the resurrection. 'There are but two essential requirements: 1 Has anyone cheated death and proved it? 2 Is it available to me? Here is the complete record: Confucius' tomb-occupied. Buddha's tomb-occupied. Mohammed's tomb-occupied. Jesus' tombempty'. It's not until we see and accept the empty tomb that we can understand that he is not dead. He is alive. He has risen!!! That's the news that should fill us with hope, refresh us and inspire us as we celebrate Easter! This year, come and join us on the Green at 12 pm on Easter Sunday as we place flowers on the cross. Come and join in the celebrations - the hope and joy! We'd love to see you.

### WAG NEWS

The last few months has seen a new found growth in the members of WAG. The members of WAG still operate within smaller focus groups, each set up to deal with a given aspect of work within the village. These include an Environmental Group, a Leisure and Recreation Group and a Social Group but a whole host of activities and projects shelter under the WAG umbrella.

In recent months the Environmental Group has been a hive of activity with plans being progressed for delivering the Big Tree Plant project. This has involved a great deal of work but has seen the successful application for funding to plant over 1100 trees and shrubs around the village. WAG are very grateful to the Parish Council for their on-going support in seeing this plan come to fruition.

The Big Tree Plant project includes the redevelopment of what is currently known as the Old Recreation Ground into a community orchard. This project is something which we would like the whole village to get behind. We will need support from volunteers not only with planting at various stages throughout the project but also with the management of it. If you have some time to offer and feel you can become part of the Management Group, please let us know.

Still with the Environmental Group, half a ton of daffodil bulbs have been planted around the village - huge thanks to those who gave up their time for this task - we can all look forward to the rewards come the spring. A village wide litter pick also saw great results, giving the village an early spring clean.

A new project under the Environmental Group is to make it easier for residents to recycle electrical goods - items which cannot currently be recycled within our home collections. At the last Willingham Parish Council meeting, the go ahead was given to trial household collection of waste electrical goods organised by WISER Environment.

The Leisure and Recreation Group have also been working very hard on another big project to overhaul the play facilities behind the Ploughman Hall in the QEII Playing Field. A great deal of additional consultation has taken place with children and families within the village as to the ideal solution for this site and I'm sure we will very soon have greater detail to share with you on this project.

# JOTTINGS FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

Many of the street lights in Cambridgeshire are nearing the end of their life, meaning that that they need to be replaced over the next five years. In response to this, in July 2010 Cambridgeshire County Council let a 25 year contract to Balfour Beatty for the replacement and maintenance of every street light in the county. As part of this contract, Balfour Beatty is committed to a five year Capital Investment Programme, which will result in improved lighting across the County. In fact, Cambridgeshire will not only have high levels of lighting, it will achieve this through an innovative white light, which is low on energy consumption – good for the environment and lower on cost.

The contract is supported by central government through what are known as PFI credits. As part of this arrangement the County Council is required to make 10% savings. This will be achieved through the reduction of 10% of the street lighting across the county. As traffic routes are being completely redesigned (and the savings from redesign already factored into the contract) the columns for removal can only be taken from residential roads. This means that some residential roads may see several columns being removed and not replaced. The decisions on which columns are removed from a street are based on criteria that ensure the remaining columns provide adequate lighting for road users. Considerable time is given by the designers when identifying removals and we are always sensitive to the impact these decisions may have. The consultation process should identify any significant issues with a particular removal so that it can be addressed and an alternative found

Thank you Avril Williams prior to the commencement of the work. When selecting columns, where possible we try to keep the first in the road, the last in the road, columns near a junction, columns lighting school areas and avoid removing two columns in a row. Replacing the streetlights in Willingham commenced in February and the Parish Council have been keeping a close eye on what is planned for each road in the village.

Throughout the Capital Investment Programme the current yellow lanterns will be replaced with a new white light. This light is a brighter light, which spreads further, illuminating more of the highway. On traffic routes lights will dim by in two stages; 20% between 8 pm and midnight, and a further 20% until 6 am. In residential areas, lights will dim by 40% from 10 pm until 6 am. This dimming process will not be implemented immediately, only after a street has been fully completed.

# Nigel is cycling from the Eiffel Tower to the Cenotaph in aid of Help for Heroes

As you may recall, back in 2009 I cycled 350 miles from Portsmouth to Paris in aid of Help for Heroes. Thanks to everyone's support I managed to raise  $\pounds2,800$  and the Dell Computers team that I rode with raised  $\pounds10,000$  in total.

In 2010 I signed up for the 'Help for Heroes, A Bridge Too Far Bike Ride' and cycled 350 miles visiting WWI and WWI Battlefields and Cemeteries as well as visiting sites associated with the much earlier Battle of Waterloo. We travelled from Brussels through Antwerp, Eindhoven and Nijmegen before arriving at Arnhem on 18 September, in time to take part in the 66th Anniversary commemoration of the battle made famous in the film 'A Bridge Too Far'. As a result of that ride, I was able to raise a further  $\pounds 2,700$  for a charity that is incredibly close to my heart.

After a break of nearly three years, I have been fortunate enough to be offered a place on the Big Battlefield Bike Ride which leaves Paris on 28 May and finishes at the Cenotaph in London on Sunday 2 June.

There will 200 cyclists taking part in the ride from Paris and we will be joined by hundreds more at Blackheath as we cycle into London on the final day. I will be cycling with wounded servicemen and women from the UK, Canada and the USA. A team from Battle Back, the Military Adaptive Adventure Training and Sports Programme developed at Headley Court will also be taking part.

Help for Heroes provides practical direct support to wounded, injured and sick Service personnel, veterans and their families. This is provided through grants to individuals and other Service charities, capital build projects and support for life at four Recovery Centres across the UK. Since October 2007, Help for Heroes has raised over £100,000,000 for projects such as the Rehabilitation Complex at Headley Court and Personnel Recovery Centres at Catterick, Colchester, Tidworth and Plymouth as well as supporting individuals and working with other Service charities.

While the UK Services role in Afghanistan may be drawing to a close in 2014, the support for our wounded, injured and sick Service personnel, veterans and their families must be a lifetime commitment and therefore

fundraising to support the work of Help for Heroes is as important now as it was when the charity first started.

As many of you know, I work as a Computer Consultant for Dell Computers and in my spare time I've been involved with fundraising for Willingham

School Association, I've provided Safer Cycling instruction at the school and I can often be seen out and about as a member of the Willingham Wheels Cycling Club.

My fundraising target for BBR2013 is  $\pounds 2,500$  and given the tough economic times we all find ourselves in, this will be an especially challenging aspect to the project. I hope that as many people as possible will support me in reaching my goal and the following two events will provide opportunities to do so.

Fran and Barry are allowing me to hold a Race Night on Monday 4 March at the Duke of Wellington, with live music (see poster on p8 for details).

And Paul Knighton (Willingham Wheels) is organising a Spring Bike Ride on Sunday 28 April via the American Cemetery at Madingley and on to the Cambridge City Cemetery where we will lay a Poppy Wreath in the Commonwealth War Graves section before returning home via the Oakington Garden Centre Café (approximately 20 miles). # **Old Willingham**

All the talk of floods earlier this year brought to mind the great flood of March 1947 when Willingham and the surrounding villages became islands as the Ouse River broke its banks. Here is a commentary of the events and a photo of Queenholme Farm surrounded by water.

Sunday 16 March. With the water in the Wash, and the Ouse rising rapidly, sand-bagging went on throughout Sunday as the water rose perilously near to the peak of the banks. The position became critical as hurricane winds swept the district, and forced workers to abandon their task.



Monday 17 March. Although the day broke quietly it became apparent that the weary workers' efforts were in vain. First light revealed a 12 foot breach in the bank of the Ouse at Over and thousands of acres were inundated. The water reached Earith and the low lying areas of the villages of Over, Willingham, Fen Drayton and Swavesey, and the surrounding fenland.

Tuesday 18 March. The rising waters swept remorselessly on and began to flow over the bank of The Old West River, resulting in the flooding of Haddenham Fen, in many places 12 foot deep, and eventually reached the low-lying outskirts of Haddenham and Sutton.

One week later the Army had temporarily staunched the flow through the gap at Over, reducing it to a trickle. With the fall in the Spring tides and the steady drop in river levels attention was turned to pumping the vast quantities of water from the various fens.
