# WAG Orchard update WAG TREE PROJECT Community Orchard and Woodland

This winter we have concentrated our efforts planting the Community Orchard and Woodland, the flagship component of the tree project. The woodland area planting has been completed with 780 mixed native woodland trees, including a few plums and damsons with a local origin. The orchard was marked out on an 8 x 8 metre grid and so far 89 mixed fruit and nut trees have been planted, with spaces for another 25 scheduled for next winter.

The planting would not have been possible without the help of a hardy band of volunteers, to whom we say a big thank you. Also we wish to thank the interest and generosity of those who have sponsored an orchard or woodland tree. This has been a great success and we will gratefully accept further donations as there are 'orphan' apples and pears remaining, in addition to those we will plant next winter. Sponsors have been thanked and given the location of their tree on the grid. After the work has been completed next winter information boards will be created listing sponsors and their dedications.

WAG also wish to thank the Parish Council for their continued support for the project.

Obviously establishment will take some years but the blossom this spring will be a welcome sight. There will be further tasks to carry out in the months ahead, and watering of the orchard trees in the summer, so we will welcome new volunteers who would like to get involved. Also we welcome new sponsors for the orchard trees.

# LOOKING BACK – WINTER WEATHER

February's editorial in Willingham News talked about the freak weather conditions during 2013 but previous years have also taken their toll on the village and its residents. Looking Back, an article in the Daily Herald of 15 August 1938 reported that a stretch of the fruitgrowing country of Cambridgeshire had been completely devastated. Growers and their workers faced with were an unrelieved prospect of ruin during the winter and an appeal was being made to the Government for help.



The writer highlighted Willingham and a typical plum orchard of 24 acres which would normally

produce about 120 tons of plums. A local grower, Mr T H Langham, had 40 acres of victoria plum trees and in an ordinary year he would expect to get about 250 tons of fruit. He had a bumper crop in 1936 of 500 tons only to find it fall in 1938 to just half a ton.

Old men who had lived in the village all their lives on the fruit farms could remember nothing like it and Mr Langham's plight was typical of that of all his neighbours as early frosts had caused havoc. He told the reporter that there had been 15 frosts in the spring from the time when the blossom first appeared to the last one on 8 May, when it had frozen overnight and finished everything. In 1937 Mr Langham had paid £105 in wages a week but for 1938 his pay roll was just £6.

Each morning and afternoon during his stay in Cambridgeshire, the writer of the article had asked for plum jam but not a single hotel or teashop had any yet there had been enough plums in the previous year to cover the House of Commons!

The West Cambridgeshire Growers' Association had taken up the matter and asked the Government for a loan to tide the growers over the winter. One grower said that unless assistance was forthcoming they would be unable to prepare for next season. Meanwhile it was reported that Italian plums were capturing the market.

The article concluded with another tale of woe. Not far from Willingham a hailstorm had wiped out hundreds of acres of barley, stripped stretches of sugar beet of its green shoots, washed young plants clean out of the ground, taken away hedges and spoiled great quantities of wheat.

# **Old Willingham**

This month we see a sergeant posing for a photograph, probably before heading for France. We don't know who he is but interestingly his lapel badges are the maple leaf of Canada and the one on his cap (see lower left) the badge seems to match that of the Canadian Forestry Battalion. Perhaps he was a friend of Frederick Gadsby who was born in Willingham, moved to Canada in 1903 aged 19 and then volunteered to fight in the Great War.



Perhaps Frederick and his friend were making a last visit before going to fight. Frederick was killed in action on 27 September 1918, just weeks before the end of the war. The picture is taken at the gate of Mon Abri a house that still stands at the bottom of Fen End.

#### **Rupert Brooke**

Rupert Brooke was a famous war poet who studied in Cambridge and went on to live in Granchester. At that time he wrote about his peaceful pre-war life and many remember these lines

'... oh! Yet Stands the Church clock at ten to three? And is there honey still for tea?'...

Sadly Rupert died at a young age in 1915 but left us with his poetry, which caught the optimism of the opening months of the war - contrasting strongly with poetry published later in the conflict by other writers. The following is one such memorable poem.

#### The Soldier

If I should die think only this of me:

That there's some corner of a foreign field

That is forever England. There shall be

- In that rich earth a richer dust concealed;
- A dust whom England bore, shaped, made aware.

Gave, once, her flowers to love, her ways to roam.

A body of England's, breathing English air, Washed by the rivers, blessed by suns of home.

And think, this heart, all evil shed away,

A pulse in the eternal mind, no less

Gives somewhere back the thoughts by England given;

Her sights and sounds; dreams happy as her day;

And laughter, learnt of friends; and gentleness, In hearts of peace, under and English heaven.

**NHS 111 Service** is now fully operational in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. There will be a public campaign to make patients aware of how the new medical telephone service should help make it easier for residents to access local health services, advice and information. 111 is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year and calls from landlines and mobile phones are free. You should use the NHS 111 service if you urgently need medical help or advice outside GP surgery hours. For immediate life-threatening emergencies, people should continue to call 999.

How does 111 work? Calls will be answered by fully trained call advisers who are supported by experienced nurses and paramedics. They will ask questions to assess the symptoms and give you the healthcare advice you need or direct you to the most appropriate and available local service. Where possible the NHS 111 team will book you an appointment or transfer you directly to the people you need to speak to. If NHS 111 advisers think you need an ambulance they will arrange for one to be sent. Calls to 111 are recorded. All calls and the records created are maintained securely and will only be shared with others directly involved with your care.

**Practice Leaflets** Our practice leaflets have been updated to reflect changes in the NHS and out of hours contact details. Please call in to reception to pick up a new leaflet for your home notice board.

#### Northstowe

Phase One of the construction of Northstowe, the first fifteen hundred houses, is due to commence shortly. Given the recent poor weather, concerns have been raised by quite a few parishioners as to whether or not the development will increase flood risks. At a well attended drop in meeting at the Ploughman Hall in March, the developer, Gallagher, explained their plans for surface water management to address these issues and claimed that their designs would have sufficient capacity to meet more than a 1 in 100 year event including climate change effects. Unfortunately, the meeting was not attended by Anglian Water who will have long term management responsibility for water supply and drainage. The Parish Council will be tabling some questions directly to them on existing and future plans for discharges from Willingham and Longstanton.

#### New Bus Shelter

The Parish Council has been considering for some time the provision of additional bus shelters and has managed to obtain a grant of  $\pounds1,000$  from the CCC Better Bus Area Fund. This will be added to  $\pounds1,000$  of Parish Council funds to obtain a new bus shelter situated on the north side of Wilford Furlong. It will be a 3 bay shelter with polycarbonate glazing. The Council will monitor the use and costs of maintenance and see if more shelters can be justified. Requests have already been made for shelters in Church Street and Station Road.

#### Elections

If there are sufficient candidates the Parish Council elections will take place on 22 May. If there are insufficient candidates then those who apply for the fifteen places will be appointed automatically. Notices regarding nominations should have been issued by now or if not they will be very soon. The closing date for applications is Tuesday 22 April by 4 pm. Do not be shy in coming forward. The commitment is not great but the contribution you can make can be. The existing council would like to see a broader cross section of the community represented, particularly from younger parishioners and women. There is not a single female councillor at present. Elections cost us all as tax payers but, very importantly, give the electorate in Willingham their democratic right to choose who they want to represent them.

#### **Police Update**

Following a relatively quiet period there have been a number of problems recently including public order offences, burglaries, criminal damage and fly grazing of horses. Please do everything you can to keep yourself safe by locking windows and doors and reporting any suspicious incidents to the police on 101 or 0800 555 111. # Pastoral Letter

#### To love one another

As a secondary school student, short exercise breaks were introduced and used by many teachers in order to improve the students' attentiveness. I remember an event that happened during a Russian language lesson. The teacher asked our head girl to lead these physical exercises. She stood in front of us and said in Polish: 'Proszę zrobić pięć przysiadów' (Please do five sit-ups). The teacher stopped her immediately telling her to say it in Russian and after some hesitation the head girl responded in Russian 'Делай, как я' (Do what I am doing) and she started doing sit-ups.

We know that often it is much easier to show how to do something rather than to express it in words. Most manuals, from cookery books to car maintenance instructions are filled with photographs and occasionally have a DVD version.

When Jesus said '…love one another, just as I have loved you', he knew what he was saying. Throughout his life he demonstrated the constancy and strength of his love, giving himself to others: healing, teaching, and helping sinners. He never turned away anyone who came to him. The greatest proof of Jesus' love for us is his death on the Cross. 'Greater love has no man than this that a man lay down his life for his friends' (John 15:13). During the final weeks of Lent, Holy Week and Easter this truth is more obvious than at any other time.

Our love has to be modelled on and rooted in the great love of our Saviour. Jesus said, 'By this love you have for one another, everyone will know that you are my disciples.' The genuineness and importance of these words quickly became evident. Early Christian communities caused observers to say, 'Look how they love one another,' and their example attracted many people to God. Their mutual love became a sign of their faith.

If we want to draw the world to God, our mutual love must be strong and produce good fruits. Jesus did not say that his disciples would be recognised by the love of enemies but by their mutual love. The love of enemies is an important part of our faith, even the subject of admiration, but not the thing which is able to draw people to God. Jesus being aware of this pointed to mutual love among Christians as a key element that could draw others to God. Christian communities should be places where everyone finds the atmosphere of mutual love. The mutual love is a source of energy for all kinds of apostolic works and it is a sign of our faith built on the foundation of Jesus' Resurrection.

May the celebration of Easter 2014 strengthen our mutual love so that we become an even more powerful sign of God's love.
