



Electrical items will be collected in the morning by WISER vehicles. We will collect any electrical item (including non-working) from hairdryers, videos, microwaves, to televisions and fridge/freezers — basically, anything with a plug on. WISER Recycling will collect from right outside your house! All items will be taken to our fully licensed treatment facility in St Ives for Reuse, Refurbishment or Recycling.

The Parish Council will receive a revenue for the WEEE Waste collected, to be spent on Community Projects.

Most Parish Councillors were automatically re-elected. Appointment of officers took place at the June meeting and details are included in the list below. Not a lot of change but a big welcome to Steve Mellows as Lead Councillor for the Cemetery and to Joanne Vincent-Pilsworth who has rejoined the Council after previous service on it some years ago. Her experience will be of great value. There is still one vacancy for which you can be co-opted. It is not an onerous job and you can make a valuable contribution to your local community. It would be good to have more female and younger representation.

Gardening Tips For July

- 1. Spray roses with insecticide.
- 2. Feed shrubs, roses and other plants with liquid feed.
- 3. Newly-sown or repaired lawns should be kept watered.
- 4. If you have not yet sown your runner beans, peas and other outdoor veg, it is not too late.
- 5. Sow radishes and rocket and then again in 4 weeks for further supplies.
- 6. Plant lettuces and keep back seeds for repeat sowings throughout the summer.

- 8. Dead-head annual flowers to ensure a succession of blooms.

This photo could be mother and her two sons outside of one the (then) three big in barns Willingham. The mother is in her VAD nurse's uniform, probably working in the old church hall hospital. The boy is in his full



boy-scout regalia which, considering the movement only started in 1907, makes him an early member. The cap badge of the soldier suggests he is from the Suffolk Yeomanry – as were several village men. We don't know who they are but it's possibly the Ellwood family and the soldier is James Ellwood aged 24. If so the story is a sad one as the following was listed in the news for August 1917: 'The parents of James Ellwood...have now received intimation that their son was killed in action on April 23rd last. Pte Ellwood joined the Suffolk Yeomanry on February 29th 1916 and after leave in December last, went out to France.'



Pastoral Letter

The Commonwealth Games will take place in Glasgow from the 23 July until the 3 August and athletes from around the globe will compete to win medals, break records and do their personal best. To compete in their particular sport all athletes must go into strict training spending many hours, even years, in preparation for the main event. They have to be dedicated, focussed and self-disciplined if they are to be successful, always keeping their eye firmly fixed on the prize.

The ancient Olympic Games held in Olympia in Greece took place between 776 BC and 393 AD and included combat and chariot racing as well as foot races. The apostle Paul would have been aware of the discipline and training required to compete in the ancient games of his time and alludes to them in his letters. For example, in his first letter to the church in Corinth where the Isthmian games were held he writes, 'Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last; but we do it to get a crown that will last forever' (I Corinthians 9:25 NIV).

A perishable wreath was the prize for the ancient games competitors and Olympians. In contrast the participant in the Christian life can look forward to a crown of life that will last forever! In Paul's letter to the church in Philippi, he urges the Christian to 'press on towards the goal.' This is what he says, 'But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead, I press on towards the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenwards in Christ Jesus' (Philippians 3:13-14 NIV).

If we are to live the Christian life and grow in our faith then we too must be dedicated and focussed as we try to keep our eyes firmly fixed on the prize that lies ahead. This life requires strict spiritual training too and we have the apparatus to help us accomplish this such as Bible study, prayer and Christian fellowship at our local churches who are always ready to warmly welcome you.

If you enjoy watching the games this summer and marvel at the dedication and skill of the athletes taking part why not think about your own life journey and the ultimate goal you are aiming for. We may never win a medal competing in Commonwealth or Olympic games but there is a much greater prize on offer to us all.

LOOKING BACK Trouble at *The Duke*

In recent years the village pub has become an endangered species. Despite campaigners raising objections and petitions, many have closed, been bulldozed and houses constructed on the site. However. Looking Back to 1974, the *Cambridge News* of 9 August reported that a petition had been organised by the regulars of the *The Duke of Wellington*, not against closure but against plans to make internal changes to the pub.

The article said that Greene King, the brewers, planned to knock down a dividing wall to make a single bar-room. The regulars organised a 200-signature protest and the licensee, Mr Frank Thornhill threatened to resign because of the brewer's proposals. He believed that the single room would end up either as a saloon or as a public bar and that would exclude customers favouring the alternative option.

For him it was not a question of class but how a customer



presented himself. Those with tarmac their boots gravitated to the public bar while different types used saloon. His antipathy to a single room had apparently won support from his customers including the pub's darts team, led by captain, Mr David Cattell. He said the change would stop people coming and spoil the atmosphere of a friendly pub.

Mr Nigel Watson of 7 Green Street was quoted as saying

that the alterations had been instigated by the licensing authorities demanding for some time that internal toilets be provided. He had proposed an alternative plan but it had been turned down because of expense and some by-law.

The 200 signatures on the petition had been collected in only two weeks with sixty signing on the first night. Despite this the regulars were given a frosty reception from Greene King who refused to meet them. Greene King's managing director, Mr John Banham, said he was surprised at the fuss being made, saying, 'I didn't know 200 people used the pub'.

When asked about his refusal to meet with the regulars, he expressed concern that this would create a precedent and every time Greene King wanted to alter one of its pubs, they would have to meet the customers to debate the rights and wrongs of the situation.

It can be a very painful and distressing condition, so don't forget to book your appointment with the nurse to get your protection.

Summer sun We are all hoping for good weather this year but if you are out and about in the summer sun do remember to use adequate sunscreen to prevent skin cancer. Ask our pharmacy staff for advice on the best products to use. Take particular care with children and make sure they wear a sun hat and drink plenty when out in the hot sun.

Heatwave Advice from Public Health Heatwaves can be dangerous, especially for the very young or very old or those with chronic disease. Advice on how to reduce the risk either for yourself or somebody you know can be obtained from NHS 111 or from your local chemist or visit the NHS Choices website www.nhs.uk/summerhealth The main points are:

Stay out of the sun. Keep your home as cool as possible – shading windows and shutting them during the day may help. Open them when it is cooler at night. Keep drinking fluids. If there's anybody you know, for example an older person living on their own, who might be at special risk, make sure they know what to do.
