Gardening Tips for August and September

- Don't forget to deadhead dahlias and other late summer flowers to keep them flowering.
- Water and feed pot plants regularly.
- There is still time to sow a late lettuce crop.
- Apply an autumn feed to lawns.
- Save runner beans which have grown too old to dry out in paper bags for seed next season.
- Cuttings should be taken of tender or favourite plants to preserve your stocks.
- Cut back (prune) roses which have finished flowering so that they are ready to withstand the first frosts, to promote stronger growth next season, and to shape them.

Accolade for Willingham Free Press

Back in 2006 a group of like-minded individuals decided to make use of the plethora of available apples within the village. Rather than leave them to the thrushes they decided to harvest them and send them for pressing. That initial harvest equated to some 225 bottles of juice once pressed, but by 2013, with additional contributions, that had grown to in excess of 900 bottles of juice from the gardens and orchards within the Willingham boundary.



Whilst the majority of the resultant product is drunk as pure apple juice, some drinkers have chosen to take it a stage further and produce cider from the juice for their personal consumption and enjoyment.

Following favourable comments, both with regard to the source apple juice and the resultant ciders, one member of Willingham Free Press, Graham Mumby, decided to test the waters a little further.....

The month of May saw the prestigious Cambridge Beer Festival. The East Anglian CAMRA cider group holds two competitions each year for cider production, the one for bottled cider being judged at the aforementioned Festival.

So diving in at the deep end, Graham duly submitted two examples of his cider for consideration in the categories of 'Vintage' and '2012 Harvest' Cider.

We were very pleased for Graham when it was announced that, out of around 26 entries, he had won first prize for the 'Vintage' and third prize for the '2012'.

So well done, Graham, your efforts have not been in vain, and the plaudits completely justified.

A presentation ceremony was held at The Bank where Graham received his awards from Chris Rouse of the CAMRA Cider Group.

Pastoral Letter

Language of Love

In the Book of Genesis (II.I-9) there is a story of the Tower of Babel. People overwhelmed by selfimportance, decided to build the tower that would reach heaven, the dwelling place of God. They said: 'Come, let us build ourselves a city, and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves; otherwise we shall be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth.' They began a great work but they never finished it. The Bible says that they failed to understand each other. God confused their language, so they were not able to understand one another's speech.

This story should not be taken literally. The tower of Babel is the image of spiritual blindness, which causes us to do something exceptional that will make us famous and our name known. In ancient times many buildings were built for that simple reason. In our time, most buildings are built for practical purposes, but the desire to be better than others has not been removed. Also in our private life there is a danger of building our own tower of Babel. In general it can be anything that marks out our importance and superiority. In all these situations there is a serious danger of breaking relationships and losing contact with other people.

Those who have plenty to eat are not able to understand the one who is starving. Both can speak perfect English but they do not understand each other. One who has a great house or estate will never understand the one who is homeless. They talk the same language but they do not understand each other. A husband who fully dedicates himself to his job and has no time for his family is not able to understand his wife and children. All these situations can be defined as 'confused language.' The building of the tower of Babel has always this same negative effect and often leads to disaster in a human life.

What is the remedy for this kind of spiritual blindness? One day Mother Theresa started to work with those dying on the streets of Calcutta. Her gesture was understood by Muslims, Buddhists, Catholics, Protestants and many others, even those who do not believe in God. She had spoken to the world with the language of love. The language of love is the only language in the world that is understood by everyone.

LOOKING BACK World War 1

The outbreak of war in 1914 cast a giant shadow over life in rural villages. Looking back, the Cambridge Independent Press of 7 May 1915 reported that a recruitment campaign was underway in most villages. The recruiting party had duly arrived at Willingham on the Saturday afternoon from Over. They marched on the Green to the music of their band and then dispersed to their billets where they were all very comfortable. However the article reported that was the highest spot in their visit as despite all their efforts, not a single recruit was obtained.

This edition also announced that a military wedding had taken place at the Parish Church on

Tuesday 27 April. The bridegroom was Sergeant Frank Smith of the 11th Service Battalion, Suffolk Regiment, youngest son of Mr and Mrs Joseph Smith and the bride was Miss Florence Mabel Haddow, eldest daughter of Mr and Mrs Harry Haddow of the Rose and Crown, High Street. The paper reported that Private R Saddler, 1ST Suffolk Regiment was best man in the absence of the bride's brother who was a prisoner of war in Germany.

The CIP issue of the 20 August highlighted an improvement in the situation. Eleven married men and 55 single men of military age in Willingham were now serving. The paper said that it was interesting to note how well the

married men had responded to the call to arms.

Of course several villagers made the ultimate sacrifice in the service of their country. The CIP newspaper of 10 September 1915 reported that Mr W Hayden of New Town, Willingham had received a telegram informing him of the death of his eldest son Lance-Corporal Manoah of the Wellington Infantry, New Zealand Expeditionary Force. He died of wounds and had pneumonia on 15 August in the Dardanelles. The sorrowing parents also received the following message:

'The Governor is commanded by the King to assure you of the true sympathy of his Majesty and v = Kitchener'

the Queen in your sorrow - Kitchener'

Lance- Corporal Manoah Hayden had left Willingham two years previously for Australia. From there he had gone to New Zealand and joined the Expeditionary Force which was sent to the Dardanelles. The paper believed that he was the first Willingham man to have been killed in this European War.
