



Old Willingham

This is one of the older pictures in the Old Willingham collection – estimated to be about 1900. It shows the large family of Mr Ingle Few Thoday and his wife Emily. These are all well-known Willingham names. Mr Thoday established one of the largest and most successful nurseries on Long Lane (opposite the school) and the family lived in "The Vineyards" – the large house opposite the end of Silver Street. Sadly, two of the boys in the picture were destined to die in the First World War – Eric (child at front left) died in 1917 aged 27 and Redvers, the baby in the picture, died at the age of 18 – tragically he died from wounds a couple of weeks after the war had ended in November 1918.



LOOKING BACK – The White Hart

The White Hart on the High Street was a well-appointed country pub with a delightful restaurant off the bar. Looking Back it was the subject of a review in the *Cambridgeshire*, *Huntingdon and Peterborough Life* magazine in September 1977.


At that time it was run by Fergus Gibney and his wife Jill. The impressive 250 year old house was once a one-storey coaching inn. Its attractive interior contained an inglenook fireplace in which a roaring fire burned in the winter and a fine collection of brasses and early farming implements. Much of the furniture had been individually chosen and bought.



The critic, Emily Devereux, reported that the menu was nicely balanced and had a choice of eight starters. The main dishes chosen by her and her companion were Baked Mackerel and Chicken Viennoise. The mackerel was boned and stuffed with chicken, prawns and herbs and served with a creamy pernod sauce. The chicken was dipped in egg and herbs, deep fried and served on a bed of chopped mushrooms, tomatoes, onions and ham. The alternative choice of mains included Coquille St Jacques Cecelia, Scampi Provencal and Sliced Sirloin Simonsuun.

The chef was Mr Larry Squires who had joined the Gibneys earlier that year. He had trained in the kitchens of King's College and had devised the restaurant's speciality, Roast Duckling au Povre.

The critic recommended the White Hart either for a meal or for a drink in the well-furnished bar.

COMMUNITY ORCHARD AND WOODLAND UPDATE

Thanks to the efforts of the watering teams the orchard trees have come through the summer in good shape and we also have a near 100% survival rate of woodland trees.

About 25 locations on the orchard grid remain to be filled this winter to complete planting, about half of which have already been sponsored. If anyone still wishes to sponsor a tree in celebration or remembrance please make contact. This is the final winter of grant support from the Big Tree Plant as the fund closes in March 2015.

A few more trees will also be planted on the QEII field this winter, so for those who would prefer to sponsor a woodland tree that option remains.

As part of a year on year habitat enhancement of the Community Orchard and Woodland, eight 30msq plots have been prepared and seeded with a wild flower mix with a view to achieving natural spread over the coming years. This is kindly being supported by South Cambridgeshire District Council. It is also planned to plant bulbs.

Thanks to Edward Gilbert of Queenholme Farm, who has assisted with spraying and tractor work, and thanks to everyone else who has been involved in establishing the Community Orchard and Woodland.

GARDENING TIPS FOR NOVEMBER

Winter is nigh, leaves will have fallen onto lawns and borders – these need to be removed and composted or placed in your green bins. If left where they fall they will provide shelter for slugs and snails.

Cut back the stems of border plants such as achillea, crocosmia, peony and other long stemmed plants to 3-6 inches. You can make good use of all the cutback plant material by composting it, so long as it is not diseased. For the time being leave the heads of seed bearing stems for the birds however.

Plant polyanthus, primulas and primroses, they will flower early if the winter is mild and should last several years. These can be divided in subsequent years to provide new more vigorous plants.

Willingham Feast 2014

Each year the few members of Willingham Action Group who run the Feast wonder if it will be all worthwhile. Usually, by Sunday evening and after a hectic week, we realise it was.

There have been many positive comments about all the events from the 'old' such as the photography exhibition, curry quiz and Feast market to the 'new' like the Bush craft session. Then there is the 'very old' and traditional like the Salvation Army Band, the joint Church service and the funfair, symbols of celebration in Willingham for a long time.

The ceilidh, which was omitted last year, was a great success and fantastic fun as the band made some of the dances slightly harder to make sure chaos ensued. The walkers and cyclists went to Holywell instead of Ely and spent a wonderful lunchtime sitting in the sun in the Ferryboat beer garden.

We included the re-opening of the Porterhouse as an event because we think our three pubs play a vital role in village life. The opening became more of a game of how to fit two hundred people in 50 square metres! The new style pub is a great asset to the village and we all wish it success.

All of us should congratulate the twelve teams who took part in the treasure hunt in pouring rain and the guides who demonstrated it is possible to light a fire without matches and toast marshmallows in the same inclement weather.

One of my favourite events was the music at Willingham Jam Club (which takes place at the Social Club in the evening of the last Monday in the month) where for £2 we heard wonderful music from very talented local musicians. Give it a try sometime. My other personal highlight was listening to the children of the Primary School entertaining the seniors at their afternoon tea party.

On a more sombre note we were very blessed with the exhibition of WWI events relating to this area held in the library. It was very moving reading of the sacrifices made and seeing the well-known names of Willingham families listed amongst those lost. The exhibition will be kept and shown again in November.

Finally, we would like to thank all those who helped in some way and are too numerous to mention in detail. It would include the various businesses who supported us and are mentioned in the programme, our 'partners' such as the Jam Club and Willingham School Association and the WAG volunteers who gave of their time to improve the ethos of Willingham.

Safeguarding Vulnerable Adults

The second edition of the Safeguarding Adults and Mental Capacity Act Newsletter has recently been published.

World War One Exhibition in the Library

Over the past few months Anne Kirkman has spent many hours going through old newspapers in the Cambridgeshire Collection at the Central Library, and many more on the internet, researching news items relating to Willingham and Over during the First World War, the Suffolk Regiment to which most local men belonged, and individual soldier's stories. Some of the fruits of Anne's labours were on display on the Sunday of Feast Weekend, at an exhibition organised by the Friends of Willingham Library. Also on display were items lent by local residents, including medals, postcards from the Front, letters, photos, 'death plaques' and a couple of the tobacco tins given to each soldier by Princess Mary for Christmas 1914 (best wishes for a Victorious New Year!), one complete with 100 year old cigarettes and tobacco. There were also albums of pictures of local soldiers, and of the staff and patients at the VAD Hospital, which was housed in the old Church Hall (now a private residence).

The exhibition was a great success, with over a hundred visitors over the course of the day. Following the public viewing, four classes from Willingham Primary School were invited to the library as they are studying the war. The children were particularly interested in items that had been loaned and a World War I songbook - the strains of *It's a Long Way to Tipperary* and *Pack up Your Troubles* have been reverberating round the school!

We plan to re-erect the display in the Octagon behind the Parish Church on Remembrance Sunday for anyone who missed it, or who would like another look.

Pause For Thought

'Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.' [John 15:13] When I was volunteering in Ethiopia I understood this from a different perspective.

The love for ones fellow human beings can manifest itself in different ways. Our armed forces show constantly their love for us all as they put themselves in the front line and during the First World War here in Willingham, families lost loved ones because they too loved us all so very much. Other charitable volunteers do so all the time around the world and it is with unbelievable sadness some are not able to fulfil the work they set out to do before they meet their end.

Where I was based in Mekelle near the Eritrean border, was a magnificent monument set on a hill to honour their war dead and it is clearly for men, women and children equally. Usually it is a very quiet place up there; just two sets of huge, simple yet inspiring statues. On one side are the expected fighters and a tank, but on the other are ordinary people with a donkey struggling along, plus a fallen woman with her distressed child. In the centre stands a fairly plain but extraordinarily tall obelisk. I absolutely loved it. Once I went there at dawn for a special war Remembrance Day held for the ordinary people who became martyrs, losing their lives just 30 years ago. Sunrise was fantastic as it shone on the people up at the top; all workers with a pick axe, shovel, crow bar or similar tools. Half were women, since they work manually as well as rear the children, so some were there with their babies on their backs. We all crouched together, chatting in halting phrases before traditional music was played followed by the brass band. The seven massive wreaths laid were palm branches brightened by local flowers, but each needed a few bearers to carry each one up the flights of steps to the top. As each was laid it was accompanied by the Last Post. After a few speeches everyone moved to the side of the hill to dig and plant young trees. For me the whole experience was incredibly moving. Although I was invited for a coffee ceremony at the home of a woman I had just met I didn't go; instead I walked back, thinking all sorts of deep thoughts, through the town bustling with beggars, animals, traders to the office to start my working day. I was totally bowled over by it all and being a part of it all felt such a privilege.

'Hello!' from your new Police Sergeant

Please allow me to introduce myself. I am Police Sergeant Mark Rabel based at Histon Station and have responsibility for the Histon Panel area — which embraces your village. I've been in post now for about 3 months. I live in this area and have three children — the two youngest attend local schools. What happens in this area also affects me; I have a vested interest in your village!

South Cambridgeshire continues to enjoy a status of being a safe place to live and work. Our biggest crime problem continues to be burglaries with an average of one a day being committed throughout the area. Sounds a lot? Our geographic patch is approximately 350 square miles – it's a massive area to patrol. Typically a window is smashed with an untidy search of the house before people make off with small valuables. It's an awful experience for the victim of such a crime with a feeling of violation and the cost of replacing stolen items, repairing windows and changing locks. In the last few weeks we have apprehended and charged eight individuals with burglary - interestingly all bar one of these thieves lived outside South Cambridgeshire - suggesting that our area is targeted by criminals. Preventing burglary and catching offenders remains our top local priority.

You can help by keeping vigilant for suspicious activity in your area and calling 999 if you feel something is amiss. Statistically there are very few successful burglaries where there is a working alarm system fitted. If you want advice in relation to the security of your property call your local officer who will be only too happy to help and provide a free security survey.

The summer months are almost gone and we have had relatively little disorder in comparison to the same time last year. We were actively engaged in conducting summertime patrols in the green spaces in your area. Pretty well all events or carnivals have been without major incident.

Flu vaccination is recommended and is free under the NHS to all people of 65 years and over, pregnant women, and to those of any age with a long term medical condition, for example diabetes, heart disease, kidney or liver disease, asthma or any breathing disorder. Please enquire if you are unsure whether you qualify. Carers (in receipt of Carers Allowance) are also eligible. Please ring to make an appointment.

Private flu vaccinations are available at a cost of £10 for those who are not eligible for free NHS flu vaccination. Please ask in pharmacy.

Flu vaccines for children. The campaign to reduce flu in the community by vaccinating healthy children continues this winter. Children born between 2/9/09 and 1/9/12 inclusive can receive a flu vaccination, given in the form of a nasal spray (not an injection).

The **Shingles Vaccination** Rolling Programme is also continuing this autumn. There are strict eligibility criteria and the vaccines are available free this year only to the following groups: –

patients born between 2/9/34 and 1/9/36 and patients born between 2/9/43 and 1/9/44. Please ring for an appointment.

If you notice blood in your pee, even if it's 'just the once', tell your doctor.

Vacancies

The Parish Council is the level of government closest to the community and is usually the first place people go with ideas or concerns. Although it has limited powers itself, it does have the ability to negotiate and the power to influence those other organisations which do make decisions. As a parish councillor, seeing your community change for the better as a result of decisions you have helped make is something that can give you a real sense of achievement and pride. The council currently has 2 vacancies - if you would like to know more about what is involved then please feel free to contact the clerk, chairman or any of the councillors listed below for an informal chat.

Youth Conversion

This Youth facility construction work at the Ploughman Hall is still ongoing, although there have been some delays and there is not yet a confirmed date for opening. We will keep you informed.

Recreation Ground Flooding

In May 2013 the council examined and repaired the drainage on the Recreation Ground. The pipes by the Lode were dug up for distances of up to 24 metres, cleared of roots and other blockages and sections replaced where necessary. The entire bank of the Lode was levelled and the result was free-flowing water from all 9 drains.

However, the water level of the Lode has now risen well above the drain outflows and is now causing flooding of the Recreation Ground. The council has met representatives of the Environment Agency, who are responsible for maintaining the Lode, but they have said that whilst there is no risk of flooding to the residents of Willingham, there is no justification to dredge the Lode.

The council is not happy with this situation. We will be writing to the Environment Agency stating our total dissatisfaction, and copying our MP, District Council and the Minister. District Councillor Manning has agreed that, once the letter is received, he will take it up with Government.

Green bin collections will be moving to a monthly collection during the winter months of December, January and February when far less garden waste is put out by residents. Fortnightly collections will continue for the rest of the year. Christmas collection dates might move forwards or back, stopping on the 28 December and starting again on the 5 January. For more information visit www.scambs.gov.uk/content/find-your-bin-collection-day.

Excess blue bin material is routinely collected when placed alongside the bin in a returnable container or plastic box. Excess black bin waste will be collected if placed alongside the bin on the first scheduled collection after the New Year.

All bin collection routes (green, blue and black) are also being adjusted in order to achieve further efficiencies and therefore reduce costs. This might mean your bins are collected either earlier or later in the day – particularly your green bin during the summer months, when there is more garden waste to collect.

Independent Living Fund Closure, June 2015

The Independent Living Fund (ILF) aimed to support long term, independent living for severely disabled people by helping them to live at home instead of in residential care. In March 2014, the Government announced that the ILF will close on 30 June 2015 when the County Council will take over responsibility for meeting the eligible care and support needs of ILF users.

The County Council and ILF are working closely together to make sure the transfer of responsibility for funding arrangements takes place as smoothly as possible. The ILF have written to all their service users to advise them of the transfer of funding to councils from 30 June 2015. The County Council has also written to service users to advise them of the change. The ILF are planning to undertake joint visits with the County Council by June 2015 to give people the opportunity to discuss their care and support needs and independent living outcomes and how these will be managed in the future, and to ask any questions they have about the transfer. In the meantime ILF caseworkers will continue to support people.

The Independent Living Fund website www.dwp.gov.uk/ilf includes a Guide to the programme's closure. You can also phone the County Council's Customer Services on 0345 045 5202 with any questions. The ILF is no longer accepting any new applications.


