Re. Bowls Club Future?

Dear Parish Council,

Following our Extraordinary Meeting and our AGM, we are sorry to inform you that owing to circumstances stated in this letter, the decision, although made reluctantly, is to fold the Bowls Club.

The reasons for this decision are the condition of the Green and surrounds due to the continual flooding of the ground which has no sign of being rectified, and at our two meetings, because of this situation, nobody was prepared to form a committee to take the club further.

So unless the Council, a company or benefactor can come up with a solution we are sorry to say the village will lose an amenity, which is not only for the young at heart but also the young and future generations, and has been a way of getting out in the fresh air, having exercise, and also socialising with teams from surrounding villages.

We formally request a meeting with the Parish Council to discuss what happens to the Club assets, buildings etc including the history of the Club, as Willingham Bowls Club is one of the oldest in the county. If this could be arranged as soon as possible it would be appreciated.

In November our guest speaker was Polly Howat talking about The Wise and Unwise Women of the Fens. It was a really interesting mix of stories about witches, traditions and homespun remedies. In the 17th century, the Witchfinder General for the Fens would test supected witches with the witchpricker'. If the woman did not bleed when pricked she would be adjudged a witch and hanged. The Witchfinder General's reward of 6d per conviction would hardly have promoted impartiality! The wise women of the Fens were often known as 'handywomen' and they would give medical treatment to those who could not afford a doctor - melted butter to soothe a sore throat, maggots to cure an ear infection, willow bark to reduce pain. Many of the remedies have underlying truth maggots are still used to kill infections and willow bark contains aspirin.

Recipe

Still hankering after some fruit cake after all that Christmas food? Or perhaps the Christmas cake disappeared too quickly. Try this delicious easy recipe.

FRUITY FRUIT CAKE

1lb (400g) dried mixed fruit

1 mug hot black tea (fruit teabags give the cake extra flavour)

1 mug soft brown sugar

4oz (100g) cherries (optional)

2 mugs self-raising flour

1 egg

Soak the dried fruit overnight in the hot tea.

Next morning, add the cup of sugar and stir. Leave until evening.

Mix the egg into the fruit, followed by the cherries if

used, then stir in the flour in two parts.

Place in a 2lb loaf tin or round cake tin (lined with greaseproof paper, but no butter).

Bake for 2 hours at 160c, 325f of gas mark 3. Cover with foil after 1 hour to stop the top burning.

Serve hot or cold. Can be frozen.

MOTORISTS BE AWARE AND BEWARE!

As from now, anyone caught using the Airfield Road will be given 3 points on their licence as well as a £60 fine.

This is just one of a number of changes to the fixed penalty system.

New offences

The new offences that will now draw penalty points include:

- Failure by learner or novice drivers to display L plates or N plates respectively on their cars;
- Drivers breaking a ban on U-turns;
- Breaking rules on the use of mini roundabouts;
- Offences relating to the size and weight of larger vehicles;
- Going beyond no-entry to vehicles signs;
- Disobeying traffic control signs;

• Driving without a licence plate or with one that has been altered inaccurately.

Offences that will now face a change to the number of penalty points they now carry will include:

- Driving without a test certificate;
- Dangerous parking;
- Failure to keep to the left-hand side of the road;
- Dangerous overtaking;
- Driving across the road's middle line;
- Failure to stop for a stop sign;
- Failure to yield at a yield sign or yield line;
- Not following traffic signs at junctions;
- Driving through traffic lights;
- Breaking of speed restrictions.

The Council hopes everyone had a happy and peaceful Christmas break and wishes everyone in the village a successful 2015!

Willingham Lode

Last month we reported on the action we had taken to persuade the Environment Agency to clear the Lode. Responses have now been received and we will be liaising with the Agency's Area Manager to pursue this issue further. Possible sources of funding for future maintenance work have been proposed and the Council is looking forward to being updated about these. Without the Lode being cleared the Parish Council feels it has very limited options for solving the flooding on the Recreation Ground.

Emergency Planning

Members of the Parish Council have been meeting to review and revise the current emergency plans for the village. Steps are being taken to enhance the village's capacity to respond to an emergency. In the case of any flooding occurring the Council plans to have available a store of sandbags and sand, both kept at a central location. More details of the revised plan will be made available during the year and the plan will also be placed on the Parish website.

Defibrillator Installation

The Parish Council is purchasing a defibrillator for general use in Willingham. This will be sited on an external wall of the Pavilion, West Fen Road. It is important that members of the village receive training in defibrillator use and the Council is planning to provide an 'open' training session in the Ploughman Hall. More details about this will be published – anyone will be able to attend. A contribution to the cost of the session will be welcome from those attending.

The Bowls Club

Willingham's Bowls Club was formed in 1937 and is one of the oldest clubs in the county. The Parish Council is disappointed that the Club will cease to operate due to the lack of an organising committee. The Council will hope to have a meeting early in the year with members of the outgoing committee to identify possible future options for bowls in Willingham.

Street Lighting

In November 2013 it was noted that the street lights' conversion in the village had been ongoing for nine months. Just over a further 12 months later we are now advised that this project is finally nearing completion, with any outstanding issues being resolved soon. If you have any

concerns about the street lighting then you should initially contact the contractor (Balfour Beatty: telephone 0800 783 824). The Parish Council would like to thank our County Councillor, Peter Hudson, for lobbying for us.

Bin Collections

Finally, the changed rota for bin collection in Willingham during the winter months has now been introduced. Details have been distributed to every household in the village and the rota can always be found in your copy of *Willingham News*.
