Celebrating the Official Opening of the Youth Centre

With great anticipation and delight, young people and parents turned up on Saturday, 24 January for the opening of the long-awaited Youth Centre. The new two-storey facility, created through an innovative renovation of space at the Ploughman Hall, was officially opened by Councillor Baird, Chairman of South Cambridgeshire District Council.

The Centre will provide a permanent home for existing and new youth-focused activities. Willingham Youth Trust promotes young people's opportunities in the village and runs the existing youth club. Willingham Originalz will take on the lease and look to increase the number of activities and events being delivered. Chair of the Trust, Reverend Linda Liversidge said, 'This project has been an aspiration for a long time and largely through the efforts and passion of the former Baptist Minister, Reverend Trevor Rowe and our fundraising volunteer, Caroline Hyde, we finally have the youth facility this village deserves.'

There was an excellent turn-out including many who have been involved in providing activities for the young over the years. Trustee Graham Mumby observed that 'there was genuine admiration for the new facility from both the young and older generations, with club members clearly looking forward to moving in.'

The Centre, split over two floors, features a café-style kitchen and flexible seating along with TV/games consoles, table football and table tennis on the ground floor, with a large area upstairs housing a sofa, tables and with capacity for gaming, computer work or group activities. The Trust was awarded a grant from the Police and Crime Commissioner Youth Fund for Cambridgeshire to run a 10-week non-contact tag boxing programme on Saturdays.

In addition to Parish Council funds, the project received a generous grant under SCDC's Local Communities' programme and fundraising undertaken by WYT which included grants from Fen Edge Community Association, the British School Trust and generous donations from village residents.

The youth club runs Wednesdays 6 30 - 8 30 pm and Thursdays 6 30-8 pm during term times for ages 11–16. Trained youth workers provide a varied programme. New members are, of course, most welcome and encouraged to take a look one evening.

Old Willingham

Today it is called the sacristy but was originally a cell in which a person (usually a woman) would choose to be imprisoned for life to pray for the village and its people. After entering, she would never leave until death. The little window at the side (not the end) was a place where you could talk to her and ask for prayers, advice – or maybe get a little gossip since she would know everyone's secrets! This is an exciting conversion of what was under-used storage space, made possible with funding from the Parish Council, South Cambridgeshire District Council and Willingham Youth Trust. Alongside the formalities, the many people attending had the opportunity to learn about the plans that Willingham Youth Trust has for their new venture. The Parish Council thanks all those – too numerous to mention individually - who have given, in various ways, their professional and personal support to the Project.

The Parish Council has agreed with the Willingham Youth Trust a 10-year lease to operate the facility. If you have a family member who would benefit from attending the Club, please get in touch with a member of the Youth Trust or drop in to the Ploughman Hall on the evenings that the Club is open to find out more!

Community Health Issues

Last month we reported a complaint about dog fouling in Silver Street. The Parish Council has now received further complaints about dog fouling in other areas including Long Lane. It is especially important that owners clear up after their pets because Long Lane is, of course, the main access for Willingham's younger families going to the primary school.

The Environment Agency currently has two teams of men tidying up the banks of the Lode and clearing out debris. Unfortunately, they are not removing any silt. The teams report they are coming across examples of flytipping – which obviously restricts water flow, raises water levels in the Lode and increases the flooding risk on the Recreation Ground and within the village. Please help prevent this by using your bins for your rubbish.

Red Cross Collections

A parishioner has reported that door-to-door collections to fund raise on behalf of the Red Cross are not taking place in the village as systematically as in the past. The amount collected has fallen, it is claimed, to one quarter of that collected in Over. If you want to help rectify this situation, please get in touch with the Red Cross or the Parish Clerk.

Defibrillator Installation

The defibrillator purchased by the Parish Council, sited on an external wall of the Pavilion in West Fen Road, has now been installed Details of a free training session in the Ploughman Hall will be published soon. The Parish Council would be interested to hear about the current location of other defibrillators and suggestions for possible future locations of this potentially lifesaving piece of equipment, should funding become available.

PCSO re-allocation

The Parish Council understands that there are now only

five PCSOs serving this area north of Cambridge from Histon Police Station and that if you now contact the police – 101 is the preferred number – then the next available PCSO, not necessarily Tony Martin, will be asked to get in touch with you.
