# CATTELL'S MILL OPEN DAY NATIONAL MILLS WEEKEND

### SATURDAY 9 MAY and SUNDAY 10 MAY 2 - 5 pm

Your local windmill, Cattell's Mill, Mill Road, will be open for this year's National Mills Weekend when many of the country's wind and watermills open their doors to the public.

The mill and an exhibition showing details of the mill's history and other artefacts will be open to visitors. Cream teas, cakes and refreshments will be served from our cafe, postcards and real stone ground flour (from Wicken Mill) will be on sale to raise funds for the continued restoration of one of the largest smock mills in East Anglia. A 'mill to mill' radio link will be run once again, courtesy of Cambridge Amateur Radio Society.

The mill suffered a small amount of damage during the high winds at the end of March. This year we will be raising funds for these repairs.

## **Letter to Villagers**

### Dear Villagers,

I am trying to persuade the County Council to make some changes to the village entrances/exits to improve road safety.

I would be interested in hearing from anyone who is interested in helping or has viewpoints on this.

Having already been in contact with the Parish Council and Over Parish Council, I have learnt that there have been attempts before to have schemes introduced but these have not been successful.

I have lived in the village for a number of years and, being a cyclist, parent, motorist and commuter, I am amazed at the speed of traffic on Over Road, entering and exiting the village, as well as the usual hotspots of Rampton Road and Earith/Station Road.

I have asked questions regarding the provision of a cycle path / walkway between Willingham and Over past Highgate but so far this has been somewhat tricky as Over Parish are responsible for the area outside Highgate even though the village sign suggests it is in Willingham. I also suggested a cycleway to Rampton.

I have made suggestions such as; the provision of priority over oncoming traffic chicanes, extending the 30 mph zone and increasing the number of crossings for pedestrians accessing the school at Newington and the recreational facilities across Earith Road, perhaps also raising the road surface at the junction at the end of Church Street near the Co-op to slow traffic coming round onto Church Street at speed.

Other villages locally have some good examples of improvements that don't necessarily have to be the dreaded speed bumps. The other thing I have mentioned is the location of the speed camera possibly being reconsidered to catch speeding motorists coming along Earith Road.

With small children I am keen to see something done and would welcome support/further discussion. Our village is very active in making joint decisions to improve the village and I am sure that I am not the only one that feels strongly about this.

## PASTORAL LETTER

I don't know how you feel about politics, particularly with a general election this month. Perhaps you have enjoyed getting into the issues and comparing each political party, or you have been assessing the principle players and how they react to various situations, or maybe you are heartily sick of all the political spin, or haven't even noticed there was an election at all!

So why am I mentioning the election in a pastoral letter? Many would say that a pastoral letter is not the place for politics. But politics is concerned with all aspects of public life. And similarly the spiritual cannot be separated from the rest of life for Psalm 139 tells us that God is with us wherever we go, in fact he is there before we even arrive. So I see God as very much involved in our private lives and in the public arena too.

God spoke through the prophet Jeremiah to the Israelites living in exile telling them to 'seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the Lord for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper.' In other words we should each do what we can for the area we live in, trying to bring peace and prosperity. This can be in how we live, how we interact with each other and includes playing our part in the public areas of life. So we should be involved in politics, at a minimum prayerfully considering the issues and wisely casting our votes in the election. But also engaging with MPs, councillors and others in public office, for in a democracy we all have a voice and to withhold it is to undermine the value of democracy. So as we look at the public sphere we should ask what can I do? What positive difference can I make? And as we work for the good of the locality we too shall prosper.

Finally we should note that we are called to pray for the area too, asking God to bless it. We could use the words of the Lord's Prayer asking 'your Kingdom come, your will be done', for the Kingdom of God is a place of peace, a place where we can all prosper. Let's see Faith and action working together for the good of everyone in Willingham and beyond.

## Notes From a Hillside Near You

One of the delights of return visits to Willingham from across the water in Haddenham is the banter concerning passports, visas and border controls.

On Easter Sunday, claiming exemption under EU Human Rights, I was able without impediment to visit my tree, one of the 120 fruit trees in Willingham Community Orchard. It's a Victoria Plum and is dedicated to *The Welfare State*. This dedication seemed appropriate when it was planted in 2014, the year in which we were repeatedly taken back in time to the start and ensuing horrors of World War 1, 'lest we forget'; for we seemed also to be in danger of forgetting the significance of what became, post World War 2, the envy of the world.

As we approach the General Election, the dedication seems even more appropriate as a reminder of: (a) how important the Welfare State has been over the years in caring for the nation's citizens; (b) the extent to which government and media have more recently demonised 'welfare-dependency' and damaged the whole concept of the nation looking after all of its people be they rich or poor, deserving or undeserving, strivers or skivers, hardworking or work-shy; (c) the hundreds of thousands of lives forced into poverty, homelessness and despair by austerity cuts to the welfare budget made by an administration which has done little to penalise those responsible for the crisis that necessitated the nation's soaring budget deficit (by which I mean financiers and bankers, not the previous government).

The concept did not and should not depend on taking out what one puts in. It was and should be based on 'There but for the grace of god go I', ie empathy and to each according to his/her needs.

And are we all in it together? Or are we not?

So, be careful where you put your X on 7 May. My tree will flourish under the TLC of WAG's Tree Project Group; but if the onslaught on the Welfare State continues unabated it could take us back to the thirties and beyond, to a society irreparably broken by ideology and polarised between the haves and the have-nots.

Most people will instantly recognise this location as both buildings are still on the High Street and surprisingly unchanged. Here we see Alec Norman and his dog. Mr Norman was well known in the village for general repairs. He originally had a workshop at Fen End but moved to these larger premises. To his right are petrol pumps (and probably also paraffin.) The pump is selling 'Pratts' petrol which was one of the major suppliers until 1935 when the name was change to Esso (literally 'S' and 'O' from the parent company Standard Oil.) You might think the little shop would contain car parts but, zooming in on the photo, we see that the window display is radio sets and lamps. Alec had diversified into the wireless business. This picture was probably taken in early 1930s.

## **From the Parish Council**

### **QE II Field Play Equipment**

The QEII Working Group (made up of Parish Councillors and members of Willingham Action Group) has been in discussion with the various funding bodies and suppliers, checking agreements, prices and commitments. The complete scheme is not yet funded and some of the awards have limited timeframes, so the project has been divided into two Phases: Phase 1 for 1-12 year olds and Phase 2 for 13-18 year olds. We are happy to report that the contract for Phase 1 – at a cost of £108,300 – has now been signed and work will commence as soon as possible. We are hopeful that it will be completed before the summer holidays.

The construction of this exciting facility has only been made possible with a great deal of work by many people and the generous support of the village – it seems a long time since the 'It's A Knockout' fundraiser. The Council would like to thank everyone involved.

Phase 2 is currently expected to cost around  $\pounds 38,000$  and an application for a grant for the majority of this has been submitted. We should have a decision on this by June.

### Bus Route 110 - Cottenham & Ely

The operators of the 110 bus route have proposed a new timetable which could include stops at Church Street and Fen End in Willingham twice a week, on Thursdays and Saturdays. The bus would leave at 10 01 am and arrive in Ely at 10 40 am, stopping at Cottenham and Wilburton on the way. The return journey would leave Ely at 1 15 pm and arrive back here at 1 56 pm. Unfortunately, these additional stops will only be made if the Council agrees to subsidise the costs. We are still investigating the details, but are considering trialling this for six months or so to gauge demand. Please let us know if this route would interest you.

### **Police Matters**

Those of you who receive the eCops emails from the Cambridgeshire Constabulary will know that there has been an alarming number of thefts of catalytic converters in Willingham and several surrounding villages. Vehicles with high ground clearance are particularly vulnerable to the thieves who can crawl under a car or van and cut out the convertor in a matter of minutes, causing thousands of pounds of damage and a great deal of inconvenience. Police advice is:

- If you have a garage try to park your vehicle inside. If that is not possible, try to park with the front or side of the vehicle parked up to, or alongside, a garage, building wall or fence to restrict access.
- If you have more than one vehicle, try to park them bonnet-to-bonnet or alongside each other to restrict access to the underside of the vehicle.
- Consider installing a movement activated security light to provide coverage of the area in which your vehicle is usually parked.

### Longstanton Park & Ride

The introduction of parking charges for the Guided Busway park at Longstanton is now planned for the 14 May. The charge will be  $\pounds 1$  for up to 18 hours, although there is a 1 hour free period to allow for dropping-off and picking-up. Weekly, 4 weekly and annual fees will be available as well as an online automatic billing system. We would advise allowing plenty of time when the charges start, given the huge queues which other parks experienced when charges were introduced.

### Staff

At the time of writing, our Administrative Assistant has still not made a full recovery. We apologise if you have had any difficulty reaching the office which has of necessity been open less than usual. Hopefully Halina will be back in the near future; we wish her all the best and look forward to once more providing full service to the village.

### **Dog Fouling**

We continue to receive letters complaining that dog owners are not cleaning up after their pets – this is particularly a problem on Long Lane which is extensively used by the school children. Please use the dog bins provided around the village.
