Our group works in conjunction with the Cambridge Group, campaigning for women's rights and against the use of torture and the death penalty.

Willingham Neighbourhood Watch

If you are not a member of Neighbourhood Watch you may still want to subscribe to 'e-cops.' This is a free service whereby the police email out details of local crime. Although we are blessed with a low crime rate in Willingham, being aware of local problems may enable you to be better prepared. There are frequent thefts of bikes from the Guided Busway so make sure you have a good lock. We also have occasional shed burglaries and theft of garden equipment – thieves can easily sell extension leads and petrol strimmers at car boot sales.

To subscribe to ecops, go to www.ecops.org.uk to register. Even if you are unsure about joining, it's worth having a look at the website.

'Professional' burglary where a house is targeted with particular thefts in mind is rare in Willingham but softer targets like garden sheds are more likely to be broken into. In the summer there is often an increase in impulse theft so don't leave valuable items near open doors or within reach of an open window especially if your house is a short distance from the pavement. Keep side/back gates locked as it is easy for someone to approach the house pretending to be asking for directions or trying to find someone.

Cambridgeshire Crimestoppers Tackling Crime on Your Doorstep

The independent charity Crimestoppers is reminding residents to be aware of doorstep crime and to report any suspicious activity. Between May 2014 and April 2015 there were over 500 instances of suspected **rogue trading** reported to Cambridgeshire Police – criminals, masquerading as genuine businesses but deliberately overcharging for often unsatisfactory goods or services, often insist on cash up front and can be intimidating. Once they have found a victim they often return under a new guise. Another group of **doorstep criminals** are those who trick their way into victims' houses to steal any valuables available. **There are few better crime prevention measures than having good neighbours**.

Remember the following 4 principles on how to deal with unexpected and unwanted visitors on your doorstep: **LOCK:** Ensure you keep exterior doors and windows locked.

STOP: Before you answer the door – are you expecting anyone?

CHAIN: Put the door bar or chain on. Look through the spyhole or the window to see who it is. Always keep the bar or chain on while you are talking to the person on the doorstep.

CHECK: Ask for and carefully check the caller's ID card as all genuine callers will always carry one. If they do not have an ID card then **do not let them in**.

Crimestoppers allows the public to report crime or suspicious activity completely anonymously day or night.

If you have any information about crime or criminals, please call Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111. The future of the Library

The Library Service has now concluded its initial consultation on the future direction, in the context of needing to save £1.8 million over the next 3 years from its current budget of £4.5 million. It yielded 'mixed results'. Whilst a significantly higher proportion of people disagreed with the overall direction – 266 disagreed (57%) 129 agreed (27.6%) – this was not replicated in the responses to the individual questions, where a significantly higher proportion agreed rather than disagreed with all the priorities except for 'Enabling rather than Delivering' (ie transferring more responsibility for running libraries to communities).

These results were on the agenda of the County Council Highways and Community Infrastructure Committee on 2 June, for 'noting'. More detailed proposals will be discussed in July, followed by a further public consultation July-September, with final proposals to be agreed at the Committee meeting in October.

Summer sun We all hope for good weather this year but do remember to use adequate sunscreen to prevent skin cancer. Ask our pharmacy staff for advice on the best products to use. Take particular care with children and make sure they wear a sun hat and drink plenty.

Heatwave Advice from Public Health Heatwaves can be dangerous, especially for the very young or very old or those with chronic disease. Advice on how to reduce the risk either for yourself or somebody you know, can be obtained from NHS 111 or from your local chemist or visit the NHS Choices website www.nhs.uk/summerhealth The main points are:

- Stay out of the sun.
- Keep your home as cool as possible shading windows and shutting them during the day may help. Open them when it is cooler at night.
- Keep drinking fluids. If there's anybody you know, for example an older person living on their own who might be at special risk, make sure they know what to do.

COMMUNITY ORCHARD OPENING

The Community Orchard Opening event, to mark the end of the tree project, and establishment of the orchard and woodland on the 5-acre site of the Old Recreation Ground, was well-attended and enjoyed by all on a sunny Saturday, 30 May. Willingham Action Group Chairman, Reg Purnell, welcomed South Cambridgeshire District Council Chair, Councillor Sue Ellington who conducted the opening, and unveiled the three signboards to be placed on the site. Willingham Parish Council Chairman, Phil King thanked Councillor Ellington for officiating. Councillor Ray Manning was also in attendance. In his opening remarks Reg Purnell recorded how much Willingham Action Group (WAG) has achieved, working in association with the Parish Council, since the Parish Plan was published.

The formalities were followed by a picnic in this wonderful setting where children were able to run free. There was also the opportunity for those not already familiar with the orchard project to look at the wide range of trees that have been planted.

All such projects require immense input from those who manage them, those who volunteer for the practical tasks and those who undertake the often unsung backroom work. It is, therefore, fitting to mention some of those who have contributed and to thank all who have assisted with various tasks.

The orchard idea was conceived some five years ago, which developed into a wider tree planting project when the funding opportunity of the Big Tree Plant presented itself. Diana and Malcolm Oviatt-Ham contributed valuable professional knowledge to the initial planning and to the execution of the early phase of the project. Also closely involved from the beginning have been Polly and Alan Fawcitt who more recently were responsible for organising the tree labels and working on the signboard content together with Louise Daugherty who has undertaken extensive research and data organisation. The orchard signs were designed by Siobhan Brown and much admired.

Although the opening marked the completion of the funded phase of the tree project, work will continue on tree maintenance and development of the ecology of the Community Orchard site. It is also fitting to acknowledge the ongoing assistance from Edward Gilbert of Queenholme Farm with the essential orchard maintenance tasks, which is a huge benefit.

It just remains to thank, on behalf of WAG, all those involved in the project, Willingham Parish Council for their collaboration and support and to encourage the community to enjoy and benefit from what the orchard and woodland have to offer.

Not only is Willingham isolated in this respect from all its neighbouring communities, not only are Willingham's secondary-aged school children denied safe bicycle access to the village colleges they choose to attend, but the roadside footpaths do not extend even as far as the Community Orchard on the Earith Road or Barry Papworth's farm shop on the Over Road and for visitors staying at the two local camp sites pedestrian (or even cycle) access to and from the village is dauntingly dangerous in daylight and out of the question after dark.

Looking further afield we can only admire the lobbying skills of other Cambridgeshire villages, as evidenced by the new foot/cycle paths which have been and are being constructed by the County Council, and wonder why Willingham is being so singularly left out.

Community Orchard

The new Community Orchard sited on the old Recreation Ground at the top of Earith Road was officially opened on Saturday, 30 May by Councillor, Sue Ellington, Chair of South Cambridge District Council in a well-attended picnic event when, fortunately, the sun shone. (For full report see page 17.) The orchard has been made possible by the joint efforts of the Parish Council who provided the land and some funding, Willingham Action Group who did most of the hard work in planting a thousand trees and many local residents who helped with sponsorship. The orchard is available for everyone to enjoy and will get better over the coming years as the trees mature. Hopefully, it will be something to be enjoyed by our children and our children's children.

Whilst mentioning recreational space, good progress is being made on new play equipment. More on this next month.

Traffic Calming

The Parish Council continues to press the County Council on this issue but with very little success. The Highways Department has never been easy to deal with and on this matter is being particularly obdurate. The argument is that the B1050 is a vital link into the Fens and that any restrictions on one link will simply force more traffic onto other, equally crowded, routes and that a new road is beyond its means and not in its five-year Plan. However, Councillors have agreed to look into one minor change, which would be an extension of the thirty mile per hour limit further south along Station Road. We await developments.

Bus Services

The Parish Council has been trying for some time to persuade the County Council and the bus companies to provide a limited service to join us up with Rampton and Cottenham with links to Ely. The Parish Council had offered to pay for an extension of the current Rampton service but we are told that this service has now been withdrawn and is out to re-tender. We will keep pressing.

Cemetery

There have been a number of complaints about the grass cutting. There seem to be two main problems. The first is in trying to set up a workable contract. The Parish Council contracts out the work by competitive tender and, in doing so, has to specify what is required in terms of the number of cuts and their frequency. That would be easy if grass grew at a constant rate throughout the year but of course the growth rate depends a lot on the weather. We can and do specify additional cuts from time to time but that has to fit in with other commitments that the contractor has. The second, and even more difficult problem, is the layout. Over the years many grave holders have ignored the rules and installed curbs and edgings that make cutting very difficult. Enforcing the rules retrospectively would no doubt cause great anxiety. We have no simple solutions but will continue to monitor the situation and do what we can to improve it.

New Councillors

We are delighted to say that no fewer than four parishioners have stepped forward to become Councillors and that all four have been co-opted. For the first time for several years the Council has a full complement. We are also very pleased that we now have three female Councillors, not quite the fifty-fifty balance we would like to see but a vast improvement. Contact details for the new Councillors will be published next month when the paperwork is complete.
