### **Old Willingham**

Newcomers to the village might wonder why there is an ATM in the front of a house in the High Street. Here is a picture of that house in earlier days. Eighty years ago there was an ancient rambling thatched house covering this site and that of the post office. At that time the village newsagent was on Green Street, run by Mrs Few and her daughter Marjory. Eventually, as the village expanded they ran out of space and built two identical houses on the High Street - one for the shop (shown here) and the other to live in. This photo shows the shop in April 1960 when it closed for the last time. After this, one of the houses became the post office and is still just visible behind major modifications. This house went through various changes and ended up, by the 1980s, as a branch of Barclays Bank. When the bank closed in the early 2000s there was such an uproar in the village that Barclays agreed to keep the ATM machine for at least 15 years - and it is still there!

### **Birding Notes**

For most bird-watchers seeing a peregrine falcon remains an uncommon and exciting experience. The fastest bird in the world, it can reach 200 mph, and its aerobatics when hunting are thrilling to see. A birding highlight of a recent holiday to Menorca came on a coastal path overlooking high cliffs, when we were lucky enough to see a pair of peregrines teaching a recently fledged chick to fly and hunt. Little did we realise that we would be able to have the same experience in the centre of Cambridge.

Increasing numbers of peregrines are choosing to nest in cities and this spring, for the first time, a pair has nested in Cambridge and successfully raised a chick. The pair was spotted nesting on a high city-centre roof top in April; once the chick fledged in June, the family moved off the nest so that flight training could begin in earnest. This was accompanied by noisy vocal encouragement and it has been a common sight to see shoppers and tourists craning their necks skywards to see what the fuss is about. Hunting has also been successful, if the occasional decapitated pigeon remains are anything to go by.

Peregrines normally nest on cliff ledges or in open spaces and it seems that tall buildings in cities replicate this habitat. Cities also have the advantage of providing a reliable supply of food thanks to their large feral pigeon populations as well as offering some protection from persecution. Many cities now have nesting peregrines and there is some suggestion that birds are beginning to choose these in favour of traditional upland sites.

One of our most persecuted birds of prey, peregrines became almost extinct in the 1960s. Thousands were killed during World War 2 to protect the pigeons which were used to carry messages; widespread use of DDT in 1950s meant that birds were poisoned when they ate infected insects and birds. Thanks to conservation measures and a crack-down on pesticides, numbers have recovered and the current population stands at around 1400 pairs in summer. It seems that city nest sites may be helping this recovery.

Peregrines mate for life and will return to previous nest sites, so we can hope to see this beautiful bird gracing the skies of Cambridge for years to come.

### THE OLD RECREATION GROUND

This 5 acre field has undergone many transformations over time. For centuries it was virtually underwater, on the edge of Willingham Mere, and became part of Middle Fen after the Mere was drained. It has rich fenland soil with a relatively high water table.

Under the Enclosure Award of 1853 the field was allotted to the village for community use, and it ultimately became known as the 'Recreation Ground', being used by villagers for general recreation of all sorts. For several years from the mid 1920s, the cricket club was particularly successful, supported by many of the local gentry. It boasted an excellent cricket square, with a pavilion that backed onto Earith Road. Voluntary contributions were collected in buckets during matches.

After the Second World War the Recreation Ground was used mainly by the football club. There are still villagers today who remember playing football or watching football matches there. They also recall, when young, playing round a small pond in the north east corner of the field. In those days Earith Road was only a small country road, with very few houses and little traffic.



The present 'New' Recreation Ground opened in the 1950s, and was situated on land known as 'The Sandpits', off West Fen Road. Both football and cricket clubs increasingly used the new ground, which was larger, easier to access, and nearer the centre of the village. Subsequently the 'Old' Recreation Ground was let to local farmers for grazing or hay.

In 2012 the Parish Council agreed that it would be appropriate to use this land as a Community Orchard, open to everyone in the village. The trees in the orchard were planted in 2013 and 2014. Since the end of the 19th century orchards have played a large part in the village economy, and there is still one commercial orchard being worked

today. In 1935, commercial orchards around Willingham alone covered over 750 acres, with fruit being regularly sent to London and all over the country, so we feel it is fitting to recreate in a small way, something that has been so important to Willingham life over the years.

One interesting feature to note is opposite Row 4 of the orchard, by the hedge, where you can see the concrete base for a spigot mortar, which fired high explosive bombs. This was part of the county's defences against possible invasion in World War 2.

### What's In a Sausage?



Ever wondered? The sausage is high on Britain's favourite food list, and I have my personal favourites. A flyer for a 'Sausage Making Master Class' at Highgate Farm Shop seemed too good an opportunity to miss, so I and four likeof my minded friends signed up to find out.

The advert implied we could add whatever flavourings we might want, so game on! Create the sausage you had always dreamed of!

We arrived at the Butchery on the appointed evening with flavourings of our choice and met up with Kevin the Butcher. He presented us with our raw materials, a bowl full of 10lb of prime pork cuts.

Our first question... What type of pig is this and which bits of it have we got in here? A quick tour of the chiller identified the meat we were working with was from a Saddleback Pig, predominately from the shoulder and the belly, ie meat with a reasonable fat content and good texture. Satisfied with the base ingredients we gathered around the mincer for the first process.

#### Make the sausage meat.....

Once the meat was passed through the mincer the first time, dry breadcrumbs and any dry seasonings were mixed through. A suitable amount of liquid (of your choice!) and any other 'wet' ingredients such as fresh herbs were added before the entire was mix was passed through the mincer again to combine.

#### Make the sausage....Now the fun part!

Only natural casings are used here, so these were soaked to make them workable. Standing next to a machine that looks similar to a certain upright vacuum cleaner, the sausage meat was loaded inside, the pressure pumped up, and the casings slipped over the nozzle. The speed of the sausage meat exiting the nozzle was controlled by a lever on the 'hoover' which was operated by knee pressure. The casing on the nozzle was gripped (lightly!) between finger and thumb. The general idea was to allow the casing to feed off the nozzle at the same speed as the sausage meat was being forced out. Most first efforts were a little timid but in the end we all got there with something that looked like one very long sausage in varying degrees of thickness.

#### String the sausage.....Now the tricky part!

Thinking the hard work was over, we now had to turn one

very long sausage weighing in at the best part of 10lb into something a bit more user friendly. There are two options apparently, in twos or threes. A short 'discussion' followed on the relative merits of each, but it appeared to boil down to aesthetics and how many you might want to eat at one sitting (freezer portion control?). Kevin made it look effortless, and I'm sure it is after a couple of years of experience, but we didn't have that on our side! We found that chanting a mantra like 'knit one, pearl two' was useful and we got there in the end.

A very satisfying and enjoyable evening was had by all, thanks to our hosts Highgate Farm Shop and particularly Kevin at the Butchery. We shared our sausages amongst ourselves and went home to stuff our freezers.

 $\dots$  And now I know what goes into a sausage – just good ingredients and flavourings of your choice.

What were our flavours? Sorry, can't tell you. It's now a secret family recipe that may just be handed down through the generations.

Future sessions are available at the Farm Shop if you fancy having a go yourself.

#### Northstowe

It is obvious to all who travel on the B1050 that building works on Phase I of Northstowe have commenced, with the road modifications south of the Guided Busway. When complete there will be three access roads to the new town, complete with two sets of traffic lights. The road works will continue until early 2016 and will eventually cause some overnight closures before they are finished. Building onsite commenced on 17 July with the new Primary School, and includes a sports hub, a local centre with shops and community uses, a site for a Household Recycling Centre, and the first 1500 houses.

The plans for Phase II, which is for the town centre, shops, 3 schools, roads, employment opportunities and another 3500 new houses, were approved in outline at the end of June, subject to S106 and some reserved matters. No work on Phase II can commence until the A14 upgrade is complete, so we have quite a few more years before any real details emerge.

And speaking of the A14, the latest news, various publications, and maps of the planned upgrade can be found on the Highways Agency website at www.highways.gov.uk/A14C2H.

#### Flood Risk & Reporting

Cambridgeshire County Council has recently reviewed their Strategy for Flood Risk Management and will be publishing the updates by the end of the year. It is worthwhile repeating from the review that the authority cannot know about every flooding incident, particularly those which do not lead to flooding within property, but that it is important to record flood incidents which affect roads or enter the boundaries of properties. Knowledge of flooding events from relatively regular rainfall can warn where there is a risk to properties from more extreme rainfall.

Once the details of this are revealed we will once more look into the viability of including Willingham on the journey. Our County Councillor, Peter Hudson, is attending the meetings and keeping us informed.

#### Ploughman Hall

The Ploughman Hall floor has been due for a polish for a while now, but we had been waiting for the youth conversion work to be completed. Now that this is done we have scheduled a deep sanding and resurfacing with a sport finish. We hope to have this done in August whilst there is a break in hall activity.

We have recently added an additional CCTV camera to cover the QEII field and extra lighting by the Youth Centre entrance.
