Old Willingham




For many years people drew their water from the village pump on the Green. But in 1912 the Willingham Water and General Supply Company was established with money from wealthy local families. This huge water tower, built on Station Road, was filled by water pumped twice a day from a well below. There is still a row of terraced houses opposite the farm shop sometimes called 'Tower Cottages' and the

tower was located behind this. Initially, the water was delivered to stand pipes in the street and only later plumbed into houses. At 60 feet the tower's tank provided good pressure locally but eventually, as the number of people using the water increased and the original pipes corroded, the pressure could be very low on the far side of the village. As the supply system became modernised through electrical pumping, the tower was no longer needed and was demolished in the 1950s. Reputedly, the bricks were taken away by a farmer from Bluntisham to build a bungalow, load by load behind his tractor.



What?

The Willingham Youth Club meets during term time every Monday from $6\ 30-8\ pm$ (ages 11-13) and Wednesdays from $6\ 30-8\ 30\ pm$ (ages 11-16). (Note change to Monday nights from Thursdays.)

Why?

The aim of the Youth Club is to give the young people of Willingham a space to meet friends, socialise and engage in activities away from home, ranging from arts and crafts, computer games, board games, music to outdoor sports and cookery. Willingham Guides Go Wild in the Woods

In June three Willingham Guides and two of their leaders joined over 30 other Guides at a regional survival camp in Newmarket. After a normal night at camp the girls awoke the next day to be told that a tsunami had hit the North Sea and our camp, being on high ground, was one of the few places not under flood water. The only food was what we had brought with us and the water supply was contaminated.



Over the weekend the girls were taught the skills to survive. On the first day they learnt four different ways to light fires without using matches and how to use saws

and knives as they had to work in patrols to cook all their own meals on open wood fires. They were also taught a number of ways to purify water to make it safe for drinking and simple first aid should an accident happen. Using their newly learnt knife skills they made whistles out of lime tree sticks to be able to call to each other.

Then, during the day, they were told that acid rain had destroyed all the tents. So before they could go to bed that night they had to build shelters and they strung up hammocks in the woods where they, and the leaders, spent the night.

The next day they followed trails using compasses, geocaching and orienteering which lead them via an



archery range. At the archery they had to shoot at targets to gain food for their lunch. The girls then baked their own bread (bannocks) to have with their burgers, all done on open wood fires.

All too soon we were told that we had been rescued and that it was time to go home but not before the Guides had completed their Outdoor Cooks badge and their Survival badges.

PASTORAL LETTER

It is with much excitement that I await the start of the Rugby World Cup at the end of the month. I'm expecting lots of close matches, some great tries and a magnificent England victory at the end. However, it would be surprising if this final expectation isn't shared with everyone so I expect plenty of banter along the way, which is part of the fun.

Sport can be a mirror of life, with positive images like a great victory, an electrifying match, physical excellence, the unexpected star that emerges; but there are negative images too, like losing a match, injury, cheating, arguments. We can question much about life as we observe the drama of a sporting moment.

One of the things about rugby that I like is that it is a true team sport with different roles for players of all sorts of shapes, sizes and expertise. Whether it is the strong solid person in the front row of the scrum, the amazingly tall but athletic person in the line out, the quick thinking scrum half or the speedy sprinters on the wing, each one has a part to play. Without any one of the roles the team loses effectiveness as can be seen when a player gets sent off and the power balance of the game changes.

A team working effectively can be described as a body with each player representing a different part of it. The team needs each player and fails if one is missing, not playing their part or even trying to play somebody else's part. Can you imagine the effect on your body if your foot decided it was a hand? Or if an arm went missing? This description is used for the church, for the apostle Paul describes the church as a body, with each person representing a different part. Each one dependent on the others and each one of value. We are all different with different skills, different experience, different lives. But as we put that variety together to show God's love to the world we are massively effective and can transform the world we live in. You each have much value and a unique contribution to make to the world we live in.

If you think about it, this says that whoever you are, whatever you are like there is a place for you within the Christian church. Jesus didn't come that we may all be the same. He wasn't looking for identical people, he came to bring life in all it's abundance. That's why I love the church, there is such a variety of people with a common purpose. And each person has great value.

Enjoy the Rugby World Cup and when there isn't a match on, maybe it is worth spending time considering how God can use you. You are unique and have a valuable part to play in making this world a better place.


Hempsals Community Farm Open Day

Willingham Community Pulls Together

Willingham community has pulled together to help fund the largest single village playground development in the region. At a time when spending cuts dominate the headlines, Willingham bucks the trend with phase one of the £150,000 new playground project completed and officially opened on 12 July.

The opening event was well attended by villagers of all ages and the comments about the new playground have been overwhelmingly positive. It is fabulous to see the playground being so well used, with groups of parents and children now heading there on a daily basis. Comments from the Facebook page www.facebook.com/QEIIfield include 'So much better than it used to be', 'Now I can't get my kids away from it' and 'Thanks for new playground, we love it'.

The project was led by 5 local mums from the Willingham Action Group (WAG) together with the Parish Council Chairman, Andrew Cook, and Lead Councillor for Leisure and Amenities Jamie Smith, along with Councillor Ray Croucher.


In an area where funding has previously been known to be scarce, the group worked tirelessly to secure local development funds, and called upon generous local businesses/contributors to ensure the project, initially planned as far back as 2009, could be realised.

The project team succeeded in securing significant investment from both the AmeyCespa and WREN community funds, to match against the Council's Section 106 funds.

But WAG and the Parish Council have done more than just applied for various streams of independent external funding, they've also turned to the local people themselves, with sponsorship coming from a number of nearby companies. We would like to thank all our sponsors, listed on the right, without their input the project would not have been possible.

The final phase of the QEII vision is yet to be completed to create an area for over 13s. However, WAG and Parish Council are hopeful of securing further funding to make this happen.

Street Lighting

Cambridgeshire County Council is planning to change the operational times for most of the street lights it owns and operates within the village. Central government funding reductions require financial savings in its annual lighting bill. It is proposing that from 1 April 2016 many street lights on residential roads and footpaths, which are not located on our main traffic routes, will be switched off between midnight and 6 am. In addition all the remaining village street lights, wherever located, will be dimmed from the evening until 6 am. The Parish Council has also been invited to contribute to the costs of street lighting. Church Street has 15 lights and it is proposed that two will remain dimmed throughout the night whilst the remaining 13 will be used for only part of the night. The Parish Council, whilst recognising the need to make savings, would like to understand the logic behind choosing which lamps are to be switched off and which are to be dimmed. If you want to know the impact of this proposal on your street then please check out: www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/streetlighting. The consultation period ends on the 30 September. If you make any comments on the County Council website please also let the Parish Clerk know your views.

Controlling Traffic

The Parish Council originally proposed the extension of the current 30 mph speed limit along Station Road as part of the 2014-2015 Local Highway Improvement Scheme. There now appears to be a reluctant acceptance by the County Council that, subject to receiving positive comment from the police, the current limit could be extended to Westfield. The Parish Council hope this will be implemented during the Autumn. The 2015-2016 competition for Local Highway Improvements is about to commence and the Parish Council will be considering further low cost traffic control options for the village.

The Annual Audit

The Parish Council has received the results of its annual audit. These were overwhelmingly positive in giving the Parish Council's financial and administrative procedures a 'clean bill of health'. Some very minor adjustments were recommended which have been adopted by the Council.

Looking Forward

The October Feast Week will soon be here! Look out for the programme! The Parish Council is already receiving booking requests for Ploughman Hall so if you represent a village group and want to book the Hall please do so as soon as possible to avoid disappointment.

Before then there is the Medal Presentation on 15 September for the Library's Summer Reading Challenge. The Parish Council looks forward to taking part in this.

Willingham Glebe Land

The Parish Council has been approached by Ely Diocese concerning the development of its glebe land in the village. This site is possibly the last in the village which might allow a substantial number of dwellings, possibly 50, to be built. Representatives of the Diocese planned, at short notice, a public consultation meeting at the Ploughman Hall in the evening of the 19 August. Unfortunately this was too late to be published in last month's *Willingham News*.

Parish Office Disruption

Activity in the Parish Office has been disrupted by some flooding. Whilst the cause of the flooding is identified and damage made good there may be some disruption to the Office's activity for the next few weeks. It's good to be insured!


