





Meetings are held at the Social Club on the first Monday of each month (except January and August) from 7 30 pm until around 9 pm. There is also a plant raffle.



PASTORAL LETTER LISTEN TO ME!

After the event of the original sin still in our memory came the commandment of God to subdue the earth. In this 'submission' we not only own the land, but also try to own each other. We forget that power and responsibility is service. It is also a reference to the environment around me, not for me to rule it, but also my submission towards responsibility for the world surrounding me. That someone is a slave and another is free, some are Greeks, others Jews, some are rich and others poor; these terms do not come from God. These descriptions are ours – according to the law, according to justice, according to the criteria of the human race. But in front of God we are all equal, because He loves us with the same Love.

Pillar of the law

The one who applies the law is not a doer of the law but its user for his or her own purposes. It serves, for example, to figure out his own place, or a neighbour's in order to let him know where he stands – because it is fair, because it is OK. Some even feel anointed by the law – sometimes even those anointed by God's law as priests and religious leaders who – thanks to this law – set up around themselves the people and things to organise the order. And yet, the order establishes only the Love, not any law. It is so amazing that the words 'love' and 'law' sound and look similar – nearly... The law only indicates to the man, where and how many times he has made a mistake, sinned, swerved, etc. No such logic is guided by God.

Listen to me!

In every one of us dwells someone who wants to say constantly 'listen to me!' regardless of their position. It is unnecessary and makes many of us depressed and have low self-esteem. That is why Jesus constantly, at every opportunity, recalls: 'The Word of God was spoken — and in Himself fulfilled — Listen to Him!' The Word of God is the love that does not need the rules of any law. Love is the handmaid of all in order to mirror the pattern of Jesus who never lets even one word of the Father fall onto the ground. Even in the most difficult hour on the cross, the One who alone is the Incarnate Word of the Father, listened to the Father who said: 'Son! Say "Amen"! The Amen to Your passion, Your Cross, Your death...'.

Once Jesus was praised by an unknown woman in the crowd who said that the womb and the breasts of His mother were blessed; it did not distract Him from the main purpose of teaching about the Kingdom of God – that is obedience to the Word of God. What does the word say to me today? The same as always: Say 'Amen' to what happens to you!

If there had been any attempt to comment on this recommendation, it would have proved the attempt to create another law - in order to control the will of God in relation to me: in practical terms that would be 'Yes-but' built on a sentence. This is a real withdrawal towards the mentality of the sinful and weak man, and not a free man in love who chooses God as the Expert of all.

Old Willingham

Last month we showed the Willingham water tower. This prompted the following letter from Malcolm Sargeant.

'The tower was there when we bought a 'Tower Cottage' in 1967. It belonged to the Cambridge Water Company and was sited on a quarter acre of land which made up part of our rear garden for which we paid an annual rent of 3s 9d (value about £5 today).

It was a well-made structure with walls in excess of 2 feet thick at the base. Inside the tower were concrete mounts on which the pump once stood. The water was pumped to the tower from Black Pit Well. There were two concrete floors each accessible by steel wall-mounted ladders. On the top floor was a door which had a small balcony and, with the door open, you could see over to Rampton. On the inside of the door and the surrounding walls were scribblings including the names of locals who had served in the Willingham Home Guard. Presumably, the tower was used as a look-out post.

We think the tower was demolished between 1970-72 and was taken down by a farmer from Bluntisham who built a bungalow with the bricks. He was there every morning, very early, no matter what the weather and removed the bricks using hand tools and bottle jacks.

However, removing the tank was a real problem but with the aid of a wire rope around the tank and attached to a tractor, it was toppled. The cast iron tank was about 3/8 of an inch thick (10 mm) and on impact with the ground, shattered far and wide. It was thankfully all cleared up.

When we moved from the cottage, the only sign of the tower was its concrete base.'

New Vaccinations – **Meningitis B** was added to the routine baby immunisation schedule from 1 September. Babies born on or after 1 July 2015 will receive the new vaccination at 2 months, 4 months and 12/13 months old. Meningitis B is the most common cause of bacterial meningitis in children. **Meningitis C** has become a rare disease since the start of routine immunisation against it in 1999. Babies born between 1 May and 30 June 2015 will be offered a catch-up vaccination when they attend for their second and third immunisation visit.

There has also been an increase in the incidence of Meningitis W and Public Health England has instigated a vaccination programme to protect adolescents. The current vaccination given in school against Meningitis C will now be replaced by the Meningitis ACWY. Those who left school this year (born between 1 September 1996 and 31 August 1997), can receive this vaccination in surgery. It is strongly recommended that those in the above age group make an appointment to receive this vaccination. Flu Season approaches yet again - The usual Flu Clinic will be in place and advertised in the surgery. Please remember to book your appointment. The Flu vaccination is recommended and is free under the NHS to all those aged 65 years and over, pregnant women, and to those of any age with a long-term medical condition, for example diabetes, heart disease, kidney or liver disease, asthma or any breathing disorder. Please enquire if you are unsure whether you qualify. Carers (in receipt of Carers' Allowance) are also eligible.

Private flu vaccinations are available at a cost of $\pounds 10$ for anyone not eligible for free NHS flu vaccination. Please ask in pharmacy.

Flu vaccines for children The campaign to reduce flu in the community by vaccinating healthy children continues this winter. Children born between 1 September 2010 and 31 August 2013 inclusive can receive a flu vaccination, given in the form of a nasal spray (not an injection). These should be available in early October. Please contact the surgery to make an appointment.

The **Shingles Vaccination** Rolling Programme is also continuing this autumn. There are strict eligibility criteria and the vaccines are available free this year only to the following groups –

a) Patients born between 2 September 1942 and 1 September 1945 and

A Visit to Vastra Hamnen – An outstanding example of a redeveloped industrial area in southern Sweden

In August, I visited Vastra Hamnen (Western Harbour in English). This is a former, heavy industrial area north of Malmö. It was originally landfill, dockyard and car factory. At its peak over 6,000 people worked there.

When the industries closed, the site became the European Housing Expo, called Bo01, attracting a lot of international publicity. It now has the largest concentration of lowenergy housing in Sweden. The majority of flats have waste grinders, installed initially to produce compost, but now to produce biogas – all Malmö's bus services are gas powered.

A pioneering car-sharing scheme was set up, reducing car journeys. Convenient multi-storey parking garages reduce car street parking. Most homes are zero carbon, because of photovoltaic cells, solar panels, wind turbines and state of the art internal ventilation systems as well as having IT systems that monitor and control their energy usage.

Very low energy bills mean fuel poverty is eliminated, reducing rent arrears and evictions! The whole development is driven to be economically, environmentally and socially sustainable. Buses run every 2 minutes into central Malmö. Cycling and walking are the main means of getting around Western Harbour.

The maxim here is reuse, re-purpose or recycle achieved by a refuse disposal system using a series of pipes that suck the refuse away to a peripheral site for sorting and treatment. More people work there now than in the 1960s.

Parking at the School

The issue of unsafe parking at the school was raised again at a police meeting on road safety matters. The police response was not helpful as because of the recent cuts they simply do not have the resources to deal with the problem – unless there is a serious accident which, the Parish Council believe, is too late. One option was we pay the overtime costs for a PCSO to patrol. As there seems little else we can do, the Parish Council is minded to do that but with current tight budget restraints if it goes ahead, it would do so on a very limited basis.

Speed Limit Extension

The debate on the extension of the thirty-mile an hour limit on Station Road continues. The Parish Council would like it to go as far as the village boundary, in line with the other boundaries to the north, east and west. County Highways wants it to go just past the double bend and the police are reluctant to agree to speed limits that motorists are likely to ignore. Perhaps the Parish Council is losing the plot; it rather assumed that the police should enforce speed limits and not drivers.

Energy Switch

For the fifth time, the Cambridgeshire Energy Switch this autumn gives you the chance to save money on your energy bills. It uses the collective bargaining power of residents to bid for better gas and electricity prices. Unlike 'comparison websites', it is totally independent with no vested interests. It is open to all Cambridgeshire residents, including those on either credit or pre-payment meters. Registration will be open until midnight on Monday, 12 October. Registration is free and without obligation. Following registration, energy suppliers will be given the opportunity to compete for business and provide their best tariffs for electricity and/or gas, for the collective group of residents registered with the Scheme.

To register, residents will need to know their current energy supplier, their current tariff found on their bill and their household's annual gas and/or electricity usage. Registering does not commit households to switching supplier; residents can choose not to switch once they have received their offer. Those who have previously registered, may renew their registration and participate if their contract is now complete.


