# A Day at the Museums

On Friday 23 October, a group from several of our WIs met in Downing Street, Cambridge for their Day at the Museums.

We began with the Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology. On the ground floor are objects which illuminate Cambridgeshire life through the ages and upstairs are collections donated by eminent travellers and academics.

Our excellent guide was informative and amusing, running through a history of Cambridge highlighting the Iron Age, Roman period and Medieval times. One of the most interesting things she showed us was a 3D display case with a modern map on the front glass and a Roman map at the back. The super-imposition showed us that Hills Road to Castle Hill follows the original Roman road. The objects inside the case are placed corresponding to the place they were found on the map, with the oldest at the back working forward to the most recent at the front. Another highlight was a find from Arbury, a stone lead-lined coffin containing the skeleton of a rich Roman lady with the tiny bones of a mouse and a shrew buried with her!

Afterwards we were free to explore the collections of beautiful objects from places such as Fiji, the Solomon Islands, Japan, India, South America and Papua New Guinea. The upstairs room is dominated by a 14 metre high totem pole from Canada.

After a break for lunch we re-convened at the Whipple Museum of the History of Science to see such wonders as Dr Arzoux's papier maché anatomical models which are so detailed they were used for study by medical students. He also made models for veterinarians including a set of about 20 pairs of horses' teeth showing the various ages and demonstrating methods of doctoring to make them look younger. Herschel's telescope, with its polished metal mirror, is part of the astronomical exhibition and there is a whole room full of globes, both earthly and astronomical, for study and for fun. Early moon globes are one-sided as, before the moon missions, the dark side of the moon remained a mystery. A fragment from an Ancient Greek globe is the earliest example.

At the end of the day we were left amazed and impressed by these hidden gems; we are determined to make a return visit.

#### Hanson Trucks

Hanson Aggregates operate 1,200 liveried trucks, principally operated by self-employed owner drivers. Concerns have been raised about these trucks using the B1050 to access the A14. If you notice this happening, are concerned and wish to complain please note the following:

- the registration number
- the road the truck is on
- the time.

#### Willingham's Recent Power Cuts

The Parish Council has been questioning UK Power about the recent power cuts in the village. The Council asked:

Willingham appears to have a very high number of power cuts. How does it compare with other large, semi-rural villages in Cambridgeshire?

UK Power accepts that recently there have been an above average number of cuts affecting Willingham. Their records show that there have been three permanent faults in Willingham this year. This is being addressed through a tree cutting programme. Some of the tree cutting in the area has recently been completed which will, hopefully, improve the reliability of the supply. There have also been short faults in the current caused by wind born debris.

We have been told that Willingham has two 11KV feeds into a ring main. If this is the case then why does the second feed not provide continuation of supply when the other fails?

Supply faults are not switched back on automatically because of public safety concerns. UK Power is considering fitting switching gear that can be operated remotely from its control centre. This would enable UK Power to isolate sections of faulty network without the need for manual switching, thus speeding up the restoration of supply.

#### Wings for Life World Run

*Wings for Life* will be holding a world run on **Sunday 8 May**. *Wings for Life* is a charity focused on research into spinal cord injury. Details can be found at **www.wingsforlifeworldrun.com**. The organisers of the run will be implementing rolling road closures and two public meetings are planned to answer questions. These will be held on **18 January**, 6 30 pm at Earith Village Hall and **26 January**, 6 30 pm at Cottenham Village Hall.

#### **Community Transport Schemes**

Cambridgeshire County Council have issued a document, listing all available forms of community transport for those parishioners who have difficulty using or accessing public transport. This might be because of mobility issues or for medical or social journey purposes. Details can be found on www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/communitytransport or alternatively from the Parish Council office.

#### Faster Internet Access

New fibre broadband cabinets have been installed and are now active in the area. Information about this and a map showing current coverage can be seen on the 'my area' pages of the Connecting Cambridgeshire website at www.connectingcambridgshire.co.uk.

#### **Restorative Justice**

Restorative Justice aims to give the victims of crime the chance to meet their offender in a controlled situation to discuss the harm caused by the crime and to find ways to repair that harm. Cambridge Constabulary has appointed Lyndsey Brown as Restorative Justice Coordinator. She is available to talk to local groups about Restorative Justice and how victims can access this service.

#### Cambridgeshire ACRE – Social Housing Survey

Cambridgeshire ACRE has distributed a letter asking parishioners to complete a survey regarding social housing. The letter incorrectly states that the Council have instructed them to complete the survey. Whilst the Council, when approached, confirmed to Cambridgeshire ACRE that they were happy for the survey to take place, please note that it was not undertaken at our request.

# PASTORAL LETTER

Special advent windows appeared all over the village and we enjoyed going around looking at them and trying to guess which Christmas Carol they depicted. Visiting each house I am amazed at the creative and artistic talents on display. I hope you enjoyed the challenge and excitement of seeing them. You can still see them on our website (willinghambaptist.org).

Four things strike me about our advent adventure. Firstly, where this creativity came from: for we are made in the image of God and as he is the creator we inherit this trait and have creativity in our DNA. So we should let our imaginations loose and go into the new year knowing that there is something exciting even in our day to day lives. It is easy to get trapped in routine and the desire just to get the work done, why not find new ways to express yourself and release that creativity you have been given?

The second thing is that it was wonderful seeing families together having fun going to each window, enjoying the excitement of working out the carol and also spotting the hidden bell. Many people think that following Jesus is all about being solemn and living a boring life - which is absolutely not the way it is. Jesus said 'I came to give life—life in all its fullness' and so wants us to experience the full abundance of life. We can live with a smile on our face, with laughter in our heart and really enjoy all the good things that God has given us.

Thirdly, some of the windows were really hard to work out. I wanted an answer sheet so I didn't have to think. But I had to think hard and have the satisfaction of working out the answer for myself (a hint with one or two). We can be lazy with our brains but we are told by Jesus to 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'. Yes, with all your mind for it honours God as we use our brains. So as we go through this year find a good challenging book to read, may I suggest the bible? And consider what it says, ask questions of it, exercise your thought processes for you will grow from doing so.

My final thought is that each of the windows was a response to something that happened in Bethlehem over 2000 years ago. The consequences of almighty God becoming a man, living amongst us and then willingly giving himself in sacrifice to pay for our mistakes are world changing. And he gives each of us a chance to respond to this too. Jesus said 'Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.' Right now is a good time to turn to him and respond. This doesn't restrict us but releases us to be the people God designed us to be.

# CHOCOLATE BREAD AND BUTTER PUDDING

Serves 6

9 slices of bread – crusts removed, each slice cut into 4 triangles

150g dark chocolate (75% cocoa solids)

75g butter

425 ml whipping cream

4 tablespoons dark rum (optional)

110g caster sugar

Pinch of cinnamon

3 large eggs

Shallow oven proof dish, 7 x 9 inches, 2 inches deep, lightly buttered

- Put chocolate, whipping cream, rum, sugar, butter and cinnamon in a bowl over a saucepan of simmering water to completely dissolve. Stir well.
- In a separate bowl, whisk eggs, pour chocolate mixture in and whisk again to blend together.
- Spoon a ½ inch layer of mixture into base of dish, arrange half the bread triangles over the mixture in overlapping rows. Pour half the remaining mixture over the bread then arrange the rest of the triangles over that, finishing with a layer of mixture. Press bread down gently with a fork.
- Cover dish with clingfilm and stand at room temp for 2 hours. Put in fridge for at least one day, preferably two.
- Cook for 30-35 mins at 180 C (gas mark 4, 350 F). Leave to stand for 10 minutes. Can be eaten hot or cold.

# **Tribute to Linda Liversidge**

Early this year the Reverend Linda Liversidge retires from her role as Vicar and Priest-in-Charge at St Mary and All Saints, the parish church to which she came in January 2011. Her last service will be on 17 January. For the ten years before moving to Willingham she was team Vicar of Pilsley and Handley, in Derbyshire.

The Willingham role was technically part –time, but one would never have known that; Linda has worked extremely hard.

One of her great strengths has been drawing in and encouraging younger people. The music group which plays at the main Sunday services is an excellent example of this. Another example is the work that she did, in collaboration with the Baptist Church, in setting up the village Youth Centre, which was opened in March last year. She has played a key role in the Willingham Youth Trust.

Linda's approach to priesthood is essentially informal; she has not, for example, liked wearing vestments. She has always been conscious, however, of the need, in a village, to serve a wide variety of people and as part of this has run the 9 am Communion services of a more formal kind than the main 10 30 am services and for these 9 am services she has worn formal vestments.
