We also spent time discussing the Annual Resolution Vote and made decisions to be taken forward to the National WI Annual Meeting.

Willingham Bowls Club (Established 1937)

Rumours have been circulating that Willingham Bowls Club no longer exists but we can assure everyone in the village that the Bowls Club is still going.

As the Bowls Green at Willingham is currently unplayable, we are sharing the Bowls Green of our neighbours at Longstanton and, thanks to their generosity, our Bowls Club has been able to continue.

It is true that the Club is going through a difficult period. Our Green is unusable due to lack of maintenance and poor drainage which have been major problems over the last two years. As the Club's membership is relatively small, we rely on volunteers to cut and maintain the grass three times a week; unfortunately not everyone is able to help. An artificial surface would be one answer and, as we cannot get the volunteers to cut the grass, it would be easy to maintain.

Bowls is a game for all ages and abilities. Once a member, you can play in League matches, Club roll-ups or even just go with a friend or two and have a roll up. The only requirements are that you are a member and wear flat soled shoes. Only League matches require grey trousers and white shirts; rollups are very casual and enjoyable. We are currently playing in two Leagues, the Ely and District Afternoon League and Cambridge Business Houses Evening League.

It is not expensive to join. This year it is £10 for Willingham membership and, for this year only, £10 for Longstanton membership. This is a small amount to pay for the exercise and social rewards.

It would be a shame if Willingham lost its Bowls Green because of a shortage of members. We do need the support of the village to help retain it.

Councillor Manning

Councillor Ray Manning has stood down from his role as Leader of South Cambridgeshire District Council to let 'fresh blood take over the reins'. The Parish Council would like to thank Councillor Manning for all his hard work and commitment during his 9 years as Leader. After his victory in the recent local elections, he remains a District Councillor for Willingham and Over, and continues to extend his 25 years of service on the Parish Council.

He is replaced as District Council leader by Councillor Peter Topping who represents the Whittlesford Ward and can be followed on Twitter @petertopping.

ACRE Housing Needs Survey

You may recall a Housing Needs survey which was distributed to all houses in the village late last year by Cambridgeshire ACRE (the rural community council for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough). Mark Deas attended the June Parish Council Meeting to talk about the results:

305 forms were returned, a 17% return rate – slightly lower than the average of 20-25% but not unexpected for larger villages.

The report found that entry level prices in Willingham were $\pounds150,000$ for 2-bed flats, $\pounds180,000$ for 2-bed houses and $\pounds210,000$ for 3-bed houses. At an entry level price of $\pounds180,000$ an annual income of over $\pounds43,000$ would be required.

To put this in context, a household with two people working fulltime and earning the 'national living wage' will earn about £30,000 per annum. They concluded that there are 82 households identified as being in need of affordable housing who either live in, or have a local connection to, Willingham.

Cambridgeshire Shared Lives for Older People

Shared Lives for Older People provides overnight respite short breaks within a carer's own home rather than traditional residential settings like care homes. A careful matching process looks in a holistic way at carers' strengths, knowledge and personalities, matching these to the needs of the older person. This ensures firstly, that the older person is comfortable and given choice about who provides their respite care, and secondly, that the carer feels able to fully support the person who will be staying with them.

WEEE Collection

Although there will be no financial return for the WISER recycling of Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment this year, the Parish Council still considers that this is a useful service and has given permission for another collection. This will take place on **Thursday 7 July**. See page 15.

Are you putting your items in the right recycling bin?

Residents are being asked to put the right things in the green bins after plastic and biobags, clothes, garden pots and even toasters have been found. Biobags do not break down fully in the fast composting process and should not be used. Last year it cost the County Council $\pounds220,000$ because people put the wrong things in this bin.

Wrap your food in newspaper, put it in paper caddy liners or place it loose in the bin. In just 8 weeks the food and garden waste is turned into compost that can be used on gardens or by local farmers. To see how, watch a 3 minute video at www.recap.co.uk.

Disability Huntingdonshire (DISH)

DISH gives welfare benefits advice and provides advocacy and information to children and adults with disabilities. They are a support service providing home visits for the housebound, office based interviews and a telephone hotline to assist families and individuals to obtain the resources that can lift them out of poverty and enable them to live independently. They are particularly helpful with applications for Attendance Allowance, Personal Independence Payments and Disability Living Allowance.

Willingham Action Group (WAG) News The Parish Plan and Willingham Action Group

In last month's edition I wrote about the production of the Willingham Parish Plan. This piece should be called 'What happened next?'

Willingham Parish Council adopted the Plan but it had already become clear to some non-Council individuals on the Plan Committee that many of the recommendations such as 'more social activities' fell outside the remit of the Council. These individuals decided we needed a separate body to help carry out some parts of the Plan and so Willingham Action Group was formed.

We agreed to divide WAG into three sections to deal with social (WAGS), youth (WAGY) and Council matters (WAGC).

WAGS should give special thanks to Bill Kirkman who wrote the first and most excellent chapter of the plan on the history of Willingham and included details of the Feast. We thought we could try to add to the Feast to enhance the social life of the village. Last year there were 21 separate Feast events catering for all ages. The chapter also contained details about pilgrimages along the causeway to Ely Cathedral, so for three years we had a Feast walk to Ely where we received a blessing in the Cathedral – and then went to a pub! We didn't take a gift of eels for the Bishop as had been the custom and sadly we stopped that walk when it started taking too much of a toll on our legs! In addition to a walking group, we were also able to start a cycling club and a running club and, over the years, and with help from others, a wine-tasting group and photography group.

WAGY sought to provide a permanent youth club in the village. At that time we only had the Connections Bus here once a week funded by the Parish Council. The Reverend Trevor Rowe, the Chair of WAGY, managed to set up a club in the Baptist Hall. We give thanks for the use of the hall and Rev Trev and others who helped in the running of the club and the Parish Council for the funding.

Before long we realised that WAGY would be better off as a separate body from WAG with charitable status. This would enable it to attract funding which WAG may not have had access to so WAGY became Willingham Youth Trust. WYT is now a vibrant group and with great help and funding from the Parish Council we have a new and permanent youth club in the Ploughman Hall. It has the potential to expand and in the future WYT is planning to open up the kitchen area to provide café facilities for those using the Recreation Ground during the summer months.

WAGC has probably been the least active part of WAG. We reintroduced Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) in the village. Willingham has a relatively low crime rate with practically no serious crime but does suffer from anti-social behaviour and vandalism and occasional burglary. We did channel most of our energy into various aspects of traffic and transport such as improvements to the B1050 and traffic calming and parking around the school but with very little immediate effect on traffic issues. We also operated a Speedwatch Group for a while but found it difficult to find volunteers. However, we have developed our links with the Parish Council and will support them with these issues when we can.

We have also set up and developed a village website. This has access to the Parish Plan, a directory of businesses in the village, events and news sections and a photo section. It has aged somewhat and creaks a lot but is still operational so we are looking at setting up a new site but need volunteers with internet skills.

Willingham Feast Preview

At the time of going to print, WAG is still trying to raise enough money for phase 2 of the play park facilities for older children, at the QEII field down West Fen Road (just behind the Ploughman Hall). Other less ambitious projects include a sponsored Christmas tree and lights on the Green. Generally, our aim in putting on the Feast is to cover printing and advertising costs, raise Willingham's profile and provide the villagers with the kind of social occasion they asked for in the Parish Plan all those years ago.

Forenames in Willingham in Shakespeare's Time

Part 1: Boys' Names (Top three – John, Henry and William)

If William Shakespeare (born 1564), had lived in Willingham as a boy he would have had 21 other Williams among his contemporaries.

The Willingham Parish Registers were first kept in 1559, five years before Shakespeare's birth and I've looked at the first eleven years of the baptisms. I was surprised to discover how small the pool of acceptable names was at the time. Over this period only 18 names were used in the village for the 138 boys who were baptised.

There seem to have been two types of name, religious or secular. The Church was still a huge influence, and the most popular name recorded in Willingham between 1559 and 1570 was John, which was given to 39 boys. Other saints' names and biblical names included Thomas (17 instances) Christopher (4), Matthew (3), Francis (3). Gregory and Mark each appear once. From the Old Testament the name Abram was used twice.

Christopher was reasonably popular at the time as many parish churches, like Willingham, had paintings of the saint on their walls. Matthew was less so, and it's likely that the use of it in Willingham was because at that time the church was dedicated to St Matthew. Francis was much more common on the continent than in England, and in fact two of the three boys of that name were born to the same father – it's to be assumed that the first one had died young. Gregory was apparently quite frequently used at the time, but there is only one instance of it here. The name of the Gospel writer Mark was very little used anywhere in England before the 1950s and 1960s when it became extremely popular. Several of the more secular names had come to the country with the Norman invasion. Of these, William occurs 21 times in the register. Henry, the second most popular name after John with 24 entries, had maintained a steady presence since the Conquest, helped by the fact that there had been eight kings of that name. Richard, another kingly name with eight entries, narrowly beats Robert which occurs six times. The sole Rafe's name was originally Norse but also popularised by the Normans.

It looks as if the custom of names running in families was already established. The two Alexanders had different fathers but each had the surname Bowle. The three Lancelots were all called Angood and two were probably both sons of the same man.

There's also one Toby (not used much until the following century in spite of the well-known Shakespearean character, Sir Toby Belch). The sole Arthur was not directly a result of the Arthurian legend, but derived from a Latin name.

However, the most incongruous name in the register is Ferdinando. This name imported from Italy appeared suddenly in English records around 1560 and was used mainly in landed families in the Midlands for about another 150 years. I don't know how it ever reached Willingham, and wonder if the poor boy was teased by the numerous Johns and Henrys among whom he grew up!
