Old Willingham

Nowadays the village pump on the Green is a bit of a novelty and something for the kids to climb on. But in past years it was a very important part of village life. This month we see a photo of the pump in the early 1900s. We don't know why this was taken or who the man is, although he is smartly dressed and likely to be someone respectable. The pump is quite similar today but the whole area then was a sea of mud due to the constant traffic of people and carts coming to get water. Piped water did not start to arrive until the tower was built on Station Road in 1912 and it was decades before everyone had piped water to their homes.

QE11Field

Many residents of Willingham over the past few weeks will have visited the QE11 field and enjoyed the new equipment and picnic tables. Willingham – A Great Place to Live

The last three editions of *Willingham News* have carried articles by Mike Tidball, the secretary of Willingham Action Group (WAG), outlining the development of the Parish Plan and the subsequent formation of WAG, to help deliver the outcomes of the Parish Plan. My memory of that initial development phase was the great eagerness of residents to come forward not only to develop the plan but also to start clubs and societies to develop their own hobbies and crafts and to share that knowledge with others. These new societies, together with the better established groups such as the Gardening Club and the various sports clubs, have helped make Willingham a great place to live. We must also remember *Willingham News*, our award winning village magazine, which you all consider to be an essential part of the village framework.

The common factor amongst all these clubs, societies etc is the need for a constant supply of volunteers to help run them. For instance *Willingham News* has a permanent team of 40 volunteers to publish, print and deliver some 1800 copies of the magazine to every house and business in the village, in addition to occasional contributors. Without those volunteers it would be a less vibrant village. As Mike points out, many of these facilities are run by a handful of volunteers whose average age gets larger by the day. Unless we can secure additional volunteers then we will lose much of which we hold dear in our village.

If you are a member of an existing club then help to run it to ensure it continues to run; volunteer to help WAG continue the outcomes of the Parish Plan; *Willingham News* is always looking for distributors.

Willingham is a great place to live, together we can make it even better.

PASTORAL LETTER

"But it shall not be this way among you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be the slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many". (Mathew 10: 43-45)

Strange direction

Jesus openly makes the position in Heaven dependent on our will. What we would like to experience in the Kingdom of Heaven is our decision. When somebody asks you what you would like to do, to say, to get, the decision must always come from you. A variety of requests and demands does not change the freedom to choose. So precious then are the temptations and tribulations, because they are always the opportunity to say 'yes' or 'no' out of our free will. When Jesus' disciples James and John asked for the favour of sitting at the right and left side of the Lord in His Kingdom, Jesus replied that it was not His task to give those places to them; those places were designated at the moment of the conception of the chosen person for that position. It is not our business to know who those places belong to. But when the question of the splendor and glory of each of us is at stake, we enjoy the full responsibility given by the providence of God. 'If you wish' says Jesus. 'Who doesn't?' would be the answer of many of us. If that depends on me and you, why we do not challenge that thing; I want it, I desire it, I long for it, I expect it, and so on. Let us look at that attitude more closely.

The servant

The servant is somebody who chooses the master. Preferences are applied, and the person finds the fitting conditions and environment for self-development and building the history of life with a maximum dose of sense. Religious life, marriage and political career follow some rules which are a sort of 'service' towards others under specific conditions. But those conditions are fully accepted and followed. If somebody rebels against them, it means that person is not a servant but a kind of master overruling the procedures applied to the proper style of life. The more you follow the rules – from your own choice and responsibility – the more you are perfecting your being the servant: free and happy, because nobody ORDERS you to do anything. It is you who decides what rules you follow and fulfil. ONLY you! Great is the one who understands this.

The slave

The slave is somebody who OBEYS everybody in his or her way, allowing other people to organise a proper life according to their wishes, not mine. It is a very high style of life. Jesus Christ showed that direction, allowing the people of Judea and Jerusalem to reject Him by betrayal and false accusations, to punish Him by scourging at the pillar and to kill Him by crucifixion. He did NOT resist it. He accepted it and even said NO word of defense. And they (we) did with Him whatever they (we) wanted. O, really? Whatever they wanted or rather whatever He PERMITTED them to do! The true freedom is to choose other's actions as the accepted actions towards oneself. It is ME who decides what they want to do to me, not them. My permission is the act of pure freedom and trust that God - who I believe knows all the circumstances and conditions of my life - will never allow something beyond my strength happen to me. His providence has one target to lead me through the tribulations and dangers of life towards full victory over suffering, pain, tears and death itself as the follower of THE ONE who walked that way to the end (His death) and at the end was truly RISEN. Anyone who follows that way will live. And those little doses of pain, tears and dying will never be too big for a believer.

Who, then, is the greatest?

That is the very important question. Until Jesus Christ comes again, it is not yet revealed who is the greatest. Take your chance. Be a servant - for the beginning, for warming up. And be a slave of your own choice later on until the end. Saint Francis di Assisi, Saint Thomas Aquinas, Saint Rita and all the others we know may not be as high in splendour and greatness in the Kingdom of Heaven as you might be.
