Our Day Out

WI Trip to Wells-Next-the-Sea and Two Inspiring Women

Last October Willingham WI hosted the Group Meeting where the five local branches enjoy a social evening together with food and a speaker. We were privileged to welcome an inspirational and entertaining author, Christine Adams, who regaled us with amazing anecdotes about her Aunt-in-Law, 'Aunty May', who was the subject of her book *Miss Savidge Moves Her House*.

We heard about this indomitable and independent lady who, confronted with the demolition of her beloved mediaeval Hall-House in Ware, Hertfordshire, decided to move it, literally and pretty much single-handedly, to Wells-next-the-Sea in Norfolk.

We were so intrigued by Christine and her stories that, on 9 August, forty four of us travelled to Wells to see the house for ourselves. We left Willingham on a perfect sunny day and, while one half of the group toured the house, the rest were able to partake of the joys of the English seaside: going to the beach on the little train, admiring the boats in the harbour, pottering in the shops and cafes and eating fish and chips, Cromer crab salad and ice cream!

The tour of beautiful Ware Hall-House more than lived up to our expectations. We were able to see film of the Antiques Roadshow, which brought the story to public notice, old Look East programmes that featured Miss Savidge in person and, best of all, hear more stories from Christine about her aunt's life and the house she so lovingly restored. We could see the numbers on the beams above our heads that she had meticulously logged and catalogued before taking the house apart and transporting them to Norfolk, to spend the rest of her life reconstructing it on site. We heard how she lived in a caravan in the overgrown garden for more than 10 years and, when she was finally

able to move in, lived in one room, sleeping in a chair as there were still no floors or rooms upstairs.

Miss Savidge was a hoarder and every detail of her life had been kept and stored, from old bus tickets and labels from tins, to receipts and shopping lists. When Christine and her family visited, they had to edge around boxes and trunks piled high, the contents all carefully filed, some within pages of every Radio Times magazine Miss Savidge had ever bought. Her old motorbike was covered with brambles in the garden, alongside piano accordians, mangles, scaffolding poles and even nine sidesaddles - '...in various stages of decay. How on earth would Aunty May have come by 9 side saddles? She had, as far as I knew, never ridden a horse...'.

When Miss Savidge died in 1993 the house was unfinished and barely habitable. The story of how Christine took on the challenge of completing the work and preserving this ancient gem, learning to plaster walls and funding the project by selling otherwise useless artefacts and objects to museums and collectors such as the BBC museum and Marks and Spencers, was a story in itself.

We returned to Willingham full of admiration for a strong woman with a vision and her equally passionate and committed niece-in-law who rose to the challenge.

A wonderful day out!

Beyond Belief

It is with great sadness that we have to report on an incident in the Under 5's playground, when somebody decided to use the toy train as a toilet. It came to light when a distressed childminder brought a toddler to the Parish Office covered in human excrement. We cannot emphasise too strongly our abhorrence. To deliberately foul an area used by small children with dangerous human waste seems an act of unspeakable disgust.

It may of course not have been the act of someone from within the village, but it probably was, and may have been one of the youths that often meet on the QE2 field later on in the evenings. It may have been fuelled by alcohol or drugs but, whatever the causes, there can be no excuse. It may be that your child was involved or your grandchild or a neighbour's child or a friend. If you have any information, please tell us.

Also, if you are using the play area, please be vigilant. If you see anything untoward, report it to us immediately.

QEII Phase 2

Despite the abuse of the Phase 1 play equipment, the Phase 2 scheme for older children has been given the go-ahead, subject to some minor revision on costs. The bulk of the funds will come from 'Section 106' money provided by developers of new housing. Let us hope that this stage of the large improvement project will be treated with more respect and can be enjoyed by all.

Christmas Lights

The go-ahead has been given for a tree and new LED lights for the Green. The plan is to have a six-metre tree decorated with two thousand small white lights as well as some small coloured lights between the existing trees around the perimeter. LED lights give significant savings on energy and reduce the carbon footprint.

Power Network

There is a new phone number to report damage to power supply equipment and to get information about power cuts. By dialling 105, you will be automatically put through to the local network operator which manages the cables and substations that bring electricity into your home. It does not matter who your electricity supplier is, the calls are free from land lines and mobile phones.

Electoral Review

The final recommendations have now been made regarding the Electoral Review of Cambridgeshire. The proposal is that the parishes of Cottenham, Rampton and Willingham will form a new division represented by a single councillor. If the recommendation is approved by Parliament, it will come into force in 2017.

On a separate matter, it has also been agreed that the existing parish boundary between Willingham and Over will be reviewed. Willingham Parish Council supports a petition from residents that the existing boundary should be moved westward to include the Highgate Farm complex and surrounding properties. Over Parish Council opposes the change. The review will take place within the next twelve months.

Councillor Vacancy

One application has been received for the current vacancy and interest has been received from other potential applicants. A decision on co-option will be made at this month's meeting.

Meeting dates are published on the website, on the notice board outside the Public Hall in the High Street, at the library and are listed below. Members of the public are welcome to attend and speak briefly or ask questions. Names will be taken down at the beginning of each meeting to ensure everyone has a fair chance to speak within the allowed time (15 minutes in total for all speakers with a 3 minute maximum per person).

Meeting Dates: 5 October, 2 November.

The meetings are held in the Octagon and start at 7 30 pm. The Parish Council Office is open Monday to Thursday from 10 am to 1 pm, except Bank Holidays and there is an answer-phone service outside office hours.

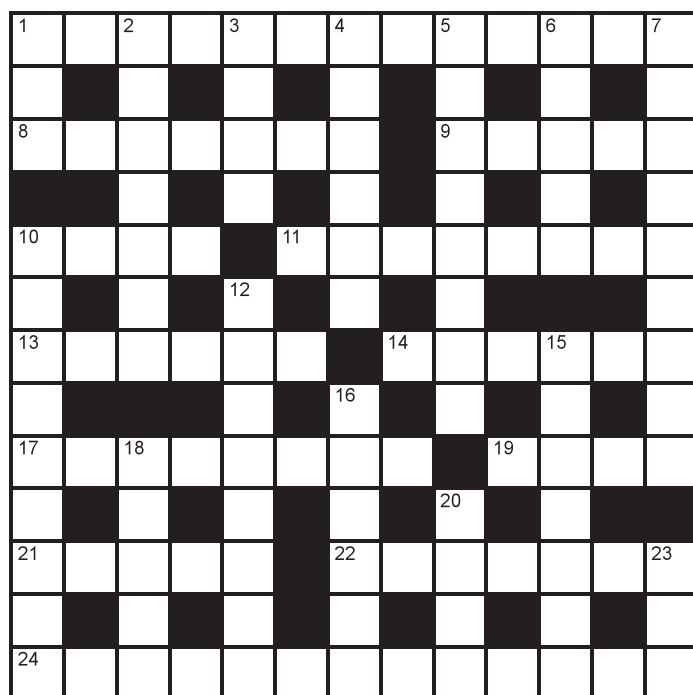

Off to University or College? There is an outbreak of **Meningitis W** at present. Public Health England is urging young people starting university or college to have a vaccination to protect them against four strains of meningitis – **Meningitis ACWY**. If you have not had this vaccination, please contact the surgery for advice.

Flu Vaccinations – We should by now have received our flu vaccinations. Please call and book your appointment. The vaccination is recommended (and free!) to all patients over the age of 65, pregnant women and those patients who have a long term medical condition regardless of age. If you are unsure, please ask us.

Private flu vaccinations are available at a cost of £10 for those who are not eligible for free NHS flu vaccination. Please ask in the Pharmacy.

Flu Vaccines for Healthy Children – The campaign to reduce flu in the community by vaccinating healthy children continues. This winter, healthy children born between **1 September 2011 and 31 August 2014** are eligible to receive a nasal flu vaccination. Please contact the surgery to make an appointment.

Shingles Vaccination – The following groups of patients are now eligible to have a shingles vaccination:

1. Patients born between **2 September 1942** and **1 September 1946**.
2. Patients born between **2 September 1936** and **1 September 1938**.

If you fall into one of the above age groups, please contact the surgery to make an appointment. This is a one-off vaccination and does NOT need to be repeated.

Patient Surveys Both the practice and the Pharmacy are required to conduct a patient survey on an annual basis. You may be asked to complete a questionnaire when you attend the surgery and we would like to thank you in advance for your co-operation. We are always happy to receive your feedback on the website, in our patient comments boxes, or by email to willinghammedicalpractice@nhs.net This will help us review and improve our service.

Cambridgeshire County Council Public Consultation on Proposals for Housing at Belsar Farm

On 17 August, the Library hosted a Public Consultation event regarding the County Council's proposals for 25 homes at Belsar Farm, Meadow Road, Willingham.

Up to 10 of these homes are expected to be available for those with a local Willingham connection who need affordable housing. There are currently 60 people in need of such housing, so it was interesting to seek local views on our proposals at the consultation event.

Historically, the County Council has assisted in providing over 100 plots of land for affordable housing on what are known as 'exceptions sites' in South Cambridgeshire. However, the County Council can no longer afford to do this, as it needs to raise income to support its services via the letting of houses it has built for market rent and affordable rent. Some of the units built may be available for market sale but the detailed make up of the mix has yet to be finalised and will be influenced by market conditions.

All comments received will be carefully considered before the scheme is submitted to the District Council, hopefully within the next three months. A further update will be provided in a future edition of *Willingham News*.

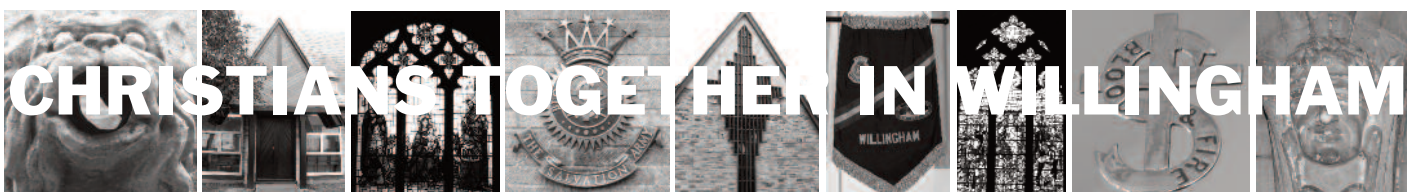

PASTORAL LETTER

One of the special times of the church year is the celebration of Harvest, a significant time for those who rely on the produce of the land. After the harvest has been safely brought in, it is good to celebrate the things God has done. It is a time to stop, to think and be thankful. The hard work has been done, the produce has been collected and the farmer can take a deep breath before the season of preparing the ground and planting starts again.

Knowing that however much we prepare the ground, however carefully we plant the seeds, we are still reliant on God for the right amount of rain at the right times, for enough, but not too much, sun when it is needed and for dry weather at the perfect time for the harvest. Harvest is an opportunity to take the time to recognise our dependence on God and how he blesses us for 'every good and perfect gift is from above' (James 1:17).

At the Baptist Church we celebrate Harvest by bringing some of the good things God has given us back to him as an offering. We have a time to celebrate God's goodness and generosity. Afterwards, the produce is taken to Jimmy's Night Shelter in Cambridge to help those that need it. Traditionally it would have been vegetables from people's gardens or bread made with freshly ground wheat from the fields but nowadays the produce comes in tins or boxes. This makes it more convenient to handle and store before it is used and it also reflects how we now obtain much of our food – from the supermarket.

Even living in a village surrounded with farms, many of us don't have a close connection to the land. This can mean that Harvest loses its significance and time is not taken to thank God; indeed, in our busy lives we can find that we forget God and tell ourselves that we don't need him. However, if we thank God, it changes our perspective on life; we recognise that we don't have total control and have a strong dependence on our creator. Let's be a thankful people who admit their reliance on God. It changes our relationship with God and it changes our hearts, for we become grateful people who respond to the love of our Father in Heaven and seek to be led by him.

This Harvest, make sure you take the opportunity at some point to stop and think about what God has done for you. You may want to pray words of thanks to him and for the year to come.

Taste and see that the Lord is good;

Blessed is the man who trusts in Him!

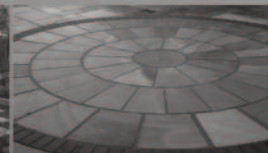

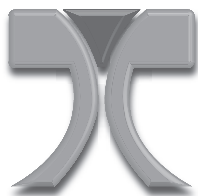
