STEVE LOCKWOOD

Willingham is very lucky to have a world renowned musician living in the village; even luckier to have had the opportunity this year to hear the musician perform on his own doorstep. Steve Lockwood, musician, composer, performer and harmonica teacher is regarded as a 'harmonica wizard'.



In 2000 after three years study, Steve graduated from Anglia Ruskin University (ARU) and was the first to be awarded a musical degree in harmonica. He had been inspired by the music of Stevie Wonder, Bob Dylan and Sonny Boy Williamson and said he wanted to pursue the instrument to its limits. He studied a range of styles from the classical work of Larry Adler to the role of the instrument in pop music.

Since then he has accomplished a great deal, performing in thousands of concerts and producing albums as an individual performer, a session musician and producer. He has been fortunate enough to play with Larry Adler, but has also been involved with diverse groups including Screaming Lord Sutch, the Royal Philharmonic and the Prague Philharmonic Orchestras. He recorded *Midnight Cowboy* with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra and his favourite venue is the Royal Albert Hall where he participated in the UK Blues Festival.

His dynamic and versatile playing incorporates all genres of music to an inspired level. An accomplished musician, Steve uses his talent to inspire others. He is an exceptional tutor and teaches on a one-to one basis via Skype to people throughout the world. Steve is endorsed by Lee Oskar Harmonicas from USA/Japan.

This year he has thrilled the local community by performing twice in Willingham. On 24 April, he played to two sell-out concerts at the Bank. Backed by Ed Graham on piano and Dave Lockwood on guitar, Steve delighted his audience with a full range of numbers; the best songs from both Bank shows, including standards such as *Summertime, Georgia on My Mind* and *Sumny*, were used to produce a wonderful CD entitled, *Live At The Bank*. Then during the recent Feast, he again undertook two performances at the Bank on Sunday 8 October. Steve has also taken part in the past in the Social Club monthly Jam sessions.

Willingham is indeed very lucky to have such a talented, and yet modest, performer within the community and we look forward in the future to having further opportunities locally to enjoy his great talent.

Few people remember the original shop in Burleigh Street which opened in 1914. However a Willingham resident, Betty Smith (now aged 95), could recall a visit as a young child and had shared her memories with Ellee. Later the shop moved and was on the corner of Market Street and Sidney Street (now Trailfinders). It closed in 1965 and was an upmarket ladies' fashion shop. Ellee has written a book about some of the women who worked in the shop and also covering the history of the Heyworth family who owned and ran the shop.

As well as the fashion shop, Heyworths opened a coffee shop in the 1950s/60s and was the most popular cafe in Cambridge, serving the first 'frothy coffee' in the city! An interesting and informative talk.

Cambridgeshire Energy Switch

Wholesale energy prices are likely to increase in the coming weeks. The County Council has joined with iChooser, a UK expert in collective energy switching, to identify and deliver competitive energy tariffs. Local residents are encouraged to register with the Cambridgeshire Energy Switch scheme (www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/cambsenergyswitch) to see if they can secure a good rate for the coming year. Tariffs are not available direct from the suppliers or via price comparison services.

The Centre School, Cottenham

The Centre School, Cottenham (www.thecentreschool.net) offers positive educational experiences for students with a wide variety of needs and backgrounds. The development of social skills through volunteering is an important part of its curriculum. Small groups of pupils from the school will be working in Willingham, under supervision, on a regular basis for a trial period. Initially they will be doing litter picking around the QE II Field.

Northstowe

Regular drivers through Northstowe will have been aware of the negative impacts of lorry traffic carrying earth down the Longstanton bypass for the construction of balancing ponds off Hattons Road, Longstanton. The Parish Council has been advised that this work is substantially completed and there could be a reduction in earth moving traffic around Northstowe. A mains water supply is now being laid alongside the Longstanton bypass. The Parish Council understands that the first development at Northstowe will have no social housing, although Northstowe's overall social housing target is 20%. Exploratory archaeological work has now started on the Northstowe Phase II site and volunteers are invited to take part in this.

Advocacy Services

Total Voice is a new advocacy service for adults, children and young people looked after or in need. It brings together advocates from three separate specialist services to offer free, independent and confidential support. Total Voice offers a dedicated telephone information line (0300 222 5704), peer support and group advocacy services and one-to-one advocacy. In addition to the telephone contact the service can be contacted by email (tvcp@voiceability.org) or online (www.totalvoicecp.org).

Cambridge Park and Ride Services

The Parish Council has been advised of changes to the Park and Ride services. These include changes to routes, service frequency and bus stops. Full details of the changes and the revised timetables are available online (Cambridge.enquiries@ stagecoachbus.com or www.stagecoachbus.com). Feedback on the changes should be provided to passenger.transport@cambridgeshire.gov.uk.

Winter Gritting

The County Council has advised the Parish Council that, if there is poor winter weather, it will be gritting the B1050 through the village and the road between Over and Rampton. We have asked that gritting should also include the Citi 5 bus route through Wilford Furlong and Church Street. The Parish Council has decided not to take part in a community pavement gritting scheme operated by the County Council. The scheme requires Parish Councils to recruit volunteers for this activity.

Christmas Tree and Lights

The Parish Council has invested in new strings of lighting for placement around the Green. These use more economic halogen bulbs. A Christmas tree will also be sited on the Green, which we hope the village will enjoy through December and into the New Year!

Meeting dates are published on the website, the notice board outside the public hall in the High Street, at the library and are listed below. Members of the public are welcome to attend and speak briefly or ask questions. Names will be taken down at the beginning of each meeting, together with the electoral register number to ensure everyone has a fair chance to speak within the allowed time (15 minutes in total for all speakers – 3 mins max per person).

Meeting Dates: 7 December, 4 January. The meetings are held in the Octagon and they start at 7 30 pm.

The parish council office is open Monday to Thursday from 10 am to 1 pm, except Bank Holidays and there is an answerphone service outside office hours.

LUCY FRAZER MP

It is a huge honour to represent the diverse area of South East Cambridgeshire in Parliament, and I was thrilled to be able to meet more of you at local events and meetings this year.

This has been a busy year locally and in Westminster, and I was delighted to meet the Willingham WI for a tour of the Houses of Parliament in May, and to visit the Primary School in September.



A bit about myself: after graduating from Newnham College in Cambridge I spent many years as a barrister specialising in business law. The skills I learnt as a barrister have been invaluable in Westminster - whether I am debating in Parliament, scrutinising legislation, or finding the right argument to persuade Ministers to fund various local infrastructure projects.

I am progressing a number of infrastructure projects across the constituency including the A10, the Ely bypass, and the A142. Significant progress has been made on the Ely bypass. Last month I had a meeting with the Rail Minister to press the case for a station in Soham and raised the importance of improving the A10 with the Chancellor. I am also campaigning to get better broadband and have regular meetings with BT and Connecting Cambridgeshire.

Together with my neighbouring MP Steve Barclay, Councillors and local residents I am working to ensure our local services are retained at the Princess of Wales Hospital, and I was pleased to have the opportunity to raise

the importance of our local unit directly with Theresa May at Prime Minister's Question Time.

I am continuing to campaign on fairer funding for our schools, and in October I brought a delegation of head teachers from our local secondary schools to Westminster to put the case directly to the Secretary of State for Education, Justine Greening, to explain why it is essential we get better funding for Cambridgeshire. I later joined other Cambridgeshire MPs at a meeting with the Junior Education Minister, Nick Gibb, to make the case further.

This year is also the third year of my inter-school debating competition. The competition kicked off with a day's training by the charity Debate Mate, kindly sponsored by Marshall Aerospace. An internal school round is followed by the final in Westminster, and I am delighted to announce that this year's final is being judged by Lord Finklestein.

Finally, I'm running a Christmas card competition for local primary school children, and the winner's design will appear on my Christmas card this year. Invitations to enter were sent out to primary schools in September, and I'm looking forward to receiving many fantastic festive entries!

OBITUARY – DICKIE JEEPS

Willingham lost arguably its greatest ever sportsman with the death on 8 October of Richard Eric Gautrey Jeeps, better known as Dickie Jeeps. He was one of the greatest rugby union players. In the 1950s and 1960s he won 13 caps for the British and Irish Lions and 24 caps for England.

He was born on 25 November 1931 and was educated at Bedford Modern School. He began his rugby career in 1949 with

Cambridge and then joined Northampton Saints in 1952. He played 13 seasons there making 273 appearances, scoring 48 tries and was club captain in 1958. He remains the Saints' most capped British and Irish Lion and has long been regarded as a club legend.

In 1955 he was selected for the Lions party touring South Africa before he had been capped by England. He became the first choice number 9, partnering the great flyhalf Cliff Morgan, took part in a further two Lions tours



and captained the team in the last

He made his debut for England against Wales in 1956 and he captained his country 13 times. His last match for England was 1962.

He was one of the finest number 9s in the game; he had great power and strength for a small man and he was very much the complete player.

He served as Rugby Football Union President 1976 – 77 and also chairman of the Sports Council for

seven years. He was awarded the CBE in 1977.

Dickie Jeeps was a member of our Parish Council in the 1960s, alongside other members of the Jeeps clan including his father who was the Chairman at that time. There is a permanent reminder of Dickie within the village. When a small housing development was built in 2008, the common roadway to the properties was named Jeeps Close in tribute to him.

PASTORAL LETTER THE VIEWPOINT OF FAITH

Lift Up Your Eyes

The prophet Isaiah cries out that we should raise our eyes and see that the One that reigns in heaven is also the One who knows well the Earth. The whole universe is ordered by God. All the stars are known to him by name. On Earth there is no road that God did not know, there is no situation in your life in which God will be surprised. That's the way God sees people's – intelligent creatures – lives on earth: Here on Earth you cannot get lost! The Prophet Isaiah finishes his speech with words of encouragement: 'Those who have placed their trust in the Lord, regain strength, get the wings like eagles; run without getting tired ...'..

Question

'Why you say and repeat: hidden is my way before my Lord and my rights before God are overlooked?'- asks the prophet Isaiah again. Today this question is on the lips of many of us. We do not see our lives from the point of view of God. The eyes of all are snooping life from below, not from above. And yet, to heaven plucks our nature ...

The Mountains Surrounding La Salette

There are those who climb the mountains because of their passion for it. Nearly all of us had that passion in our youth days. On 19 September 1846 to the mountains surrounding La Salette village appeared the Blessed Virgin Mary in tears. She did not go there with the passion for the mountains. If anyone now goes there one does it not because of the passion also but many of us have a deep need for the heart to be there. Who goes there sees one thing: it is closer to God, within a hidden natural bastion guarding of encounter with God. There, at the top, it's easy to focus, hard to be lax. The higher up, the more the sky you see; Earth is at the bottom, somewhere down ...

The Viewpoint of Faith

If we accept our crosses, pointed out very often by Jesus Christ in the Gospels, then, just from its height, you can see the divine perspective of life. It is on this Top (His Cross) everything becomes easy and light. Each life is some way that leads to God. You can't see it from the bottom, but it becomes obvious from the cross – your own cross. It is only after the proper crucifixion that one finds solace for the soul. That Summit can be reached by every Christian who does not reject the cross, is not afraid of suffering and trusts in God in each situation. Anyone is invited to make such a road to crucifixion; it is anyone who will admit his/her own sufferings, pain and load. Such people will definitely have encouragement from Jesus Christ, who is the First one who made it for us.

This Christmas the Liturgy is reminding us about Jesus Christ first coming. Await His arrival. He is alive and brings life to all who expect His advent.
