## Willingham and Over Boundary

It may surprise many villagers to hear that Highgate Country Stores and the other businesses and houses nearby are not officially in Willingham, but are part of Over. The boundary follows Haden Way (two thirds of the road is in Willingham, one third in Over) and continues up Over Mereway until it reaches Dockerel Brook.

This might appear to be of interest only to cartographers and local historians, but it causes many practical problems for those businesses affected. Their telephone lines originate at the Willingham exchange (with BT numbers starting 26, not the 23 of Over numbers) which delays connection of additional phone lines and provision of internet services, sometimes by many weeks. Deliveries are often misdirected to the Norman Way industrial area, as the only commercial site obviously in Over.

Residents have reported having postal deliveries with 'Over' crossed out and 'Willingham' hand-written below to make deliveries easier.

#### **Boundary Change**

In July 2016, a valid petition was submitted to South Cambridgeshire District Council Civic Affairs Committee, requesting a formal Community Governance Review of the boundary. In December, the Committee met and agreed the Terms of Reference and a timetable for the review to go ahead:

The aim of the review is neatly summarised by this section of the Terms of Reference [1]:

'The Council considers that parishes should reflect distinctive and recognisable communities of interest, with their own sense of identity; the feeling of local community and the wishes of local inhabitants are primary considerations in this Review.'

**Kirstin Donaldson**, the District Council Development Officer (North Locality), has been invited to attend the Full Parish Council meeting on 1 **February** in the Octagon to explain the process. All parishioners are welcome to attend, as they are at all Parish Council meetings.

#### **Proposed New Boundary**

The proposal is to move the boundary to the west of Highgate Farm and Alwyn Park, and continue behind the orchards before re-joining the existing border with Longstanton.

Boundaries between parishes should be and remain easily

identifiable, so the proposed new boundary follows a ditch from Dockerel Brook to Willingham Road, Willingham Road itself, and established hedged field boundaries.

#### History

The current border between Willingham and Over is almost exactly 400 years old. At the time it was established, the land was common pasture between the villages with no significant building on either side of the border:

'The parish boundaries in the south, mainly following straight tracks, were presumably fixed before ploughland extended to them, though that on the south-east partly follows medieval furlong divisions. The greater part of the western boundary was determined c.1618 when fen pastures intercommoned by Willingham and Over were partitioned by a ditch 12 ft. wide.[2]

#### Willingham Parish Council

The petition for the review was not made by the Parish Council but by the affected residents and business owners, inspired and led by Mr Barry Papworth. However, it has the wholehearted support of the Council for several reasons:

- The historic boundary bears no relation to the current development.
- The homes and businesses west of the current boundary are clearly part of Willingham. The area joins Willingham yet is separated from Over by over a mile of open countryside.
- Businesses and homes serve and are served by Willingham, yet have no involvement in local decisions which may affect them. This is not conducive to good governance.
- There is strong support and preference from the residents and businesses in the area to be formally recognised as part of Willingham. They consider themselves to belong to Willingham, using it as their address and their first port of call for goods and services.

#### **Over Parish Council**

Over Parish Council have objected to any change to the boundary, as they have done in the past, because 'the boundary is historic' and 'that's just the way things are.'[3]

## **From the Parish Council**

#### Street Lighting

Night birds and early risers will have spotted that the street lights in Willingham, and indeed the whole county, are no longer being turned off between the hours of 2 am and 6 am. Additionally, the lights are at 100% brightness all the time when they had previously been turned down to 60%.

This action was taken by the County Council, after complaints from residents in just 19 of the 54 Parish Councils in the County. Nobody in Willingham complained to the County Council (although there was one complaint to the Parish Clerk after a burglary).

The Parish Council is disappointed that this has happened with no consultation, after less than a year of operation and with apparently little consideration of the time and expense involved in turning the lights off. We are enquiring whether the dimming or overnight switching off can be reinstated, and the savings passed on to the Parish.

#### Gritting

The County Council have changed their minds and will not be cutting the amount of road gritting made in icy conditions. This was not a change of policy, but a realisation that the initial decision had been made on incorrect data. The actual saving would have been minimal, and the change would have meant less gritting than other authorities, not more as had been stated.

In Willingham, the B1050, Over Road and Rampton Road (from the junction with Newington) are primary gritting routes. Berrycroft and Newington; Church Street, Green Street and Rampton Road; and Fen End, Wilford Furlong and Rockmill End are secondary routes. Secondary gritting routes are gritted in addition to primary gritting routes when there is a forecast of a prolonged cold spell and where road surface temperatures fall below zero or snowfall is forecast.

#### Neighbourhood Plan

Neighbourhood Plans (NPs) were introduced by the Localism Act 2011 and allow Parish or Town Councils to influence planning in their local area. Several areas in South Cambridgeshire are embarking on NPs, so the Planning Committee invited District Councillor Robert Turner (the Planning Portfolio Holder) to explain the detail and purpose to us. He confirmed that the NP can give the Parish Council a stronger say in the type and location of development within the parish but it must not be in conflict with the District Council's Local Plan. It cannot reduce the amount of development. Creating a NP can be a lengthy process (on average 2 years) and can cost between £30,000 and £40,000. Grants of around

 $\pounds9,000$  are available. As yet, no NP has been completed in the District.

The District Council's Local Plan is likely to be completed this year but, until it is, the Council is content that there is little point in starting a costly and complex exercise with no obvious benefits.

#### **Tree Planting**

The Parish Council has purchased and planted 4 new hornbeam trees on the Green, to replace damaged and removed trees. Additionally, WAG are organising the planting of some additional trees on the QEII field to improve the outlook and aspect there. These trees are being sponsored by villagers.

#### A14 Improvement

Monthly updates on the A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon improvements can be found on the Facebook page <u>www.facebook.com/A14C2H</u>. Works planned for early this year in the Swavesey to Milton sections are: the creation of a compound at Swavesey, archaeology at Girton and Dry Drayton, and site clearance in preparation for construction. This last will involve some night lane closures from 8 pm to 6 am and details will be provided in advance.

#### **Community Orchard**

Judging from the debris left behind, a motorist seems to have been in heavy collision with the orchard gate over the Christmas period. The heavy oak gatepost was dislodged but can be reinstated. The gate was damaged beyond repair and will have to be replaced. These works are in hand.

## **Book Review**

#### Down and Out in Paris and London by George Orwell

This was one of those books that you buy with a book token because you think it's something you should read, but then sits on your shelves for ages. One evening, because I was nearing the end of the book I was reading, I stumbled downstairs without my glasses and just picked a random book off my 'unread' shelves and it turned out to be this one.

Once I had started it, I couldn't put it down; it's a completely fascinating true account of Orwell's life in poverty during the 1920s in the two cities of the title.

With his friend Boris in Paris, Orwell lives a hand-tomouth existence discovering 'what it is like to be hungry'. Owning a suitcase is a must to convince the landlady you have belongings, even if it is empty because you have pawned all your clothes. Eventually he and Boris get jobs in the kitchen at Hotel X, Orwell as a 'plongeur' (dishwasher). The description of life in the hotel kitchen is vivid and horrifying, making you very glad you never worked there or ate in the restaurant!

With the promise of a job, Orwell leaves Paris and returns to London but, on arrival, finds that there will be a gap of a few weeks before he can start. Being without money, he is forced to become a tramp living in 'spikes' (awful hostels) and existing on tea, bread and margarine and cigarette butts.

The time in Paris makes up two thirds of the book and is, I think for me as well as the author, the livelier part of the book. Orwell describes the difference between being poor in Paris and then in London:

'It was queer after Paris; everything was so much cleaner and quieter and drearier.... The crowds were better dressed and the faces comelier and milder and more alike, without that fierce individuality and malice of the French. There was less drunkenness, and less dirt, and less quarrelling, and more idling.'

The book's title gives the impression of a depressing read, but the interesting characters and gripping, and sometimes amusing, anecdotes, especially from the Paris kitchen and the lives of the tramps, hold your attention.

Orwell's reflections on poverty and the way those caught in it are viewed by the rest of society, are still extremely relevant today.

In our January meeting we had an extremely informative talk about UN Hazardous Occupations – Crawling through the rubble...and having tea with the Taliban with Gary O'Shea.

Gary is a very eloquent speaker who took us into his world of disaster management. His regular job is as a corporate accounts manager but, for roughly 12 weeks of the year, he works with International Rescue, tackling disasters such as earthquakes in poor areas of the world. His specialism is at the first stage of rescue and assessment which usually lasts up to 14 days. Gary explained about the 'golden 72 hours'. It is during this time that live victims are usually found. Outside of this time frame the chance of finding people alive decreases dramatically.

His mix of personal anecdotes and explanations of how emergency response forces work together kept the audience transfixed. In response to questions, Gary shared with us his belief that, in the future, he thought it extremely likely that disasters would relate to damming of water and its effect on populations lower down the water course – very thought provoking.

I need to raise some money in return for my place in the 2017 London Marathon that Mind (the mental health charity) has given me.

Despite growing up with my Dad being a keen runner who completed numerous London Marathons, his hobby never really interested me. Although I was a very active child, I grew in to a rather unfit and overweight adult. In my late twenties I decided to throw myself in at the deep end and try playing rugby, the only sport I enjoyed as a spectator. I enjoyed it immensely; however а shoulder injury a couple of years ago forced me into retirement. Determined not to fall in to the same unhealthy state I was in as a young adult, I started running a few miles a couple of times a week. Then I started to take it more seriously, pushing



myself beyond what I ever thought I could achieve, culminating in a successful completion of the 10 mile long Great South Run in Portsmouth last October.

Now well and truly bitten by the running bug and already having a half marathon planned this month I had to think of my next goal. I wanted to run a full marathon and, of course, it had to be the London Marathon, just like my Dad. However, getting a place is notoriously difficult, but thanks to Mind, here I am!

So, why Mind? Health, fitness and personal achievements aside, this is all the more emotional and poignant for me as I sadly lost my Dad in 2003. A respected and decorated Metropolitan Police Inspector as well as a proud Welshman, it's thanks to him that I have some of the interests and passions that I do; such as Welsh rugby and my music tastes. Sadly it was mental health issues that were at the root of his troubles when things started going wrong for him. Unfortunately this was back in the time when mental health wasn't really talked about.

Thankfully there is better awareness today and more help available. Mental health is just as important as physical health, despite there still being a stigma associated with it, more people are realising the benefits of simply talking about their problems or doing their bit to raise awareness.

I only wish it was like that when things started going wrong for my Dad. I think of him whenever I'm pushing myself for longer distances and wish I could tell him about what I am achieving. So in addition to running the 2017 London Marathon for myself, while raising money and awareness for Mind, I have decided to run the London Marathon in his memory.
