#### The 2017 London Marathon – David's Story

So that is it ... after months and months and months of training, questioning myself, with emotions all over the place and going through three pairs of trainers, I completed the **2017 London Marathon**.

Unfortunately I'm a bit disappointed with my time, 5 hours 11 minutes, but it's my own fault. After completing an excellent long run on the Guided Busway, I naively and stupidly decided to change my pacing and ran the first half far too quickly. By the time I'd got half way – just past Tower Bridge – my hamstrings had started complaining and from the Isle of Dogs onwards my calves had gone too; so I had to run/walk the remainder, as well as stopping numerous times to stretch. But I am reminding myself that I have achieved something that a year ago I would never have even considered, let alone contemplated, doing!

The charity I ran for, *Mind*, really seems to have resonated with so many of you. I've had lots of donations from people who don't even know me. Along with the anonymous donations, I'd like to thank everyone I haven't thanked individually. I have smashed my fundraising target by 26% (£2,532 at time of writing this). Words can't describe how overwhelmed I am by this support. I was nervous about writing 'my story' in February's *Willingham News* and on my *Just Giving* page (<u>www.justgiving.com/davidedwards80</u> - it's not too late to sponsor me!) but I'm so glad I shared my

Every time I saw them was the biggest boost and of course hugging them at the end was incredibly emotional. My mum, Jane Dowle, was sitting at home, following me on the app, feeling that she was running it with me!

It's been the toughest mental and physical challenge of my life and I am so glad it's over. I've experienced a rollercoaster of emotions but it has totally been worth it. It really was an amazing experience taking part in such an iconic event. You can't imagine what it's like having crowds lining almost the entire 26.2 mile route shouting your name and cheering you on!

Finally, I just want to categorically state ... **NEVER EVER** AGAIN!

#### Annual Meeting of the Parish Council

The Annual Meeting is when the Parish Council elects its officers. The Chair and Vice Chair offered to stand for another year, and were unanimously elected. All Lead Councillors also stood and were elected except for Leisure and Amenities which will now be handled by Dr King. This change was caused by the resignation of Jamie Smith from the council. Jamie worked diligently as Lead Councillor, tackling the waterlogging on the Recreation Ground and taking a particular interest in the revitalisation of the Bowling Club, and we thank him for his many years of service. The Planning Committee elected its Chair at the first meeting, on 16 May.

#### **County Council**

The new County Council divisions see Willingham now separated from Over and Longstanton, and combined with Cottenham for elections of County Councillors. Our previous Councillor, Peter Hudson, stayed with Longstanton and Over and was re-elected there. The council would like to thank Peter for his support of Willingham during his tenure.

In a very close contest decided by just two votes, our newly elected County representative is Tim Wotherspoon. We look forward to working with him in the future.

#### Parish Council Vacancies

After recent resignations, there are currently two vacancies on the Parish Council. If you are interested or would like to know more about what is involved, please contact either the Parish Office or any of the Councillors for a chat; contact details are below.

#### **Guided Busway**

The imminent opening of the new railway station at Cambridge North will see changes to the timetable for journeys on the guided bus. Although full details are not yet available, some A routes will operate as D and call at the new station. There will also be a new N route between Longstanton and Cambridge, calling at the station and operating every 20 minutes from Monday to Saturday. See <u>www.stagecoachbus.com</u> for the complete new timetables.

#### City Deal Smarter Cambridge

The Greater Cambridge City Deal is an agreement between central government and local authorities to invest in Greater Cambridge. One project supported by the deal is Smart Cambridge, a Cambridge-wide dedicated wi-fi network which will soon be extended to the District. This collects real time data from GPS sensors on buses, air quality sensors, road traffic monitors, car park spaces, etc. This summer they plan to release a Travel App which will report exactly where buses are and will be extended to predict journey times via various methods to help people spread their journeys and ease traffic congestion. See <u>www.connectingcambridgeshire.co.uk/smartcamb/</u> for more details.

Members of the public are welcome to attend and speak briefly or ask questions. ### PASTORAL LETTER

Yesterday I was standing by the side of the road cheering on the runners in the 'Wings for Life' event, feeling admiration for the participants and relief that it wasn't me that was gasping for breath and trying to keep going. I loved how, as the spectators cheered people on, they received a smile and the runners seemed to set their minds on keeping going with a real sense of encouragement. As time went on spectators started exchanging comments with each other which turned into something of a bond. Runners also had a camaraderie between themselves mutually encouraging each other. Isn't it amazing what a communal event does to us!

We seek out shared experiences through being at concerts, at the cinema or theatre, joining fellow supporters at football matches, entering the pub quiz and much, much more. Participating in these events gives us a strong sense of community and can lift our souls through mutual encouragement and a shared emotional journey. The common experience breaks down barriers; sometimes for just a moment in time and sometimes for much longer.

As a Christian there is something special about shared times with other Christians. # **Willingham Beer Festival**

#### Thursday 29 June to Saturday 1 July at the Social Club

#### Name the Star Beer at Willingham Beer Festival

When Willingham residents stroll down Church Lane at the end of June this year they will discover something completely new to arouse their senses. First they will see that a marquee has miraculously appeared in the Social Club car park. Then they will hear the pleasant sounds of summer music wafting towards them on the breeze. Finally they will scent the sweet aroma



of malt, hops and barley in the air. Yes, it's the **Willingham Beer Festival**.

The excitement doesn't end there as the village has the opportunity to take part in creating and naming a special ale that will appear for the first time at the Festival in honour of Willingham's first dedicated Beer Festival.

#### Is it Really the First Willingham Beer Festival?

Some older residents may remember beer tents in the village fields many years past but it seems unlikely they will have experienced anything in the village quite like this, certainly not in this millennium, and maybe not ever before.

The Beer Festival is the fruit of an admirable collaboration between various groups in the village. The Social Club is providing the venue, wine, soft drinks and food. The Jam Club is providing the music from the pool of local talent that has graced many a village event. Willingham Action Group is providing the administrative support, the marquee and the volunteers. Local businesses, including Hockeys, Uttridge Accounting and Fen Edge Community Association, are providing sponsorship for the whole event. And lastly, but not inconsequentially, the Bank Micropub is providing the beer, supported by the Jolly Good Beer Company (who are also doing the social media advertising, and artwork for the glasses, banners and posters).

It has been heart-warming to see the enthusiasm of all the parties involved to make this a special village success story, with the added drive of channelling the Willingham Action Group proceeds from the event into disabled facilities at the Social Club. With food, wine, soft drinks and of course music also available at the venue, it will be a real family event.

#### Willingham's Very Own Festival Beer

In honour of the event, one of the brewers (Three Blind Mice of Little Downham) has agreed to create a unique ale specially for the Festival. There's an opportunity for the Willingham community to get even more closely involved in the event by contributing one of the key ingredients of the brew and also by naming the new beer that is produced.

The brewers have suggested that our special Willingham

brew be an elderflower-based pale ale as elderflowers will be in bloom around the time of the Festival. They have asked the people of Willingham to collect the elderflowers to be used in the brew and to come up with a name for the new ale. Here are the details if you want to get involved in helping create and name the beer.

#### You Can Get Involved

At the beginning of June, preferably at a time of dry weather, pick good, fresh and clean elderflowers (away from busy roadsides please). Select only the freshest looking flowers (no browning, plump or shrivelled ones and at least 75% of flowers open). Leave at least half the umbels (flower clusters) on the trees so as not to affect the resident birds and bugs. If time permits, try and remove as much stem from the flowers as possible. (You could run the umbels through the tines of a fork into a bowl to do this.)

Bring your crop to the Bank Micropub on **Saturday or Sunday, 3 and 4 June,** and drop it off in the yellow van parked behind/near the pub from midday. (NB the pub will be open from 5 pm on Saturday if you want to combine visits!)

Volunteers may also wish to get involved in 'grading' and de-stemming flowers on the Saturday and Sunday at the van. Sign up on the Willingham Beer Festival website (details below) if you would like to help.

#### Name that Beer

The beer will take about a month to create and brew, so we have a little time to find a suitable name for it. The beer will be a pale ale, about 4% ABV, infused with Willingham elderflowers. Send your suggestions for the name by visiting the website below. A shortlist will be sent to the brewers (Three Blind Mice) for them to choose the final name.

The name of our new Festival brew will be unveiled on the first night of the Festival, **Thursday**, **29** June.
