Willingham Combined Charity 50th Anniversary

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the Josiah Smith bungalows in Over Road and there will be a small celebration to mark this event at the bungalows on **22 July**, 2 - 4 pm. All villagers are welcome to attend, but we would particularly like to see some of our older residents who may have memories of when these bungalows were built. Past and present trustees will be there to answer questions and refreshments will be available.



July 1967

The building of the six bungalows was made possible by the generous bequests of Miss Hilda Smith and her brother Cyrus Smith in memory of their father, Josiah Smith. They were officially opened in July 1967 by Miss Agnes Smith, aged 87, who was then the oldest living descendant of Josiah Smith. She received a bouquet from the oldest of the six tenants, Mrs Mary Hopkins, aged 79.

The original objectives of the Willingham Combined Charity, which manages the Josiah Smith bungalows, were:

- 1. The provision of housing accommodation for persons (of whom three must be women) who are in need, hardship, or distress and have resided in the area of benefit for no less than two years prior to their appointment.
- 2. The provision of housing accommodation for women over the age of 60 who are in need, hardship and distress who were born in the area of benefit.

Willingham Combined Charity consists of 12 trustees, all of whom are volunteers. They neither receive nor have a financial interest in the property belonging to the charity.

The Bands

Alchemy (Thursday night)

Alchemy is a Cambridgeshire-based guitar and vocal duo covering a wide range of musical styles, from Peggy Lee to Jessie J. Their engaging and spirited performances, delivered across a diverse repertoire of music, have been delighting audiences in this area for the last decade. Both performers have been regular artists at the Jam Club.

Steve Lockwood Band (Friday night)

Internationally recognised 'Harmonica Wizard' Steve Lockwood, along with his band, will be showcasing the power and influence of his favourite and most versatile instrument, the harmonica. Using traditional and avantgarde techniques, musician, composer, performer and harmonica teacher, Steve has an extensive repertoire encompassing many genres from early blues and jazz to soul, funk and contemporary dance, pop and rock music. He has entertained thousands in over 4000 concerts and has recorded more than 100 albums. Steve has composed and played music for film and television. His latest collaborations have been with Tom Jones' band and Amy Wadge (co-writer with Ed Sheeran).

Keith Pearson and Tim Jellis (Saturday night)

Keith, reunited with long-time collaborator, Tim Jellis, will be combining folk/country inspired original songs with superb musicianship.

Keith is a prolific writer of world-class songs and can hold an audience enthralled with his humour, voice, songs and banjo/guitar playing. His collaboration with Tim (guitar, vocals) started an amazing 30 years ago, and their intimate, heart-melting harmonies honed over the years have been likened to the Everly Brothers.

Brewing the Willingham Ale

You may be interested to know what will go into brewing our new ale. The brewers have informed us that the recipe will involve East Anglian pale malts and British Olicana hops, a fairly new hop variety developed by Charles Farams (a UK hop factor). The yeast will be what is called a 'clean' profiled ale yeast.

In brewing, the malts are steeped in the 'mash' (crushed grains and hot water) and the 'wort' (resultant liquid) is drawn off. It is then boiled in the 'kettle' (a large boiling

vessel) with hops. The boiling both sterilises the wort and sometimes reduces it, to achieve the right starting gravity (amount of sugar in the wort). The hops in the boil impart flavour and bitterness, with the effect being different depending on how early or late they go into the boil, with late hops imparting the most flavour.

The elderflowers (picked by the enthusiastic volunteers in the photos!) will be put in late, just before 'flame out' (when the kettle is turned off) and they will steep and impart their flavour but also be sterilised by the hot wort (so any wild yeasts on them are killed and don't infect the beer). This wort is then cooled and put into an FV (fermentation vessel), the yeast is 'pitched' (added) and fermentation begins. At the end of fermentation, further hops are added; this is called 'dry hopping' and imparts many of the floral/citrus flavour notes popular in pale beers these days. A day or two after the dry hops have been added, the beer is racked to cask and keg, where it conditions ready for dispensing at the Festival. The new beer will be available in both formats. Let us know what you think!

From the Parish Council

Cambridge North Station:

The new station to the north of Cambridge has opened and offers a useful alternative access to the mainline rail network for Willingham residents. The services are not quite as frequent as from the existing station but there are four trains an hour into London, one of which is non-stop and reaches Kings Cross in under an hour. The new station is also linked to some of the services on the guided bus route and is reached in less than 15 minutes from Longstanton. There are car parking facilities at the new station but beware that the only payment option is by phone. This provides a very safe, cheap and convenient method of collection for the car park operator, but is not so convenient for those of us who do not wish to have a mobile phone permanently clamped to our heads.

Northstowe:

The first residents have moved into their new homes, with 26 of the 92 plots on the Bloor Homes site already sold offplan. Further occupations will take place over the summer months. Construction has started on 44 properties so far and Bloor expect to be off their site within 24 months.

Gallagher are scheduled to complete the remaining earthworks at the Hatton's Road ponds by the end of June, as well as finishing bulk earthworks on the western end of the Phase 1 site. Taylor Wimpey, Linden and Bovis have all started preparations for construction, putting their compounds in place and Barratt are expected to move on site shortly. All are working towards first occupations in the autumn.

Landscape architects, Randall Thorp, have been engaged by Gallagher to look at the design of the five main play areas to be provided across Phase 1. The draft strategy is expected to be submitted shortly.

Planning permission for Phase 2 (3500 homes) was granted at the beginning of the year. The Design Code which sets out the guiding principles for the look, feel and movement across the development will be submitted in the next couple of months, following examination by a group of professional urban designers. Initial discussions on Phase 3 (for a further 5000 homes) are set to commence in the autumn.

Parish Council Matters:

The latest Parish Council Annual Report is available on the website or from the Parish Office, the library, the Primary School and the doctors' surgery.

The Parish Council has requested a visit to the village by the A14 Exhibition Bus. Willingham was not on the original schedule but is now going to receive a visit on the **9** August between 4 - 7 pm at the Ploughman Hall. The bus has a lot of up to date visual information as well as experts to answer your questions.

Our congratulations go to the surgery which has been rated as 'good' by the Care Quality Commission.

The footpath between the highway and the Youth Building is going to be improved to provide better access to the Parish Office, Ploughman Hall and Play Park.

The Ploughman Hall lights are to be replaced with more effective and energy efficient LED units.

A second public defibrillator is to be installed and appropriate locations are being considered. The existing defibrillator is located at the pavilion on West Fen Road.

There are two vacancies for councillors. The duties are not onerous and any resident who would be willing to give a few hours a month to help improve our village is urged to apply. Details of exactly what is involved and how to apply can be obtained from our friendly and very helpful Parish Clerk.

Meeting dates are published on the website, the notice board outside the public hall, at the library and are listed below. Members of the public are welcome to attend and speak briefly or ask questions. Names and the electoral register number of those wishing to speak will be noted. There will be a total time limit of 15 minutes, with each speaker limited to 3 minutes, to ensure everyone has a chance to speak.

The next meeting dates are 5 July and 2 August. The meetings are held in the Octagon at 7 30 pm.

The Parish Council office is open Monday to Thursday from 10 am to 1 pm, except Bank Holidays, and there is an answer-phone service outside office hours.

Bar Hill Registrations: We regret that we are currently unable to accept any further registrations from Bar Hill. This area falls within our outer boundary but we are having to suspend applications due to capacity and the increasing demands on GP time. We must ensure that the clinical care we provide is the very best for all patients and so we have made the decision to limit our intake from the outer area. Further information is available from our website.

Disabled Parking: Please respect our Disabled Parking bays at Willingham and Longstanton surgeries. Disabled parking is a very important facility for many of our patients who hold a blue badge and this parking is reserved specifically for them. Please do not abuse these parking bays for any other purpose. If you do not have a blue badge, we will ask you to move your vehicle.

Be Self-Care Aware: By keeping a selection of essential medications at home, you can treat common conditions in a timely manner, avoiding unnecessary trips to see your GP or even to the Accident and Emergency Department. Things to keep in your medicine cabinet:

- Allergy medicines.
- Simple pain killers like paracetamol and ibuprofen.
- Sore throat, cough, cold and flu medications.
- Heartburn and indigestion remedies.
- Pile (haemorrhoid) treatments.
- Anti-diarrhoea medication.
- Rehydration salts.
- First aid kit including plasters and bandages.

Travel Vaccinations: If you are travelling abroad this summer, please remember to check if you need any travel vaccinations. You can book an appointment with one of our nurses who will be happy to check for you.

Out of hours cover: Please remember to phone Urgent Care Cambridge on 111 if you require medical attention when the surgery is closed. Accident and Emergency is only intended for life threatening conditions or if you are likely to need an X-ray.

Repeat Prescriptions: Help the NHS to reduce waste by only ticking the repeat items that you need. Please allow 48 hours notice when ordering repeat prescriptions.

Cambridgeshire Hearing Clinics: The next Hearing Aid Clinics will be held at the surgery on **Wednesday 19 July, Wednesday 16 August** and **Wednesday 20 September.** No appointment is necessary, just pop in for your free NHS hearing aid batteries and for help and advice regarding hearing loss.

Seasonal Fruit Salad with Ginger Syrup and Fresh Mint

A simple dessert made from seasonal apricots, strawberries and raspberries and brought together by a tangy ginger syrup. Serves 6.

Ingredients

- 250 ml water
- 1 tablespoon honey
- 1 inch fresh ginger, peeled and grated
- 12 apricots
- 400 g strawberries
- 400 g raspberries
- handful fresh mint
- coconut yoghurt to serve

Method

- Warm a cup of water and honey in a saucepan until lightly simmering, add the ginger and bring to the boil. Simmer and reduce until the mixture thickens to a light syrup. Strain off the ginger bits (optional).
- Wash and chop the fruit into bite-sized pieces.
- Pour the ginger syrup over the fruit, and stir in a large handful of chopped mint.
- Spoon into dishes to serve top with a dollop of coconut yoghurt

PASTORAL LETTER

Three Steps of Salvation made by Jesus

First Step: Thirty years in Silence

Jesus came to our world in very similar way to each of us; conceived and born of woman and going through being a toddler, baby, child and young adult. For 30 years, 'wasting' time on hidden life.

The human curiosity could not bear that attitude, so very gladly attributed a lot of fantastic actions to Jesus, who necessarily had to provide some miracles for the amazement of the mob. The wisdom of the Church did not approve of those events as something credible, placing them in *Apocrypha* – the writings not recognised as inspired by the Holy Spirit. That silence of Jesus was very significant because it built huge expectations.

Second Step; Preaching the Gospel

When the time of Baptism came, Jesus entered the river Jordan and officially, confirmed by the voice of God from Heaven and the testimony of John the Baptist, started to talk. His teaching had a very important target: to attract the attention of the whole nation towards Him. Jesus Christ achieved that by His words of wisdom, stupendous miracles and unspoken authority which attracted admiration and caused the envy of His enemies who were jealous of His popularity. Three years of talking followed, in open speeches to crowds and at the same time giving gentle explanations to His many disciples and, in a more precise way, to His very close friends – the Apostles. How many times did they not understand Him, causing Him to lose His temper and be disappointed. But He never gave up, tirelessly teaching about the Kingdom of Heaven where Love lasts forever.

Third Step: Action!

In His last days, He stopped talking. He gave only brief instructions of how to follow Him after *His Hour of Sacrifice*, to preserve his Disciples' trust and patience that God will provide, so that life may continue, even after a direct hit on the Source of Life, His Son Jesus. He started to act in such a silent way that He totally accepted His maltreatment by false accusations, parody trial, cruel passion, crucifixion and death without saying a word of defence!

Why did He need to talk in self-defence?

By His silence, He showed all humanity that the deliberate choice of giving His life for others is far more efficient than a search for justice by violence and power. That kind of love is the only efficient way which can change the entire society with its richness and culture. Any other way brings only more confusion and disorder.

At the end a question. What is opposite to love? It is not hatred. Hatred is a feeling and love is an attitude. If so, the opposite of love is self-gratification. Totality for others against totality for myself!

Those who do not understand that difference will never understand the mission of Jesus and His message of eternal life that life is so powerful in living, that is not afraid to sacrifice itself for others.

In May, we had a very full meeting which started with a discussion of this year's WI Resolutions.

Every resolution passed throughout the WI's 101-year history has stemmed from a concern put forward by a member. These are then voted on by every WI in the UK to decide which one should be pursued nationally. This year there are two potential areas for campaign – finding ways to alleviate loneliness in our communities and lobbying against plastic fibres from man-made fabrics being released into our oceans and threatening wildlife. Willingham WI voted in favour of both of these campaigns and our result will be reported by our representative to the AGM.

After the vote and refreshments, we listened to a really interesting talk by Elissa Tregear, a Willingham WI member, about British Sign Language (BSL). Elissa is a former teacher of deaf children - she supported children who sign by helping them access the curriculum and by signing in assemblies and school plays. Elissa told us that BSL is the first language of 70-125,000 people, most of whom are profoundly deaf. There has been an increase in parents using Baby Signing with hearing children and it is increasingly used to help autistic and delayed-language children. BSL is a visual means of communication which includes facial expressions and body language as well as gesturing. Elissa finished by teaching us some simple words and phrases including how to greet someone and say that you are a member of Willingham WI! Everyone enjoyed it and we were given a handout so we can continue to learn and practise.

Friends of Willingham Library (FOWL)

At their AGM in May, the Friends Group looked back over a relatively quiet year. Cambridgeshire County Council Corporate Capacity Review is in the process of implementing the savings which need to be made over the whole Council and the next part, Phase 3, will include the Library Service. There was disappointment among members that the £1 charge introduced for requesting books from other libraries had led to fewer reservations but the Library Service needs to maximise income wherever possible.

On the plus side, several classes from the Primary School visited the library over the year and the monthly Engage sessions on Wednesday afternoons have attracted good audiences. The two Poetry and Prose evenings had been successful and more of these were planned for the coming year. The number of people taking part in the Book Trail around the village during Feast weekend was rather disappointing, although those who did were enthusiastic. The FOWL activity for this year's Feast weekend will focus more on the Library itself and promoting its use. The Family History group continues to thrive, making use of the library computers to access information via Ancestry, which would otherwise require a subscription.

Nature Notes

Hooray – they're back! Well they were a couple of days ago, and hopefully will return shortly. Did you guess? Swallows, 'Willingham' swallows! My wife and I have been observing these birds, which take up residence under the balcony of the sports pavilion, for all but the first of the six years we have been Willingham residents. How many years were they there before that, we wonder? We worry for their continuing loyalty to this precarious home, bearing in mind how busy it is. A couple of years ago there were two pairs nesting but last year only one pair. When we noticed their arrival on 2 May, there were three birds flying around, perhaps two adults and one from the two broods last year? The season, which has again started rather cold and dry, will determine how they fare.

Following on from our previous article, most of the summer migrant birds have now returned. Have you heard the cuckoo yet? Our first was at Fen Drayton Lakes at the end of April. No turtle doves yet and both these species are rapidly declining as a breeding bird in this country. It will be so sad if we are soon to hear the last, although hopefully, with the efforts of various wildlife organisations, we can stabilise or reverse their decline.

One of our last migrant birds to arrive is the swift. Not only do they arrive late, many not until May, but they also leave early, some by the end of July and most by August, mainly the birds that have bred. Last summer we noticed a few of these birds flying around the village and wonder if anyone is aware of, and prepared to let us know, where they nest?

In March, my wife and I were on one of our usual wanders in and around the village. We decided to drop in to the Community Orchard to see if any of the wild flowers, sown by volunteers last year, had appeared and some have! Hopefully, there will be more during the summer so it will be worth a visit.

During our wander around the Orchard, we came across a

barn owl looking forlorn and in distress. It was sitting at the foot of the hedge bordering Earith Road, probably hit or blown into the hedge by a fast (aren't most of them?) vehicle. We had no means of transporting it at that point, so we made our way home to the other end of Willingham, before returning with our car and a cardboard box.

At first we were unable to find the bird but, thinking that it was unlikely to have moved far, we searched the area and found it crouching in the middle of the Orchard. We crept up behind it and, quickly but gently, covered it with a towel and placed it in the cardboard box. We had pre-arranged to take the owl to the Raptor Centre near Somersham, where an initial inspection showed that it did not have any broken bones but it did appear to have an injured eye. We left the bird at the Centre and their veterinary officer told us that they would care for it and let us know if it recovered sufficiently to be released back to the wild near to where we had found it. The vet warned us that, if it did not recover to full fitness, they would have no option but euthanasia. Apparently, there is a ruling by DEFRA that all wild creatures must be dealt with this way if they are not fit enough to be released. On tenterhooks for nearly two weeks, we finally received the good news that, after a week of observation of its eye by the vet, it had fully recovered and could be released. We arranged with an officer of the Centre to meet him back at the Orchard, where we witnessed the release of the owl and recorded the event with a video clip. As barn owls have a territory of about a kilometre square, you might spot the bird if you are near the Orchard. If you do, please let us know.

There are so many natural wonders to look out for and admire. We hope you will be able to get out and about yourselves.
