Thirst for Beer Festival Satisfied

Did you go to the 2017 Willingham Beer Festival that weekend at the end of June? It's a question you may be asked in years to come.

1000 Visitors, 2500 Pints Consumed

If you did, you were one of over 1000 people that made the event such a massive success, from the first arrivals knocking at the marquee flap at 5 pm on Thursday to the last carousers wending their slightly wobbly way home at 11 pm on Saturday. You enjoyed hot food laid on by the Social Club every night. You listened to live music provided by Alchemy, Steve Lockwood and Keith Pearson. You chatted into the night with old friends and probably made some new ones. You drank 2500 pints of beer and cider across a range of over 40 different types and you still felt pretty good the next morning. You managed to drain all the casks and very nearly all the kegs, despite extra supplies being brought in.

Special Willingham Festival Ale

At the end of the Festival there remained only five pints of the special Willingham brew produced by Three Blind Mice Brewery for the event. Its name, **Of Mice and Fen**, was suggested by Martin Hale and chosen by public vote. Its subtle elderflower flavour made it a popular choice with everyone and especially with those that had helped pick the elderflowers – the key ingredient – who felt duty bound to enjoy it to the full.

Not surprisingly then, **Of Mice and Fen** was chosen as Festival favourite in both classes of cask and keg. The cask version came out as overall winner by a mile with 10 per cent of the vote. Of the ciders, the Willingham Festival version, produced by Simon's Cider, topped the chart. Top three in each category were:

All 524 of the refundable Willingham Beer Festival glasses went by early Saturday so further reinforcements, left over from the 2017 Cambridge Beer Festival, had to be drafted in. These too, with images of angels and demons on, were popular with festival-goers but the limited edition 2017 Willingham Festival glasses are now a collector's item.

All in a Good Cause

The money raised by the event from entrance fee, sponsorship and contribution from the food and drink profits will help subsidise much-needed facilities at the

Social Club. The generosity of the main sponsors, Hockey's Estate Agents, Utteridge Accounting and Fen Edge Community Association and of the barrel sponsors kept the show on the road so, thanks to them and to you for coming, we can reflect on a highly successful and enjoyable time that will have a long-lasting and tangible benefit to the community.

A Professional Service from Start to Finish

Graham Smith

Longest Serving Postman in Cambridgeshire!

Graham was born in Willingham, one of a large family with seven brothers and four sisters. Two brothers have now passed away but the rest of the family live relatively locally. His career as a postman began in November 1975 and he is now the longest serving postman in Cambridgeshire, number one on the seniority list of around 300 rural delivery staff, a status which entitles him to choose his own holiday dates!

Upon becoming a Post Office employee he was given very precise timings for his rounds. There were two rounds each day, the first shift beginning at 6 25 am and finishing at 10 30 am while his second shift began at 1 50 pm and finished at 5 10 pm and included exact timings for emptying various letter boxes. His weekly wage was £39 06 and there was an allowance of 47p for cleaning his official cycle. Back then the sub post master was Alan Robinson and there were three postmen in Willingham but Graham was the only full time employee. His uniform included a cap which he never wore.

Graham much preferred using his bike to the trolley which they now have to push and it's extremely heavy at the start of the round. The load these days consists mostly of parcels, the result of the increase in online shopping, while the volume of mail has declined significantly. He now arrives at the Post Office at 6 30 am to begin sorting the mail into roads, begins his round at 8 30 am, delivering to approximately 450 houses and finishes work about 1 30 to 2 pm.

Graham loves his job and is very pleased to be back at work after being off sick for three months following a hip operation. He said he was 'bored out of his mind' without the regular routine and believes his work has kept him very healthy. In fact in almost 42 years of work he has had very little time off work due to sickness. Although he likes all the seasons and all weathers he admits he isn't too keen on heavy rain.

There is no better job as far as Graham is concerned. He loves chatting to people he meets on his round and says that for some of the more elderly residents, the postman is possibly the only person they see each day. A stand out

experience for Graham during all these years has not been an encounter with a dog as one would expect, although he admits there have been a few of these, but with a cockerel! He was delivering in Schole Road when the cockerel flew at him and pecked him on the cheek and nose causing him to fall into a hedge. However blood all over his face and down his shirt, he continued his round, and the apologetic owner bought him a box of chocolates.

Graham is a true Willingham character and very popular in the village which is evident from the number of cards and messages he received while he was off work. He would like to thank everyone who sent cards and messages and also all the visitors who went to see him when he came out of hospital.

VOLUNTEER DRIVERS URGENTLY NEEDED

OWLS Community Car Scheme provides a valuable and much needed service to those people living in Over, Willingham, Longstanton and Swavesey who need to attend medical appointments or make some social journeys, but are unable to access other means of transport.

In the last few months there has been an unprecedented demand for the OWLS service and the coordinators have sometimes struggled to find available drivers to undertake all the journeys.

We desperately need new drivers. Are you newly retired or have a few hours a week you could spare to help maintain this very important and expanding Community service? Drivers offer particular times/days when they are available – in practice about four journeys a month is very helpful.

Drivers use their own cars and receive 45p a mile (30p from the customer and 15p from Cambridgeshire County Council). Additional insurance cover is provided by Cambridgeshire County Council. Volunteers also have to undergo a DBS (formerly CRB) check.

The Community Governance Review: Willingham and Over

Parish Councillors had hoped that this issue would be resolved at the June meeting of the South Cambridgeshire District Council's Civic Affairs Committee. With relatively short notice it was decided to hold over discussion of the Review's findings until the meeting of this Committee on the morning of **28 September**. Members of the Parish Council are planning to attend to make further representations to the Committee. Members of the public are also welcome to attend – details of the Committee meeting can be obtained from the District Council's website or the Parish Office.

Ploughman Hall

Regular users of the Ploughman Hall will know that there has been an ongoing problem with its lighting. Attempts to resolve the problem had been frustratingly slow but an electrical contractor has now replaced all the old fittings with new ones. These use LED bulbs so it is hoped that the need for replacement will be reduced. Feedback, to the Parish Office, on the quality of the new lighting is welcome.

The entry to the QE II Field has been upgraded, with the support of a Community Chest award from South Cambridgeshire District Council. The increased use of the play equipment had meant that during wet weather the entrance was getting muddy – hopefully the new surface will reduce this. During August work will take place to improve the pedestrian access to the Ploughman Hall, the Parish Office and the disabled access to the Youth Centre. Please take care if you are in the vicinity whilst this work is in progress!

Are you an A14 Inducted Driver?

And how do you become one? Villagers may have noticed heavy goods vehicles in the village with signs in the windscreen indicating that the driver is 'A14 inducted'. What this means for Willingham, along with the many other questions you might have about the A14 upgrade, might be answered when the A14 Mobile Visitor Centre visits the village. It will be sited at the Ploughman Hall on the **9 August** between 4 and 7 pm.

The A14 upgrade is described as the biggest road upgrade currently under construction in the UK. Information about the scheme's progress can be found at roads.highways.gov.uk/projects/a14-cambridge-to-huntingdon/. There is also the A14 Community Fund which supports projects linked to the new road, with grants available up to £10,000. Details of this are at: cambscf.org.uk/A14.html.

Green Pastures

The National Plant Monitoring Scheme (NPMS) is a government backed scheme which recruits volunteers to survey plots in squares close to where they live. The plots are surveyed twice yearly. There is a 'local' square available close to the village, adjacent to the Earith

Road. If you would like to consider volunteering for this scheme then please contact the NPMS Volunteer Coordinator – Hayley New (tel: 01722 342743 ext 8227).

New Life on the Old West

Parish Councillors were advised of this project by Cambridgeshire ACRE. It is designed to reverse declines in wildlife and habitats in Fenland. There was concern that as the scheme developed there would be increased traffic on the B1050. We have now been advised that there are no plans to increase 'visitor footfall' in the area of the scheme. The Programme Development Officer, Mark Nokkert (tel: 01353 865030, e-mail: mark.nokkert@cambsacre.org.uk) is available to talk about the project. He feels that the project may deliver community green space enhancements to the village.

Dog Fouling

Complaints about dog fouling to the Parish Office have become less frequent. Thank you to dog owners who are now clearing up their dog's mess from public areas. There are always opportunities to improve this – so the Parish Council would ask all dog owners to clear up after their dogs.

Willingham Combined Charity

Many villagers will have enjoyed the 50th Anniversary of the opening of the Josiah Smith bungalows. These are managed by Willingham Combined Charity. The Charity dates its origins from 1505 and as part of its service to the village has continued to develop its housing services for the village's elderly. The Parish Council congratulates the Charity on this work.

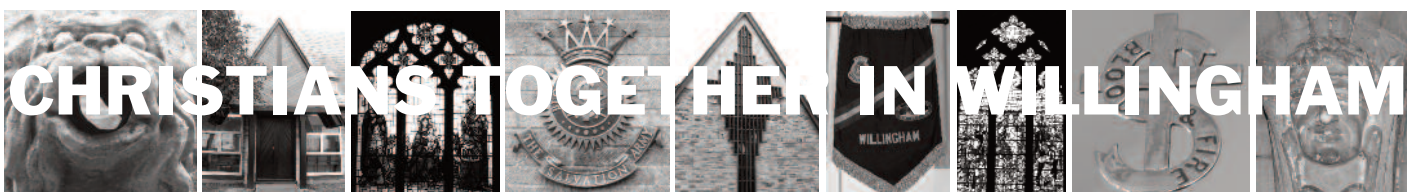

PASTORAL LETTER

A Trip Out on your Doorstep!

I don't know about you, but whenever we are away on holiday we like to wander into local churches to see what they're like. How old is the church? Are there many stained glass windows? Do they have pews or chairs? If nothing else, churches are often somewhere cool to sit on a hot day. It wasn't until I welcomed 40+ pupils from our Primary School into the church as part of their RE studies this week, that I realised quite what a gem of a medieval church we have in Willingham. Reading through the *Tour Guide* to prepare myself for their visit (available just inside the door), I wasn't quite aware as I perhaps ought to have been of its links with Ely Cathedral.

The church was built in the 13th and early 14th century, so is about 780 years old. In a small lancet window at the back of the church is the oldest known wall painting of St Etheldreda, the foundress of the Monastery at Ely in 673. Painted in 1244, it is therefore 773 years old! And in the Lady Chapel (on the right as you go in), you'll find a statue of St Etheldreda holding in her hand a model of the cathedral.

There is so much to see in St Mary and All Saints Church, from the 36 wooden angels which are part of the oak roof, fitted in the church in 1613 but originally from the ruined Barnwell Priory in Cambridge, to the wonderful wall painting of St Christopher carrying the Christ Child, with fish and sea creatures around his feet. Look for a secret door high up on the chancel wall seemingly leading no-where, but which many years ago led to a gallery above the rood screen between the nave (the main body of the church) and the chancel (housing the high altar). What must that have felt like for priest and congregation, to be preached to from such a height!

There are lots of other interesting things to look out for, from the Willingham Imp with his tongue sticking out, to the carved wooden heads on the choir stalls, to the ancient graffiti in the bell tower dating back several hundred years, and the wood panelled Lady Chapel thought to be the first village school in around 1550.

Have a wonderful summer and don't forget, call in and have a look around the church if you get the chance.

Looking After Yourself and Those at Risk in Hot Weather

A number of Willingham residents attend the Over Surgery. We have received the following excellent advice from the Over Practice.

The heat can affect anyone, but some people run a greater risk of serious harm, these include the following:

- older people, especially those over 75
- babies and young children
- people with a serious chronic condition, particularly dementia, heart, breathing or mobility problems
- people with serious mental health problems
- people on certain medications, including those that affect sweating and temperature control (for example, diuretics, antihistamines, beta-blockers and antipsychotics)
- people who are already ill and dehydrated (for example, from gastroenteritis)

What Can You Do?

- look out for neighbours, family or friends who may be isolated and unable to care for themselves; make sure they are able to keep cool during a heatwave
- make sure medicines are stored below 25°C or in the fridge (read the storage instructions on the packaging)
- have plenty of cold drinks, and avoid excess alcohol, caffeine, or drinks high in sugar. If drinking fruit juice, dilute it with water
- if you're not urinating frequently or your urine is dark, it's a sign that you're becoming dehydrated and need to drink more
- eat cold foods, particularly salads and fruit with a high water content
- wear suitable head wear, such as a wide-brimmed hat, to reduce exposure to the face, eyes, head and neck
- apply sunblock, or broad-spectrum sunscreens, with high sun protection factor (SPF) of at least SPF 15 with UVA protection regularly to exposed skin
- avoid extreme physical exertion. If you can't avoid strenuous outdoor activity, such as sport, DIY or gardening, keep it for cooler parts of the day – for example, in the early morning or evening
- children should not take part in vigorous physical activity on very hot days, such as when temperatures are above 30°C
- ensure that babies, children or older people are not left alone in stationary cars or other closed spaces
- look out for children in prams or pushchairs in hot weather; keep them in the shade, remove excess clothing, ensure there is adequate air flow, and check regularly to ensure they are not overheated.

Put the strawberries and coconut water into a blender, blend until smooth and pour into lolly moulds, leaving a space at the top for the ice to expand (science lesson – water expands when it freezes!). Insert the lolly stick and place in the freezer to set. This should take around 2–3 hours.

When frozen, run the mould under a warm tap, and slide out the lolly. Enjoy!

Old Willingham

This parade is in Long Lane between the entrance to the medical centre and the school playing field. The houses in the top left are in Silver Street. The long row of windows are part of the greenhouses for Mr Thoday's 'Willingham Vineries' which occupied a large area to the east of Long Lane. An article written in 1894 says: 'these Willingham Vineries, a block of six span-roofed houses, 250 feet long, 14 feet high, and ranging from 18 to 22 feet wide, with yet another about 100 feet long, run across at one end, and a water-tower, packing and store-rooms, pits and frames, in quantity to boot, rather astonish one'. They grew many high value crops such as peaches, nectarines and cucumbers. The article notes 'not a Red Spider nor Aphid, or speck, or flaw of any sort, is visible on the splendid spread of dark green leaves'. The parade is part of the annual field day in which the whole village turned out and the picture was probably taken in the 1930s. Note that it is just a track – no pavements or tarmac.

Bird Watch

This month Seb Scarlett, aged 15, has sent in some lovely photographs of a baby green woodpecker, which he snapped in his back garden. We are sorry we are unable to show them in colour.

If you are lucky enough to have green woodpeckers visiting your garden, then you will most likely have seen them on the lawn. This is because their diet consists mainly of ants - adult, larvae and eggs. Compared to other woodpeckers, green woodpeckers have relatively weak bills. When excavating their nest holes in trees, they usually only chisel into soft wood, and they rarely drum to communicate. Instead they are very vocal and have a recognisable loud, laughing call.

Although green woodpeckers can pair for life, they are antisocial outside of the breeding season and spend most of the year living alone. Green woodpeckers only have one brood of five to seven eggs and usually lay their eggs in May. They usually nest in live trees and will often use the same tree each year, if not the same hole. On fledging each parent usually takes half of the young and shows them where to feed. It is at this time of year when they may be brought to garden lawns to feed'.
