Willingham News Receives Award

You may have noticed a new logo on this month's front page. It marks the prize from this year's 'Community Magazine Awards' sponsored by Cambridge Building Society that was presented to *Willingham News* at a ceremony on 13 July. Our magazine was judged 'Most Improved' community magazine in the Cambridgeshire region in 2016.

In presenting the award, the judges stated that our magazine 'illustrated a good range of activities, is very readable with a lively style and a clear modern layout.'

The Awards Ceremony, held at Cambridge United Football Club, is now in its 18th year. It is an annual event that recognises the work of the many community magazines produced in the area (within a 30-mile radius of Cambridge) over the previous year. These range from quite small and infrequent publications, like *The Wilbraham Warbler* and the *Orwell Bulletin*, to massive, full-colour magazines, like *The Villager* and *Fen Scene*, that serve a wide catchment area and have huge print runs of up to 80,000 copies.

In our category of 'high frequency' publications, that is 10-12 issues per year, the results were:

Bronze award: Buckden Roundabout

Our award, Most Improved, covered all categories.

Nature Notes

We have recently taken to visiting the Community Orchard more frequently and are pleased to report that after all the efforts of Graham Mumby and other Willingham Action Group (WAG) volunteers, the orchard is maturing very well. Sowing and planting of seeds and bulbs last year has produced some fine displays. In the wildflower areas the purple chequered flowers of snake-head fritillaries and bright yellow wild tulips stood out amongst the fronds of various grasses. Other wildflowers included marsh-mallow, lady's bedstraw, creeping field bindweed, black knapweed, field scabious and meadow cranesbill.

The wildflower areas have, in turn, attracted a good number of insects. Various bee species buzz around the foliage and crickets, grasshoppers and beetles crawl among the grasses. There were at least two species of damselfly, together with ruddy darter dragonfly, hovering and darting over these areas. A visit in early July resulted in sightings of seven species of butterfly: small copper, meadow brown, gatekeeper, small tortoiseshell, common blue, large white and small skipper. Also, a silvery moth plus unidentified smaller, daytime flying moths flitted about.

Why not visit this lovely orchard yourselves, after all it is your community orchard to enjoy? Take your family for a picnic in the area created for that purpose. Do be careful where you walk and, although the fruit can be picked when ready, please do not pick the wildflowers.

Anti-Social Behaviour

Following the good news on dog mess in the village reported in last month's *Willingham News* it is disappointing to report that there is an increasing problem on the Recreation Ground. This is totally unacceptable in an area where children play football. Please would dog owners respect the 'No Dogs' sign on the board outside the Pavilion and stop using the Recreation Ground to exercise their dogs and access the field beyond.

It is also very disappointing to other anti-social report behaviour. Vandals have broken floodlights on the Recreation Ground and in the QEII Field have cut through a seat on the seesaw and broken the fence surrounding the toddler area – as these photographs show. These facilities are very expensive to repair and the cost falls upon local residents. This damage is a criminal offence so if you see any vandalism occurring please report it to our PCSO (contact details on Page 3), with a copy to the Parish Clerk. There is also a major problem with litter in these areas. Used nappies have been left lying on the grass. Please use the bins provided and if the bins are full - as sometimes happens when these very popular facilities are heavily used - please take your litter home. - Putting up shelves
- Assembling 'flat pack' items
- Fitting blinds/curtains
- Tacking down fraying carpets
- Changing light bulbs (free of charge if completed at assessment)
- Cleaning gutters
- Small repairs (gates, locks, changing fuses)
- Renewing shower sealant

Here we see the two Miss Olivers with the Oliver's Bakery van. The text says 'S. Oliver. Baker Flour & Corn Dealer'. Around 1910, Sayers Oliver with his wife Emily built a new bakery on the corner of Church Street and Church Lane after the previous building burned down. The Oliver family ran the bakery through the generations and the shop (which is still a bakery) remained with that name well into the 1990s. In the days before preservatives, bread didn't last long so baking started early and the fresh loaves were delivered to the door as soon as possible. This picture is probably taken in the 1920s.
