



OWLS Community Car Scheme

For many elderly people the winter brings with it worries about falling on slippery ground when out walking or concerns about driving in hazardous conditions. A walk to the doctors or local shop which was relatively easy in the summer, or a drive to attend an outpatient appointment can seem a different prospect entirely in the winter months.

If this applies to you, a family member, friend or neighbour then why not think about using or suggesting OWLS for those journeys. OWLS is a local Community Car Service operated by DBS cleared volunteers who themselves live in Over, Willingham, Longstanton or Swavesey. It offers a door-to-door return service to those people who are unable to access other means of transport to attend medical appointments or make some social journeys. Customers pay 30p a mile with a minimum charge of £3.


October meeting

End of Year Update from Lucy Frazer MP

I wanted to take the opportunity to wish all my constituents a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. This year has flown by with so much to do and an unexpected election on top! I have been pursuing with vigour the roll out of superfast broadband across the constituency, regularly meeting and speaking with all involved, pressing for more, quicker! I am also pursuing a campaign to get South East Cambridgeshire selected as a testbed for the trialing of the next generation of digital infrastructure through industrial 5G pilots.

As most of you will know by now, education is a passion of mine and I am relentless in my efforts to pursue fairer funding for our schools. I take every opportunity to engage with both schools and the Secretary of State for Education to ensure our requirements are front of mind. I welcome the recent announcement of $\pounds 3.1$ million more for our constituency and I will continue on this mission to pursue funding wherever it is available.

Other projects I am involved with around education include enticing businesses to work hand in hand with schools with specific reference to Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM subjects) and building pathways to future careers in local businesses. I am also driving a project to reduce the costs of teacher recruitment through an online government website.

Infrastructure projects occupy a lot of my time, fighting for necessary funding and maintaining a presence where projects are underway to ensure where possible they remain on schedule and on budget.

I was pleased to be present to mark the opening of the Daniels End affordable housing development earlier this year. I enjoy every opportunity I have to meet with constituents from all walks of life, whether welcoming groups and individuals to Westminster, or myself attending a Rotary club meeting, joining a Women's Institute gathering, opening a summer fete, chatting at an open meeting, or meeting constituents in my surgeries – I never pass up the chance to exchange views and hear any issues constituents may have.

This year's Christmas card will once again feature the artwork of one of our talented primary school children and every card will carry the 'EACH' logo raising awareness of less fortunate children in our midst. Our senior school pupils have been busy debating in my fourth annual inter schools debating competition which culminates in a final debate at the House of Commons. I am so grateful for all the support I receive from constituents, young and old, and I look forward to working as hard as I can on your behalf in the coming year.

The wedding of Ruth Cane to James Sills in about 1932 was remembered in Willingham for years as the nearest thing to a 'society wedding'. Ruth's father, Dr Cane, was the village doctor and they lived in The Limes which lies at the west end of Newington (where this picture was taken). Recently I received a memoir written by Ursula Boston (nee Cane) and written down by her daughter Kate. Ursula is the bridesmaid on the left and is now 93 years old. Of course, Ursula remembers the day and was able to tell us that the bridesmaid on the right was her cousin and that at the back was the sister of the groom. Here is an extract from her memoir: '*Father was the local GP and dispensed his own medicines.* Surgery in the house and folk just walked in. People would pay with eggs, fruit, etc. He took in maternity cases when housing unsuitable for confinement'.

From the Parish Council

Parish Councillors try and help improve our village and in some respects this happens but sadly, it is not the case on all issues. On some we seem to be moving backwards.

Traffic

A subject of regular and entirely reasonable complaint is that there is too much through traffic and far too many HGVs. The Parish Council has lobbied continuously for improvement but the Highways department at our County Council do not listen or perhaps do not wish to hear. As one parishioner pointed out at length last month, after being trapped in Tesco's car park for an hour, not only do they do nothing to help, but they are not even very good at communicating issues. It does sound like a department that could use some new blood. We will keep lobbying our County Councillor, please do the same, the more emails he receives, the more likely we are to see some action, timothy.wotherspoon@cambridgeshire.gov.uk.

On the same subject the Parish Council is trying to gather solid data. We installed two Nitrous Oxide test kits at central locations to measure emissions. These are quite simple devices consisting of test tubes that can tell us the NO2 levels in the atmosphere. They are mounted above eye level on street furniture. Sadly one has been stolen. What conceivable use or value it could have is unclear but if you do see someone looking vacantly at a test tube and wondering what to do next could you let us know please, which brings me to the next subject.

Crime

It is true that we live in a relatively low crime area but that is little comfort to those villagers that are on the receiving end of burglary, theft, criminal damage or anti-social behaviour. Equally worrying is the apparent lack of police interest. They claim that they simply do not have the resources to deal with low level crime. You will find it difficult to get any response on the 101 number and even 999 calls do not automatically trigger a physical response. What we would recommend is that for non emergency problems you use the following link <u>www.cambs.police.uk/</u><u>report/</u>. The advantage of doing so is that your complaint goes on record and that if there are enough complaints action will be taken.

Meanwhile your Parish Council will continue to press for greater police presence and use the link to ensure any damage to council property is always reported. There is also a nominated police liaison contact, currently Councillor Carlton, who attends local police meetings and maintains contact with local officers.

Be Winter Ready

We put in a reminder last month that winter weather can be seriously bad for our health and recommended getting expert advice from your pharmacist, making sure you get your flu jab, stocking up your medicine cabinet and keeping warm with more information available at <u>www.nhs.co.uk/staywell</u>. To this we would add advice from the energy suppliers to make sure that appliances are serviced and in safe working order, that you keep a couple of torches within easy reach and that if you do suffer a power cut you dial 105 for further information. Also can we ask that you keep an eye out for any vulnerable neighbours? Christmas

Finally, to try and end on a more upbeat note, I am delighted to be able to tell you that Councillor Manning has agreed to take on the role of leading Green and Boundaries, ably assisted by Councillor Cook. And even better news, they have obtained a Christmas tree free of charge and will be installing it on the Green very shortly. Councillor Manning has said that he will hold the ladder as Councillor Cook puts up the decorations. Enjoy the tree and enjoy the holiday.

The Parish Council sends very best wishes for Christmas and the New Year to all parishioners.

Members of the public are welcome to attend and speak briefly or ask questions but must identify themselves before the meeting. To ensure everyone has a fair chance to speak a total of 15 minutes will be allocated to the public forum with a limit of three minutes per person.

The next meeting dates are **6 December** and **10 January 2018**. The meetings are held in the Octagon at 7 30 pm.



PASTORAL LETTER

SUNDAY - DAY OF REST OR DAY OF FEAST ?

It is commonly known that on the Sabbath/Sunday we should have some rest, a time for the recuperation of our strength. The Jews, in celebrating this day of rest, are driven by the paradox of not even pressing the buttons of the lifts in all public buildings in order to avoid the direct abuse of the Sabbath. What is the main message regarding the Sabbath day for them; it indicates the seventh day dedicated to God's rest after the six days of the creative work of shaping the Universe.

Christianity introduced Sunday with the same connotations; the day of rest in respect for the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, early on Sunday morning on the First Easter, after three days laying in the tomb.

At the end of the day both religions are similarly right, we should have some break after a tiring week's work.

For Jews the Sabbath was established after the miraculous crossing of the Red Sea and at the same time the total defeat of the Pharaoh's army. The Israelites, resting at the sea shore during their Exodus from Egypt, suddenly found themselves trapped between open sea and the Pharaoh's army approaching from behind. God, performed through the ministry of Moses, a double event: the opening of the waters of the sea and the complete destruction of the military forces of Egypt at the same time.

From that time on the Israelites celebrate the Sabbath – and in particular the Passover Feast – as the memorial of that event. On the Sabbath celebration, every week, the family makes sure that this event of the Past will never be forgotten and should be commemorated every Saturday for the benefit of the youngest generation.

Christians celebrate the Sunday Services in their churches for the benefit of God Almighty as the Lord of the Universe and Praiseworthy Lord of Host. But they seem to forget that on Sunday God is also promising to perform repeatedly in our lives His miracles. The most promising miracle of Jesus, who being truly dead has victoriously risen to life, is a token of the same event in the lives of those who believe in Jesus' factual death and resurrection! He is alive by means of the Eucharistic Sacrifice which brings to memory the event of Christ's death and resurrection. In present time, and in particular during each and every Eucharist celebration in all Churches united in faith with the Church of Rome and in the Orthodox Church as well, He comes alive in His Body and Blood as the merits and reward of His Bloody Sacrifice on the Cross for the benefit of those who receive Him in the Holy Communion.

Jesus himself performed His miracles on the Sabbath day, many times, having in mind one specific message: this is the Day of Goodness and Wonders for the benefit of all who await His action in their lives

Maybe it is worthy of notice that during Sunday Eucharist, God is laying His table, not only for the banquet, but also He is waiting on us ready to give the most expected graces because of that special day. Are we capable of expressing on that day our longings, dreams, expectations, hopes and worries? Are we aware of the burdens and weights connected with our sufferings, struggles and pains, very often sprinkled with our tears and sweat? That's us – very human, and very needy to see miracles in our lives.

So come to the Mass on Sunday and express what you have in your heart.

Do you think that God will not listen to the true needs of His children?

Let Him know what bothers you and then wait for His actions. He specializes in miracles.



Sherry Jerez – Yes please!

Clive Pawsey, the leader of the Willingham Wine Appreciation Group (aka Willingham Winos), had just one mission on organising a team visit to Jerez, the heart of sherry production in the south of Spain. 'I'd like everyone to open their minds to sherry, so that they buy one bottle in the coming year,' he challenged. Given few of us were keen on sherry – except in trifle, 20 members were willing to take the challenge.

We visited the huge González Byass winery in the heart of Jerez (the home of Tio Pepe and Croft Original). We were expertly taught by tasting eight different sherries – before lunch! Croft Original was our least favourite and apparently only made for the British market. A meal at the small Bodegas Rey Fernando de Castilla paired sherry with every course. Finally, a tour of Bodegas Tradición gave a privileged view of their fabulous art collection as well as tasting sherries with tapas in a wonderful shady courtyard. In between there was ample time for sightseeing both within Jerez and beyond to Cadiz.

Should you want to try at home but are not sure where to start, here is what we learnt. Most sherries are dry. Treat sherry just like wine but, at between 15-18%, respect the alcohol content! We all had different favourites; Manzanilla and Fino are pale dry sherries to drink chilled before a meal with snacks such as salted almonds, cheese, olives, Ibérico ham or with fish or seafood starters; lightly chilled Amontillado sherries are delicious with chicken, Spanish rice and braised vegetable dishes; Oloroso is complex and fabulous served with roasts or stews. For a blast of dark sweetness at the end of a meal, try sherry made with the Pedro Ximénez grape, delicious with blue cheese, chocolatey desserts or ditch the glass and pour directly over vanilla ice cream. Challenge completed!

Enough is enough!

In the past ten years that I have been living in Willingham I have seen the traffic through the village increase in number and in size. Over the past six months the traffic has been horrendous thundering through the village, rattling windows and causing a temporary eclipse in front rooms. Cars and enormous lorries; the pollution levels must be a concern, the safety of our children crossing the road, not to mention the constant damage to Earith Road where it is more like a roller coaster than a tranquil canal road. The traffic is so heavy at peak times that I cannot get my car out of the drive and my family are quicker walking from the guided bus than asking for a lift!

I have to point out that this is before Northstowe is fully occupied, before the new homes on the Aspinal site are sold and there are many more developments around the village. Ideally we need a bypass. In the meantime I would suggest a weight limit to the size of lorries allowed to drive through the village.

If you feel as strongly as I do please contact the Parish Council, County Council and our MP. Only by expressing your opinion are we likely to get some change.
