Health and Safety – what's that? Here we see Milford Jeeps, who lived his entire life in the village and died only recently, driving a load of empty fruit trays, probably to Berrycroft Stores. The huge stack of trays beside him is tied to the motorbike side-car! Tens of thousands of these trays were used to transport fruit and flowers to market via the railway at Longstanton and were returned and reused. This picture is probably taken in the 1950s. Milford has no helmet and the motorbike has 'L' plates! Somehow he survived to a ripe old age though.

Over Village Market

Over Village Market (OVM) is a successful community enterprise, showcasing local artisans, which has attracted a growing number of customers and stallholders since the inaugural market in October 2015.

The Market was co-founded by three successful local food producers: Fen End Country Kitchen, whose range of preserves and chutneys has attracted success in the Great Taste Food Awards; ORB Real Bread, Cambridgeshire Food Producer of the Year Finalist in 2015 and Rosegate Farm Butchery, Cambridgeshire Food and Drink Awards Producer of the Year 2017. Co-founder, Heather Sturman of Fen End Country Kitchen says, 'There is a lovely atmosphere at each event with stallholders having the time to chat to people about their produce; a wonderful little tea, coffee and cakes outlet, fabulous hot food and local musicians to entertain us all.'

All stall holders must come from within a 30 mile radius of Over and there are around 15 - 20 different stalls at each event with a combination of regulars and occasional attendees giving a wide range of things to buy including preserves, ceramics, fruit and vegetables, flowers, chocolates, cheese, handmade jewellery, meat, cider, homemade cards, children's books and handmade candles. The market takes place between 10 am and 12 30 pm on the Green in Over.

This thriving artisan and crafts market has grown year on year and is a great community success story, with around 100 visitors to each event. It is run on a voluntary basis with profits donated to local charities. Last year's beneficiary was Over Day Care Centre who received a £300 cheque to provide services for older, frail and often socially isolated people in the community.

Monday 29 January was a significant date in the history of Willingham, as the Willingham Jam Club celebrated its 10th Anniversary and what a show-stopping, diverse and stomping night it turned out to be.

Held on the last Monday evening of each month at the Social Club (with a break from June to August), the Jam Club is renowned for introducing musicians of all standards and musical persuasion to each other, enabling them to learn and grow as musicians, with many over the years forming bands and music collaborations that continue to perform to wider audiences.

That Monday had a special buzz about it as Jam Club members and guest musicians, old and new, came together to celebrate 10 years of musical magic, all conjured up from within our vibrant and creative village.

With Adrian on percussion bells, accompanying his wife, Peng Li on vocals, they performed a beautiful, gentle and tender traditional song called *Moli Hua* which means Jasmine flower. The song originates from Pang Li's place of origin (Wuhan in Hubei province in China) and the audience were spellbound by the gentle simplicity of the performance.

The first full band to grace the stage on the evening was 'The Queen Bee Blues Band', featuring our very own Julian on lead and rhythm guitar. The band gave an entertaining and highly polished performance with Beatrice Balzarotti on lead vocals radiating stage presence and top draw vocals to deliver blues at its very best.

'Jambalaya', a keyboard and vocals duo then took to the stage and entertained us with their take on a couple of classic standards before Jam club regular Bob Simpson brought his band 'Stone Cold Stumble' to the stage, delivering a set that enabled these guys to showcase their true talent as a tight and musically gifted band. Outcomes of Community Governance Review for Willingham and Over

The full Council of South Cambridgeshire District Council met on 25 January. Its business included consideration of a recommendation from its Civic Affairs Committee that a new boundary between Willingham and Over be adopted. Following a lengthy discussion an alternative, amended boundary line was agreed. This new boundary would move all the properties around Highgate Farm and to the west of Haden Way into Willingham. A map showing the agreed boundary can be seen on the Parish Council website. The Local Government Boundary Commission for England will also be asked to re-align the County Council boundary along the new parish boundary.

The Parish Council is very grateful for the support of local District Councillors, especially Councillor Manning, who have had to work very hard to bring this Review to this positive result.

District and Parish Council Elections

All current District and Parish Councillors have to stand for reelection on the **3 May**. If you would like to consider becoming a Parish Councillor, nomination forms for candidates are now available from the Parish Office. Completed nomination forms should be returned by hand to South Cambridgeshire Council's offices at Cambourne, no later than **6 April**. To be qualified to stand for election you have to fulfil simple pre-conditions. These are stated on the nomination papers. Further information may also be obtained from: elections@scambs.gov.uk or the Electoral Commission website (www.electoralcommission.org.uk).

Willingham's Electricity Supply

In recent weeks there have been several short periods when the electricity supply to the village has been disrupted. UK Power Networks have confirmed that some of these faults have been due to debris hitting lines during the recent strong winds. In addition a fault has been identified and repaired on a high-voltage line running between Burwell and Aldreth. Poor tree maintenance is not currently considered to be an issue. UK Power Networks are reluctant to install underground cabling because of potential damage caused by farmers.

If you are concerned about the welfare of vulnerable family members and neighbours who lose their electricity supply during these disruptions, encourage them to register with their utility suppliers who have a responsibility to prioritise the needs of these customers.

Willingham's New Defibrillator

The Parish Council has purchased a second defibrillator and this has been sited on the Village Library building. The support of our Library staff in helping the Parish Council complete this is gratefully acknowledged. Training in using a defibrillator will be provided by a qualified first-responder during April – further details will be provided.

Stopping Fraud

Financial fraud can be prevented by remembering the following points. Firstly, a genuine bank or financial organisation will never contact you 'out of the blue' to ask for your PIN or password. You can ignore any requests to move money into different accounts. Secondly, never allow access to your personal or financial details by automatically clicking on links in an unexpected email or text. Thirdly, if you have an uninvited approach from someone on the doorstep claiming to represent a company, contact this company directly by telephone or email before allowing someone to enter your home.

Making Metals Matter

Please make sure that all household metal packaging – drink and food cans, foil trays and wrap, empty aerosols and screw tops – is placed within your blue bin for recycling. It is estimated that if all household metal packaging from Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire was collected it would save the equivalent of taking 812 cars off local streets for a year.

Hospital Waiting Lists: Please note that some hospital departments currently have very long waiting lists. Once your referral has been sent to the hospital, the GP has very little power to expedite your appointment or move you up the waiting list. The hospital is responsible for prioritising your referral. Moving a patient up the waiting list will obviously lead to a longer wait for someone else. If you are concerned your referral has been lost or forgotten, we are happy to check on the progress for you. Please contact the surgery if you are concerned.

School Letters: We cannot supply letters to confirm that children have been brought to surgery or that doctors' advice has been sought. This has to be done on the basis of clinical need rather than for administrative purposes. The local schools have been informed of the practice policy, and they should contact us directly with your consent if they require any further information.

Flu: The GP Surgery and hospitals are currently experiencing a high volume of patients with flu and winter vomiting. Flu is a common infectious viral illness spread by coughs and sneezes. It can be very unpleasant, but you'll usually begin to feel better within about a week. GPs don't recommend antibiotics for flu because they won't relieve your symptoms or speed up your recovery. Flu is very infectious and easily spread to other people, so please do not attend the surgery unless you fall into one of the following categories:

Call NHS 111 or see your GP if:

- you're worried about your baby's or child's symptoms
- you're 65 or over
- you're pregnant
- you have a long-term medical condition for example, diabetes or a heart, lung, kidney or neurological disease
- you have a weakened immune system for example, because of chemotherapy or HIV
- your symptoms don't improve after 7 days

You should attend A&E or call 999

- if you develop sudden chest pain
- have difficulty breathing
- start coughing up blood

Winter Vomiting: Norovirus, which causes diarrhoea and vomiting, is one of the most common stomach bugs in the UK. Norovirus can be very unpleasant but it usually clears up by itself in a few days. You can normally look after yourself or your child at home. Try to avoid going to your GP, as norovirus can spread to others very easily. Call your GP or

News from The Royal Society for Protection Of Birds

What has been happening at Fen Drayton Lakes

We and our volunteers had a busy winter working away to improve the lakes for both people and wildlife. Over on the North West of Elney Lake we have removed some willow and other mature trees to give a long view across. This adds an interesting element to one of the most wooded walks on offer across the reserve. We've also done a great deal of work to open up the popular route to the Ferry Mere shelter, in an attempt to allow the path to remain dryer and firmer under foot. This kind of work also helps to revitalise and diversify the vegetation.

Wildlife

Bitterns returned to spend the winter, with up to three being seen at once from the Elney viewpoint adjacent to the busway. Moreover, this view point has also produced barn owl, marsh harrier, bearded tit and snipe. Unfortunately the starlings did not swarm to the reserve on mass this winter, but there were sometimes a couple of thousand gathering at dusk.

This evening, I was driving home after a hard day at work, through Berrycroft, going past the row of businesses opposite the Chinese takeaway, when I noticed a paperboy or girl walking along the pavement. Their newspaper carrying bag was clearly visible. The young person in question was engrossed in their mobile phone (or tablet) - I could see the light. They were not looking where they were going, they just trudged along in the dark.

Suddenly, without taking their eyes off the screen of their device, they turned to the right, and walked into the road, right in front of me. I swerved to avoid them, and came to a stop beside Berrycroft Stores. I looked to see if they were OK, but they just carried on walking as if I wasn't there, and continued on their way, crossing over the road and going into the Chinese take away.

I was shocked and shaking; it had been a very near miss. This clearly shows that the use of mobile devices is as dangerous for pedestrians as it is for drivers.

I rang the newsagent as soon as I got home, spoke to a staff member and advised that the paper delivery kids be made aware of the dangers of walking whilst using a mobile device, especially on a dark winter evening. However the chap I spoke to was not a Willingham resident, and he had no idea as to where the incident in question had occurred.

Would these paper delivery kids ride their bikes with no lights on?

Yes, I do enjoy a daily newspaper, but the life of a child is too high a price to pay.

Dear Sir,

I'm writing to share recent information obtained after a call to UK Power Networks on Saturday 27 January. As many residents will be aware, we have been subject to frequent, brief power cuts throughout January, sometimes a few each week. The customer service representative at UK Power Networks acknowledged that our local district had seen 'a lot of outages since 2 January' and explained that each time power was lost to some 5,000 plus houses and businesses. This obviously has some worrying consequences for elderly residents living alone (some with crucial medical equipment requiring uninterrupted power supply), people working from home, and our local businesses.

She explained that the problem seemed to be caused by automatic network fault detection turning off power, probably due to interruptions to signals in local high voltage wires - likely from overgrown trees, combined with recent winds and storms. UK Power Networks have sent out engineering crews to inspect the wires, but no cause has been found as yet.

May I suggest that:

1. Local residents and landowners check for trees overhanging the larger high voltage wires in and around the village (and allow tree trimming if on non-council land),

2. The Parish Council once again liaises with the authorities to ensure a quick and effective solution to this

problem, as they did when we had power network problems a few years ago.
