Lily Bonus

Lily Bonus will be 100 years old on 1 July and will receive her telegram from the Queen. Lily, who we believe to be the oldest resident in the village, was born in Cambridge and moved to Longstanton with her family when she was 16. She has two younger sisters, one is 96 and the other sister, who lives in Australia, is 94. Lily met her husband, Keith who passed away in 1995, on a Sunday School outing by train to Hunstanton. They married and rented their first home in Berrycroft for four shillings and sixpence a week back in 1943. Four years later they bought their house in



Church Street and lived there until 1981. Keith, who was born and bred in Willingham, grew corn and flowers which were sent to Liverpool for sale. Lily has two daughters Yvonne, who also lives in the village, and Ruth who lives in Papworth.

Lily went to school in Cambridge and left at the age of 14. The very next day she went to work as a maid for a doctor. She remembers having to wear a uniform with a little hat which she hated and would remove if she had to leave the doctor's house on an errand. She also recalls being confronted with a hoover for the first time in her life and being 'frightened to death by it'. Her next job was at Chivers' fruit farm where she worked as an overseer, earning 28 shillings and sixpence a week. During the war years she worked on the land with her husband, flower cutting and potato picking.

Lily, who has a remarkable memory for dates, facts and details, remembers that there was a shop at the Over crossroads which was run by Liz Cole. (This shop later became Ravens) Keith used to take his ration book there and buy sweets and chocolates which he then cycled to

Longstanton with when he was courting Lily. She also remembers a big fire at Hayns, a general store which was where the Co-op is now. She came to Willingham on the crossbar of a local lad's bike to watch the fire.

Over the years Lily has been very much involved with village life. She helped to start a playgroup at the Church hall with a friend, Mrs Brooks, and ran this for eight years. She was very much involved with the church for 70 years and always did the flower arrangement in the church porch. She also used to do a lot for an annual village garden fete held in the then

doctor's house, The Limes. Her daughter remembers the front room of their home in Church Street being filled with cakes, many of which were homemade by Lily. She was also a member of the WI, which she loved and the Mothers' Union.

Lily remembers Feast week and how she always had a new coat for the event but then it was often so hot she couldn't wear it! Her daughters always had new socks and shoes which they had to change out of as soon as they returned home from the church.

Lily has 12 great grandchildren. She keeps her mind active and alert by playing Scrabble at the Over Day Centre and by doing word searches. She enjoys all the quiz programmes on television. Every other week she is collected by the Owls service and attends the Salvation Army lunch. She used to love swimming as a young girl and was still swimming in her eighties, when she also swam a mile for charity.

She is a remarkable lady and *Willingham News* congratulates her on her 100th birthday.

WORKAWAYERS IN WILLINGHAM

Have you heard of 'Workaway'? Probably not. Nor had I until a few months ago. It is a great idea so I thought people may like to know about it. Its philosophy is simple – it promotes fair exchange, volunteering and work opportunities between budget travellers, language learners or culture seekers who can stay with families, individuals or organisations that are looking for help with a range of varied and interesting activities. It was set up to promote cultural understanding between different peoples and countries of the world. In exchange for a few hours honest help per day your Workaway friend will be given food and accommodation and a chance to learn about the local lifestyle and community with varying hosts in different situations. Your Workawayer will live as a member of your family for the time they are with you.

So, I hear you ask – how does it work? A database of families across the world have registered as Hosts and their profile states what sort of help they are looking for. It can be domestic help in the house, gardening, cooking, help with animal care, painting, specific projects...you name it – the list is endless! Workawayers look for a placement and contact the hosts via the site and you take it from there. Their stay can be for whatever length of time is mutually agreed. Since October 2017 we have had three workawayers – two lovely German girls who are now new friends. Our recent Workawayer was from Spain, so she will have improved her English and we have brushed up our Spanish!

I cannot recommend this scheme enough – it has worked brilliantly so far. Refreshingly there is no age barrier – there are a wide range of people doing workaway. So if you think you would like to explore this idea further go to <u>workaway</u>. <u>info</u>. Simple.

BOOK REVIEW *The Muse* by Jessie Burton

The book is set in 1960s London with flashbacks to Spain on the cusp of the Civil War and revolves round a painting which comes onto the market for sale.

In the 1960s Odelle Bastien arrives from Trinidad hoping to find her way in London and eventually finds a job at an Art Gallery where she is taken under the wing of Marjorie Quick.

Three decades earlier in Spain, the Schloss family, Harold, Sarah and daughter, Olive, escaping from Nazi rule, become acquainted with Isaac Robles and his half-sister, Theresa – though not even Theresa foresees what lies ahead as both mother and daughter embark on a love affair with Isaac. Meanwhile, Isaac accepts a commission to paint a portrait of Olive and her mother which thrills Olive, who, unknown to her parents, has been offered a place at an Art School in London.

The Muse is easy to read, having a good pace and being well-written. Love, suspense and intrigue are all on offer. Jessie Burton also wrote *The Miniaturist*, a bestseller.

Parish

The comments in Willingham News from the Parish Council are written on a rota basis by six different councillors. This shares the load but more importantly ensures a variety of styles and opinions. It is my pleasure as council chairman to present the comments this month

I know that not everyone will be pleased to hear that I am back as chair for the third time. Let me assure you that this is not due to an inflated ego but a lack of other candidates. Whilst it is a privilege to chair the council, having done it twice before for a total of six years, I can well understand that you may have preferred to see a new face.

I should have preferred to see one myself. I am a great believer in rotating chairmanships. That way you get new ideas. The good news is that the council does have some new and very able councillors who have put their hands up for future leading roles. David Carlton has agreed to be my vice chair and will, I hope, be able to take over next year as chairman.

As you will know, we had elections in May which resulted in 13 councillors being returned unopposed. The remaining two posts have since been filled by co-option so I am pleased to say that for now we have a parish council at full strength. However, at least one councillor is likely to be moving out of the village shortly which will create a new vacancy. Please do consider putting your name forward. We are regarded as progressive and well run and can promise new members a very warm welcome.

District

As reported last month, SCDC also had elections in May that saw the Liberal Democrats sweep the board and enabled them to form a strong majority at Cambourne. They promise that their priorities will be affordable housing, the environment and supporting business growth.

For Willingham and Over we have two new Liberal Democrat councillors, Dawn Percival who lives in Willingham and Bill Handley who lives in Over. Both of them came along to our parish council meetings in May and June. They have promised to hold quarterly surgeries in Willingham from the end of July. The surgeries will be held in the Ploughman Hall between 11 am and midday on 28 July, 27 October and in 2019 on 26 January.

Some of you may remember Dawn's grandmother. She taught at the primary school for many years and had among her alumni councillors Cook and Manning. How hard is that!

County

Your county councillor, Tim Wotherspoon came along to the Annual

Parish Meeting and took on a series of questions about highways. Potholes and HGV traffic featured strongly and are high on Tim's agenda. He mentioned a scheme of summer repair work to improve the road surfaces that will try to avoid so many problems next winter and also a potential new road link from the top of the M11 into the fens that could provide significant benefits to Willingham. However, that is some time away with the route still to be decided and funding to be agreed.

Unfortunately, Tim was not at our June meeting when further issues were raised regarding the volume and speed of traffic through the village. The clerk will be in contact with him on these matters. Tim usually attends parish council meetings when you can ask him questions or you can contact him at:

Tips to Keep Your Child Safe in the Sun

- Encourage your child to play in the shade for example, under trees especially between 11 am and 3 pm, when the sun is at its strongest.
- Keep babies under the age of six months out of direct sunlight, especially around midday.
- Cover exposed parts of your child's skin with sunscreen, even on cloudy or overcast days. Use one that has a sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 or above and is effective against UVA and UVB. Don't forget to apply it to their shoulders, nose, ears, cheeks, and the tops of their feet. Reapply often throughout the day.
- Be especially careful to protect your child's shoulders and the back of their neck when they're playing, as these are the most common areas for sunburn.
- Cover your child up in loose cotton clothes, such as an oversized T- shirt with sleeves.
- Get your child to wear a floppy hat with a wide brim that shades their face and neck.
- Protect your child's eyes with sunglasses that meet the British Standard (BSEN 1836:2005) and carry the CE mark check the label.
- If your child is swimming, use a waterproof sunblock of factor 15 or above. Reapply after towelling.

Update From Your District Councillors

Dawn Percival lives in Willingham and Bill Handley lives in Over but we have decided that (to begin with at least) we will both cover the complete ward rather than concentrate on our own villages; that way we will be able to cover for each other during holiday times, illness etc.

Councillor Roles

We have now been assigned duties in the District Council and have begun the necessary training. Dawn has been appointed vice-chair of the Employment and Staffing Committee, which sits well with her professional qualifications and experience in Human Resources. Dawn will also sit on the Scrutiny and Overview Committee as well as the Advisory Board for the new Customer Service and Business Improvement Portfolio. Bill will be taking up roles on three committees: Planning, Licensing and Scrutiny and Overview.

Housing Land Supply aka 'the Local Plan'

South Cambridgeshire District Council now considers that it can demonstrate a five year housing land supply 'local plan' and can demonstrate that there is enough land readily available to build the number of homes that the government has stipulated needs to be built. This will give our planners the confidence to apply policies which are designed to protect the village's character and to reject inappropriate, speculative developments (such as those outside of the village framework).

Future reports in *Willingham News* will contain updates relating to (or likely to affect) residents such as significant council decisions and notifications of new-build planning applications. Once we get going, we would be grateful for any feedback so we can improve what we do.

Construction Traffic

Residents of Willingham and other surrounding villages are being subjected to unacceptable numbers of construction vehicles travelling through the village which are accessing Northstowe and the A14 improvement works. On 16 May, the 'Lorry Watch Group', consisting of some members of the Willingham Action Group and other Willingham residents, conducted a Lorry Survey. The survey revealed that in a 12 hour period (6 am to 6 pm), 337 HGVs were recorded using the B1050, of which 120 were likely to be construction vehicles serving Northstowe and the A14.

Dawn is currently liaising with South Cambridgeshire District Council officers to ensure the conditions outlined in the Northstowe site wide 'Construction and Environmental Management Plan' (CEMP) are adhered to. This Plan states that the B1050 is not an approved route for construction vehicles accessing Northstowe.

The Northstowe Transport Working group is a group designed to address Northstowe transport issues. This Group was suspended, but will shortly be restored. Members of the public are welcome to attend the Northstowe Community Forum.

Dawn is also liaising with Cambridgeshire County Council to explore what else can be done to reduce the number of construction vehicles travelling through the village.

We will keep you informed on future developments.

Cambridgeshire Family History Society is pleased to announce an exciting new project which is currently in its early stages. Working in partnership with Wisbech and Fenland Museum, the Society is embarking on an ambitious project to digitise 32 parish registers which are currently in the Museum collection, over 50,000 pages and 500,000 records from Cambridgeshire and Norfolk. The Museum and the Society have had the support of the Cambridgeshire Archives who have loaned specialist equipment to support this venture. We will be working through parish by parish and, as we finish a parish, the images will be released and will be published on the website. These will then be searchable on the Society's Ancestor Finder database, available to download by purchase of tokens, along with all other Society records.
