Willingham Craft Beer Festival

The Craft Beer Festival held over the last weekend in June was a great success. We had consistently positive feedback about the beers, the venue and the food from the people who came to the event, and the weather was very kind to us. Some of the comments left in our suggestion box were: 'Perfect venue!', 'Lovely, perfect. Thank you so much.' and 'This is an amazing event for the village, thank you, well organised and enjoyable evening'. We had no negative comments and several thoughtful suggestions for next year, but we all need a rest before thinking about that!

One of the nicest aspects of organising the festival was the community collection of the elderflowers that we used to flavour a special festival pale ale and a couple of ciders. Over two long and sunny afternoons at the beginning of June, a hard-working team of volunteers managed to strip 18 kg of flowers from their stems – a big thank you to all the 'strippers' and to the kind people who collected flowers during their weekend walks. Two-thirds of the flowers went straight to Three Blind Mice Brewery in Little Downham and by the end of Monday our festival beer was brewed. This is a fresh and flowery pale ale, hopped with a new English hop called Pioneer, slightly hazy and around 4.3% ABV. It was named 'To Infenity and a Frond!' and it went down extremely well at the festival. All the profits from the festival beer have been donated to the festival collection.

The list of breweries that were represented at the festival included some of the best known in the country. We had beer from Cloudwater, Brew By Numbers, Kernel, Adnams, Magic Rock, Northern Monk, Siren and Beavertown to name a few. In total, we tapped 26 cask beers and 29 keg beers, we had three sparkling ciders on keg and another dozen still ciders along with wine and artisan soft drinks. None of this would have been possible without the hard work and support of Chris and Linda of The Bank pub, and Yvan and Kathlene of Jolly Good Beer.

As well as drinks, we had a variety of entertainment and foody delights on offer. We would like to thank Guerrilla Kitchen who brought Chinese bao buns on Thursday and Friday, and Kura Kura who joined them on Friday bringing their Sri Lankan and Southern Indian street food. Thanks also to Fired Up Pizza who brought their wood-fired pizzeria and Azahar who brought artisanal Spanish street food on Saturday. On Sunday afternoon we had a great BBQ provided by the Longhorn Farmshop at Cuckoo Hill Farm.

The festival was sponsored by two local companies, Uttridge Accounting Ltd and Cambridge Medical Communication. Thanks very much to those two companies, whose sponsorship help to pay some of the upfront costs and removed some of the risk from the project.

The festival is set up as a non-profit

Community Interest Company, and that means that we will be donating the profits from the entry charges to the two charities that we are supporting this year – Over Day Centre (used by many Willingham residents) and Willingham Youth Trust. Once all the bills have been paid, there will be about $\pounds3000$ to share between the two charities.

Finally, I would like to mention our tireless and enthusiastic volunteers. We had 21 people who gave up their time to help at the beer festival, mostly working for six hours or more each, over the four days. We also had specialist help from several other friends in Willingham – you know who you are. Thank you, all volunteers, committee members and friends.

Old Willingham



A lot has been said recently about the 100 year anniversary of the first women getting the vote. In that context this month's photo is interesting. The scene is the noise and bustle of a threshing machine separating the wheat from the stalks. The cut wheat is put in the hopper on the right and the stalks come out on the left minus the wheat grains, which are collected in sacks underneath. What is interesting is that most of the workers are women – including members of the Jeeps family – with one carrying out the large sack. We don't know the date of this photo but it may well be in World War 1 when many men were away fighting. It was the integration of women into the workforce that was a factor in changing their role in society and winning them the right to vote.

Make a Willingham Windmill Pencil Topper

What you need:

- pencil with an eraser on the top
- pin with a coloured head (a drawing pin or map pin)
- square of coloured paper 15cm x 15cm
- ruler
- pair of scissors
- 1. Using a ruler, draw two diagonal lines across the square from corner to corner.
- 2. Carefully cut along the four lines from the corner to about 1cm from the middle (be careful not to cut too far).
- 3. Bend alternate corners into the centre of the paper and overlap each piece enough to be able to pin them together.
- 4. Hold the paper sails in front of the eraser on the top of the pencil and carefully push the pin through all four corners of the paper into the eraser (make sure the pin doesn't go right through and stick out the other side).
- 5. Test the windmill goes round by blowing gently on the side of it. If it doesn't spin, loosen the pin a little so the sails have more room to turn. You can also put a bead between the sail and the eraser to improve spinning if the pin is long enough.

From the Parish Council

Parish

I feel honoured to be accepted as the Vice Chair of the Parish Council and in particular to be given the opportunity to contribute to this great magazine.

Another role that I have on the Parish Council is that of police liaison. There has recently been a number of cases of anti-social behaviour around the Pavilion area, in particular the setting fire of a tree stump, damage to cricket nets and vandalism to one of the pavilion doors. As a result, we have met with the police and provided them with evidence of these acts; the outcome of the meeting has provided us with confidence that action will be taken to find the perpetrators. I have also placed a request from the police for information in relation to these incidents on the Willingham Village Facebook page and for those who have information but do not have access to this website, please ring 101 or, if you wish to remain anonymous, Crime Stoppers on 0800 555 111.

You can be assured that the Parish Council is determined to pursue perpetrators of anti-social behaviour and to recover costs wherever possible, including the recovery of costs from parents of any under-age offenders.

In addition to the anti-social behaviour, the Co-operative store experienced a ram raid in July. Consequently, the police were contacted to discuss the overall increase in crime in the village and they have agreed to arrange a community surgery to allay fears and to provide an increased presence. This meeting will be held at the Co-op in Willingham (12 High Street, Willingham, CB24 5ES) on Wednesday 15 August from 5 - 6 30 pm. Anyone interested should turn up at the time stated but note that space will be limited.

There is no doubt that criminal behaviour can give cause for concern and therefore the use of Neighbourhood Watch will be pursued. Clearly there will be work needed to bring this all together and I will work with the police to put in place the correct management processes to ensure we have an effective Neighbourhood Watch system. Meetings will be arranged once I have enough information so please give this some thought in the meantime.

Roads

I think we all experienced the negative impact of potholes on our roads throughout the village. We would like to give you advanced information that the High Street is due for more permanent repair during August and unfortunately this may cause some disruption during the day (9 30 am - 3 30 pm) between 8 and 17 August.

A Road Traffic Order is also being made by Cambridgeshire County Council to extend the existing 30 mph speed limit on Station Road to a point 66 metres south of Westfield and should mean we will see this in place very soon.

Other Matters

South Cambridgeshire District Council is offering existing businesses and start-ups the opportunity to attend FREE drop-in advice sessions and practical workshops at their offices in Cambourne. There are one-to-one sessions with advisors, workshops, advice and support and more detail can be found in the 'Latest news' section at <u>https://www.scambs.gov.uk/</u>nwessupport.

South Cambridgeshire District Council is also offering a number of summer sports camps in Athletics, Netball, Rounders and Kwik Cricket. Visit <u>www.scambs.gov.uk/sportscamps</u>. The cost is £24 per day and camps are open to children aged 7–14.

Sun Protection

Sunburn increases your risk of skin cancer. Sunburn doesn't just happen on holiday – you can burn in the UK, even when it's cloudy. There's no safe or healthy way to get a tan. A tan doesn't protect your skin from the sun's harmful effects. Don't rely on sunscreen alone to protect yourself from the sun. Wear suitable clothing and spend time in the shade when the sun's at its hottest between 11 am and 3 pm. Everyone who's exposed to UV light is at risk of getting sunburn, but some people are more vulnerable than others. You may be more vulnerable if you:

- have pale or white skin
- have freckles or red or fair hair
- tend to burn rather than tan
- have many moles
- have skin problems relating to a medical condition
- are only exposed to intense sun occasionally for example, while on holiday
- are in a hot country where the sun is particularly intense
- have a family history of skin cancer

Snow, sand, concrete and water can reflect the sun's rays on to your skin, and the sun is more intense at high altitudes.

District Councillor Update

HCVs

There continues to be an increasing and unacceptable number of construction vehicles travelling through the village, a significant number of which are HCVs suspected of travelling to and from the Northstowe site and the A14 improvement works.

The Northstowe Construction and Environmental Management Plan (CEMP) reveals that the B1050 is not a permitted route through Willingham for construction vehicles.

SCDC has requested that the Northstowe Transport Working Group (NTWG) be reinstated. This group, run by Cambridgeshire County Council, is an initiative between CCC, SCDC and Parish Councils. The group will be responsible for monitoring the traffic connected with Northstowe and will consider what preventative measures can be put in place to avoid further worsening of heavy goods vehicle traffic through the village.

Highways advise that A14 construction vehicles have established routes for deliveries, of which the B1050 is not one. The main routes the HCVs should use are the A14 itself, the A1198 and the A428. CCC's Infrastructure and Growth team has raised the issue with the A14 Integrated Delivery Team to remind construction companies of these restrictions.

There are many A14 main suppliers who also deliver to numerous other locations within the area and their journeys may be unconnected to the A14 improvement scheme. Book Review

Conclave by Robert Harris

The Pope has died, the Fisherman's Ring which he wore has been broken, and cardinals of the Catholic Church gather from across the world to Rome. They will be locked in 'cum clave' (with a key) until they have elected one of their number to the most powerful spiritual office on earth. Cardinal Jacopo Lomeli, as Dean of the College of Cardinals, is charged with the task of managing the conclave. Against the glorious background of the Sistine Chapel, he hopes that the centuries-old ritual of the ballots will lead to an acclaimed choice. Meanwhile, he must deal with deep divisions, intense ambitions hiding incipient scandals, the global media, his own uncertainties and the discovery that the dead pope may, or may not, have sacked one cardinal and created another with no official record.

Everyone in the group enjoyed the book, the story draws in the reader and the unusual setting is very thoroughly researched. There was a feeling that the twist at the end was somewhat over the top, but this hardly detracted from the entertainment value, and our scores out of ten were solidly clustered between seven and nine.
