Willingham Feast

At the time of writing there are still two events to take place, so this is about those so far. In some ways this is the best, and perhaps the worst Feast since Willingham Action Group (WAG) took over the coordination eight years ago.

The best, well the Beer Festival is reported on elsewhere but suffice to say it was a great success with the atmosphere of a party attended by friends, rather than a commercial event, but a substantial amount of money was raised towards getting a disabled toilet at the Social Club. The Custard Comedy nights at the social club are always well attended because everybody will be laughing all the time.

The first Willingham Feast Dog Show was a great success with a good number of competitors for each of the nine classes as well as the Scurry competition and the Obstacle Course. I was amazed by how you can fit at least 40 dogs into the Duke of Wellington beer garden and still have a highly organised fun-filled event (my favourite part being the 'best trick' section). The Youth Trust stepped in at short notice to run the barbecue and raised some money for their funds, while all the other activities enabled us to donate £200 to the Wood Green Animal Shelter.



For me, to decide on the best Feast event would be difficult but the Wine Quiz would come close. Teams consisted of between four and quite a lot of people, and the idea was to try to recognise things like grape variety, country of origin, alcohol content etc. It may have seemed that you needed to be quite expert, but the answers were multiple choice and for some participants it was just guesswork which meant there was no pressure. Copious amounts of wine and food were enjoyed, as well as dancing the night away to 'Cat's Whiskers', a band always guaranteed to get everyone on the dance floor.

However, my favourite event would have to be the Old Willingham night at the Baptist Hall. I have only lived here for 14 years but I love this village and it is fascinating to look at its history. This event managed to be both poignant and great fun at the same time. Anne Kirkman recounted details of the First World War (not from personal experience I hasten to add) including reading letters sent home from Willingham's young men serving in France. We watched videos of the Willingham Gala and the building of a



swimming pool. How times have changed with planning and Health and Safety! At that time it was simply 'we want a swimming pool so let's build one.'

The worst, well the weather was not kind to the yard sale or the funfair as the cold and rain on the Saturday kept many away. Despite the rain, the organisers of the Photography Club Exhibition in the Public Hall and those of the Octagon Art Group Exhibition in the library were pleased with the numbers of people who visited.

The Feast tour, kindly and expertly conducted by Teresa Weston, of the famed wall paintings in St Mary and All Saints Church was a great success. The roving audience were all very engaged and duly amazed at what treasures have lain in their midst, long documented by Willingham's own Alan Fawcitt but largely undiscovered (by them) until Sunday.

On a final note it is sometimes mentioned that the Feast events start too early according to tradition. Initially we did try to fit many events around Feast Sunday but since we try to have events to appeal to all ages and tastes we found that those villagers such as parents with small children were not able to attend four events spread over three days, so we now hold events over three weeks.

Sadly, our speaker, Nicola Sly, had to cancel due to ill health but luckily Saffron Summerfield was able to step in at short notice with her talk: *Music and History of the Guitar – Medieval to Mississippi.*

Saffron was a very entertaining speaker as well as an exceptional guitar player and composer. She had been to the Deep South of America to study slide guitar and other techniques which she demonstrated on her guitars of various shapes and sizes, giving us music and songs from all genres. She talked about her fascinating life in the music business in the 1960s including playing with Long John Baldry at a time when artists such as Paul Simon were just starting out. It was a real treat.

Feast Dog Show

The first Willingham Dog Show, held as one of the Feast Events, was a great success with a good number of competitors for each of the nine competitions including Best Trick, Best Six Legs (Dog and Handler), and then all the winners vying for the Dog The Judges Would Most Like To Take Home prize. There was also a Scurry (timed run using hay bales as hurdles) and a Hoopy obstacle course kindly run by behavioural specialists Cambridge Dogs (<u>www.cambridgedogs.wixsite.com</u>) who donated their takings to our chosen charity, Wood Green Animal Shelter.

More than 40 dogs took part in the events and there were probably 200 or more supporters for their efforts. Congratulations to all the winners, and thanks to everyone for turning up and making the day so enjoyable.

The event could not have happened without huge help from volunteers and the kind loan of local resources. Special thanks go to our judges, Amanda, Kim, David and Graham, and to The Youth Trust who stepped in at short notice to run the barbecue.

All these activities enabled us to donate a cheque for $\pounds 200$ to Wood Green Animal Shelter a few days after the event. Look for a link on <u>www.willinghamlife.org</u> to view further pictures of the cheque handover and a gallery of pictures taken on the day by Derek Law.

Dog Walking Field

Many parishioners have been dismayed to discover that the dog walking field will no longer be available now that the Government sponsored arrangement which allowed for public use of farmers' land has ended. The Council have been in touch with the landowner, and it is not currently possible to extend the use of the field.

We are very aware of how much this will be missed and are actively seeking other arrangements. Unfortunately, the only Council owned land (the Community Orchard and land on Meadow Lane) is not suitable. If anybody knows of or can suggest alternative locations, please contact the Council and we will investigate how we can move forward.

MUGA – Multi-Use Games Area

Villagers will be aware that the new development in Rockmill End is proceeding, despite strenuous objections from the Parish Council. The only upside of this is that the developers have to provide 'Section 106 money' to fund community facilities in the village. The Council is looking at options for creating an all-weather floodlit MUGA on the Recreation Ground using some of this money. The aim is to provide a facility that can be widely used by all age groups, within the limits of what is feasible on a single area.

Plans are at an early stage. If you or your sports group might be interested in making use of such a facility, or if you would like to be kept informed of progress or have any questions, please contact Leisure and Amenities Lead Councillor Linda King (details below).

Footpaths

Some footpaths in the village are currently impassable in places due to overgrown brambles and other vegetation. The Parish Council has no powers other than to ask residents and owners to keep the paths clear and will be writing to those identified.

Responsibility for footpaths falls to the County Council Highways Department and any obstructions should be reported via the portal at <u>www.highwaysreporting.cambridgeshire.gov.uk</u>. Note that the County Council can remove obstacles which are causing a hazard to the public and will bill the landowner for any work carried out.

New Councillor

Please welcome Simon Anderson to the Council. Simon was coopted as a new Parish Councillor at this month's meeting, filling the vacancy left when Stephen Mellows moved away from the village. Simon's contact details are below. Our thanks to Stephen for his time on the council and his work as Lead Councillor for the Cemetery.

Police Public Meeting

The meeting organised by the Parish Council on behalf of South

Cambridgeshire Police was very well attended and our thanks to all who came along to raise their concerns with Sergeants Hilson and Priestly. The Council's notes of the meeting and the police Community Plan are both in the Council website under the 'Police', News Category. Printed copies of the Plan are also available in the library.

Local Plan

After a marathon and probably record-breaking four and a half year inspection, the South Cambridgeshire Local Plan was at last approved by the District Council at their meeting on the 27 September. This means it can now be given 'full weight' in planning inspections and should mean an end to the rash of inappropriate developments in the village.

Third Defibrillator

The second village defibrillator, installed on the library, was used recently and then returned after travelling with a patient to Addenbrookes Hospital. For privacy reasons, we have not been informed of the details of its use but, inspired by this, the Council intends to add provision in next year's budget for the installation of a third device somewhere in the south of the village.

WW1 Commemorative Bench

To commemorate the 100th anniversary of the end of The Great War, the Parish Council have installed a memorial bench in the cemetery. This will be officially inaugurated as part of the Remembrance Sunday service at the War Memorial.

Meeting dates are published on the website, the notice board outside the Public Hall in the High Street, at the library and are listed below. Members of the public are welcome to attend and speak briefly or ask questions. Names will be taken down at the beginning of each meeting, together with the electoral register number to ensure everyone has a fair chance to speak within the allowed time (15 minutes in total for all speakers – three minutes maximum per person).

Meeting Dates: 7 November, 5 December. The meetings are held in the Octagon and start at 7 30 pm.

The Parish Council office is open Monday to Thursday from 10 am to 1 pm, except Bank Holidays and there is an answer-phone service outside office hours.

PASTORAL LETTER

FRUITFUL SOIL

The Parable of the Sower

Jesus said to the crowds:

'A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path. Some fell on rocky places. Other seed fell among thorns. Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown'.

Matthew 13, 1-23

Each situation of the seeds requires some treatment in order to produce any fruit possible. The seeds along the path need protection against the birds which would like to eat the easy food. The seeds on the rocky places need long cultivation of a shallow soil and watering against scorching sun. The seeds among the thorns need to be cleared off from the stubborn weeds continuously. It is hard work but very often there is no other way to get the produce.

You think that the good soil does not need any treatment? That it was always good, rich and fruitful? Maybe it was. We always forget how the good soil is treated in our experience. Don't you know that at the beginning every good soil is ploughed with the sharp and deep plough; what about smoothing it by harrow fitted with spikes after ploughing. And at the end: how do you consider the soil enriched with a stinky manure. O, yes! Only after that treatment the 'good soil' produces a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown.

Just like our own hearts are always treated by the circumstances of life. The ploughs of suffering, the harrows of bad behaviour of our neighbours or family members, and the manures of disappointments and humiliations. If it is accepted as the providential treatment of God, in order to perfect our similarity to God's Son – Jesus, – it produces good fruit of the perfect love within the holy person. There is no good soil without good care given to it. Everyone who trusts in God in His work of perfecting their character is a happy one. God created the soil of your heart and he is a Good Farmer – He knows how to treat it.

Most patients are eligible for the vaccine aged 70 - 79. A small number of patients aged 76 - 77 will not be eligible until their 78th birthday. (Please check with the surgery before booking in for the vaccine.) The vaccine cannot be given at 80 years of age or older as it is much less effective. This is a one-off vaccination so if you have had this vaccination previously, you do not need to have it repeated.

Willingham Craft Beer Festival

At the time of writing, the sunny September days we are seeing remind me of the wonderful weather we had over the last weekend in June for the Craft Beer Festival.

It has taken us a few weeks to get the accounts in order – real life and the day job have been getting in the way – but we now have a final total. Over the four-day festival we had 1,500 visitors who enjoyed 26 cask beers, 29 keg beers, three sparkling ciders on keg and another dozen still ciders, along with wine and artisan soft drinks.

We exceeded our expectations by raising a grand total of $\pounds 3,600$ which has now been shared equally between the two charities that we are supporting this year. These are the Willingham Youth Trust, who run the youth club and provide other services for young people in the village, and Over Day Centre, who provide support for older people in Over and the surrounding villages, not least Willingham.

We are very pleased that the support from our sponsors, Uttridge Accounting Ltd and Cambridge Medical Communication Ltd, means that over 80% of the entry charge has been donated to charity.

Many thanks, once again, to the volunteers and to the tireless committee for making the event such a great success.
