District Councillors' Report

Making Sense of the Various Councils

When meeting residents at recent local surgeries it has come to light that for some there is doubt as to which council is responsible for the village's services. This article aims to explain the roles and give some pointers as to who to contact to comment or complain.

Cambridgeshire County Council (CCC) is responsible for roads (though not motorways or trunk roads, which are the responsibility of Highways England), schools, libraries and certain planning matters, such as mineral extraction and processing, waste disposal and recycling. CCC is led currently by the Conservatives with elections due in 2021. Your councillor is Tim Wotherspoon (Conservative) who represents Willingham and Cottenham (tim.wotherspoon @cambridgeshire.gov.uk).

South Cambs District Council (SCDC) deals with most planning matters and the enforcement of planning conditions, licensing (eg taxis, public houses, betting shops), council house provision, waste collection (a shared service with Cambridge City) and certain welfare benefits. SCDC collects Council Tax on behalf of CCC, SCDC, the Fire Service, Police and parish councils. SCDC is currently led by the Liberal Democrats, who hold 30 out of 45 seats; elections are due in 2022. Your councillors (for Willingham and Over) are Dawn Percival (cllr.percival@scambs.gov.uk) and Bill Handley (cllr.handley@ scambs.gov.uk).

Willingham Parish Council (WPC)

WPC meets once a month (on the first Wednesday of each month) and members of the public can attend and may request a short slot to speak. The PC controls some community buildings and land for the village's benefit, such as the recreation ground, the village green and the public hall and have the responsibility for the maintenance of some hedges and trees. They are invited to comment on all planning applications that are received by SCDC within the parish and residents can contact the PC to object and comment. They are consulted by both SCDC and CCC on matters that will affect the parish and have the means to raise funds via a precept. WPC employs a clerk to organise meetings and to deal with communications from parishioners. The PC (via the clerk) is the first port of call for most matters. Parish councils do not have political direction.

Other Authorities

Cambridge and Peterborough Combined Authority is a devolved authority, made up of representatives from seven local authorities (including SCDC and CCC) and businesses. The remit of the Combined Authority is to work with the region's councils and businesses to promote its economy with primary aims to improve housing, transportation and digital links. It is currently led by Mayor James Palmer (Conservative).

Greater Cambridge Partnership is a consortium of SCDC, CCC, Cambridge City Council and Cambridge University. Its remit is to promote the region of Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire.

Old Willingham

Here is a photo of the High Street in about 1910. The only house you are likely to recognize is the building on the left which is now 'The Bank' pub – and was, of course, an actual bank for most of its life. The notable thing about this photo is how little remains. The big houses with chimneys are still there but everything else has been replaced. The large thatched house was replaced by the shops where the post office is today. You will see that there are no pavements and the road surface is very rough. It is also liberally covered with the evidence of horses!

Update from Fen Drayton Lakes

What Has Been Happening?

We are heading into winter and the breeding season is well past us. This means that we have begun to carry out habitat management works around the reserve to maintain and improve areas for breeding and resident species next year. These jobs will keep us busy until the spring, as we work to ensure that the reserve provides an ideal habitat for target species.

The first of these jobs that we have undertaken is the removal of willow trees from Holywell reedbed. These trees grow and spread quickly, and if left, will take over a reedbed and dry it out to eventually become woodland. As reedbed is one of our most valuable habitats for species such as bittern and marsh harrier, we have spent a lot of time cutting the willow back from the edges where it encroaches in, and treating the stumps to prevent regrowth.

The other job key job we have begun is the clearing of vegetation from the islands on Ferry Lagoon and Moore Lake. These islands are very important for our breeding terns, gulls, and other wetland species that nest on bare ground. So it is important to keep them clear of the vegetation that has a habit of taking over.

Wildlife

The autumn passage of migrating birds has ended, but interesting species could still turn up at any time after being blown off course so it is always worth keeping an eye out when walking around the reserve. Wintering species have arrived and the tell-tale whistling call of wigeon can be heard on most of the lakes around the reserve whilst wintering thrushes and finches can be seen in the hedgerows.

Fen Drayton Lakes is currently a great place to come and view herons with five different species on site. Numbers of grey heron and little egret are still building up as they gather into wintering groups. They have been joined by great white egrets on Moore Lake. Bittern are also around with individuals being spotted in various locations around the reserve. Lastly, a group of six cattle egret have been moving around between Ferry Mere, Moore Lake and Drayton Lagoon.

From time to time we publish a small feature on Willingham residents and this month the spotlight is on Mick Venning. Unless you are involved with music or regularly walk past Orchard Cottage on the High Street, you will probably be unaware that there is not only Bed and Breakfast accommodation there but also a fully equipped recording studio. Mick has worked all his life in the music industry, in a band between the ages of 18 and 24, then switching from making music to recording it, learning the craft at various studios including Spaceward at Stretham before it was taken over by Sony.

Mick has also spent many years in property development in a Cambridge based partnership, acquiring and renovating period property, which provided the experience to renovate the cottage and develop the old barns which he and his partner Mandy bought in 1997. Together and virtually without any outside help, they have transformed the outbuildings into a state of the art digital and analogue recording studio, office and a very attractive and successful B and B with an en suite double, two en suite twins and one en suite single.

In between running the Studio, mentoring university degree level Audio Technology students at Anglia Ruskin and the B and B, Mick and Mandy, over the past four years, have also developed the new music platform 'indii'. Scheduled for release on Apple this winter, 'indii' will be free to download from the App Store, and gives users easy access to new artists performing locally countrywide. The App also features the online creation of videos, along with Biographics, Blogs and live dates. Users can also build playlists and purchase music to access exclusive videos, which provides artists with a far greater and realistic return than the existing streaming platforms.

In the past Mick has helped many charities including our Primary School and Cottenham Village College with fund raising CDs and has recently collaborated with Steve Lockwood and local music artists to produce a new album for the Willingham Jam Club to celebrate its 10th anniversary, which will be available to buy at the Social Club on Jam nights on the last Monday of each month. It is expected that the Police and Crime Commissioner and our Member of Parliament, Lucy Frazer MP, will be in attendance. The Agenda is as follows:

- 4 35 pm Presentation from District Councillors.
- 4 45 pm Presentation from County Councillor.
- 4 55 pm Police report on Actions raised at the last community Police meeting held on 20 September.
- 5 05 pm Presentation by the Police & Crime Commissioner.
- 5 15 pm Question and answer session with Lucy Frazer MP, the Police & Crime Commissioner, local police officers, District and County Council representatives.
- 5 55 pm Meeting closed by the Parish Council.

Home Security Tips for the Autumn

Now that the clocks have gone back and the days are shorter, the South Cambridgeshire Neighbourhood team have identified the following steps to help in deterring opportunist intruders, especially if you are away from your property for any length of time:

- Consider using lights on timer switches, leave lights on and/or leave a radio on to make your home looks occupied (do not draw all the curtains).
- Secure entry and exit points and don't leave windows or doors unlocked or ajar.
- Arrange for friends or neighbours to periodically check your property.
- Avoid leaving keys and valuables within view or reach of a window or door.
- If you have an alarm, make sure you use it (dummy systems are not recommended).
- Consider the security of sheds and outbuildings as these may be attractive to thieves looking for equipment such as chainsaws and lawnmowers. They may also be able to use your hand tools to break into a door or window.
- Register your property for free at <u>www.immobilise.com</u> to catalogue anything with a serial number, or upload photographs

of more unique items.

Dog Walking Field Update

The identification of a suitable dog walking field remains ongoing. Some landowners have already been approached regarding the selling or renting of their land but nothing suitable has been identified so far and the option to use council-leased land on Meadow Road remains a possibility. Unfortunately, there is not going to be a quick resolution to this issue but rest assured that the council is actively looking for a suitable site and should parishioners identify a viable solution, the council will investigate accordingly.

South Cambridgeshire District Council Proposed Bin Changes

The SCDC are proposing to make changes to bin services by introducing a charge to households who want more than one green bin. The first green bin will remain free but additional green bins will cost $\pounds 20$ each from April 2019 and this will rise to $\pounds 35$ in following years.

Change to our Extended Hours

The additional pressure on the surgery, alongside the increase demand over the winter months, is making it more difficult for you to book routine appointments with the GP of your choice. Dr Jankovic would like to thank his patients for their kind wishes, and is hoping to return to the surgery as soon as possible.

New appointment system

We are planning on introducing a more robust triage system as we welcome a new Nurse Practitioner, Claire Blewett, to the surgery as a permanent member of our team. Our experienced reception team will be working with Claire to signpost all patients requesting urgent 'on the day' appointments to the most appropriate appointment with a GP. This may not necessarily be the same day. Claire herself is very experienced in providing advice and some medications for minor illness so you may be asked to attend her clinic, and not necessarily be signposted to a GP.

Christmas and New Year Clinics

The shortage of a GP this Christmas is also having some impact on the service we are able to offer during the Christmas period. We will be closed as normal on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

Meanwhile, until our next meeting in February here are a few topical tips to keep you busy over the next few weeks:

TIPS

- Heat Treatment. All but the hardiest of us will have the central heating on but while we luxuriate, houseplants suffer. Group plants to create a humid microclimate. Place on watering trays of gravel or extended clay granules, and spray leaves with a fine mister regularly.
- Dry out gnats. Fungus gnats can be a great annoyance around winter houseplants, but they are generally a sign that you are over-watering. Cut down and let the surface dry out, or cover with a thick layer of sharp sand.
- Houseplant leaves become dusty like any other surface in the house which reduces the light getting to them, especially in the darker months. Use cotton wool dipped in water to gently clean the leaves.

- Water plants more often in dry, centrally heated rooms over Christmas.
- Clean pots. This is an excellent time to take stock of things you'll need for next year. On a warm day, clean plant pots and let them dry in the sun.
- Cut holly. It's a good idea to cut some holly now before the birds make off with the berries. It will last perfectly well in a bucket of water in a sheltered corner, as will any other evergreen foliage you may gather. Beware holly contains a volatile oil which is flammable and burns fiercely; other flammable plant materials are eucalyptus and bamboo.
- Always wear a mask when spraying dried plant materials. Allow all sprayed materials to dry thoroughly, fumes are given off until they dry.
- Keep an eye on outside plants in pots and troughs as they too can easily dry out over the winter if there is little rain. Remember rain will run of the leaves not reaching the soil. Keep pots raised off the ground to prevent water logging and if we have very cold weather and the water in the pot freezes you could lose your plants.
- Harvest branches of willow such as the goat willow (salix caprea) or the glamorous dark red-stemmed salix daphnoides – and bring them inside to force the pussy willow flowers to form good and early for vases and decorations in January and February. Do the same with a few branches of forsythia, although with our mild autumn/winter, you may already have some in flower.

Library News

Engage in the Afternoon

Come and join in with these special sessions for adults on the first Wednesday of each month from 2 to 3 30 pm. There are speakers, tea/coffee/biscuits and a chance to change books.

In November, we had a really useful and interesting talk on Falls Prevention with Cameron from Everyone Health. Falls are a big problem in an increasingly elderly population and can have very serious consequences as well as costing the NHS millions of pounds a year.
