## **Cycle Club Sportif on Behalf of Over Day Centre**

Having obtained kind assurances from the various organisations in both Willingham and Over to keep Fathers' Day, **Sunday 16 June**, free of other events, Willingham Wheels and Over Day Centre have joined forces for a unique double decade celebration. The Cycle Club is 10 years old in 2019, and the year also marks the 10th anniversary of Over Day Centre's now famous 'Five Pub Challenge' (which will take place as usual in May – ie **Sunday 12 May**).

Serving residents not just of Over but also of the surrounding villages, Over Day Centre focuses on providing high-quality support for older people and those who are socially isolated. It helps people maintain social interaction and participate in recreation and enjoyable activities. Its services also often provide much needed support or respite for carers and families.

Given the average age of Willingham Wheels members (although decreasing!), the match between the two organisations is uncanny.

The celebration will take the form of a 'sportif' - posh

French name for a bike ride – through the countryside starting from Over Day Centre and finishing on Over Green where a marquee, music, food and refreshments will be waiting for riders and spectators alike.

The main route will be 50 miles in length, with an 8 to 10 miler suitable for families and the possibility of other distances in between. Certificates and medals will be available for all children taking part in the family ride.

The aim is, of course, to raise much-needed funds for Over Day Centre so that it can carry on its tremendous work on behalf of our community. There will therefore be a charge of around £20 for those taking part in the main ride, with fees descending for the shorter routes. All routes will be clearly signposted and we hope to arrange mechanical and medical back-up and a sweeper vehicle. ## 100 Years Ago – January 1919

## As part of a regular series, Anne Kirkman recounts events from 100 years ago this month.

At the beginning of the New Year, after the excitement of the Armistice, Willingham, like the rest of the country, began to adjust to new events. The first soldiers to return to the village were those who had been prisoners of war. Among them were Lance-Corporal A Whybrow of the 11th Suffolks and Corporal F L Thoday of the 2nd King's Royal Rifles, who both arrived back in early January.

On 16 January the Mayor of Cambridge and the County's Lord Lieutenant gave a 'Welcome Home' tea party for Cambridgeshire POWs and their families. They were instructed to assemble on Parker's Piece promptly at 1 45 pm, when further directions were to be given by megaphone. They then marched to the Guildhall to be welcomed and this was followed by tea at the Corn Exchange. Participants were issued with white or pink tickets and the latter had to go to the entrance in Corn Exchange Street opposite the Food Control Office. The *Cambridge Daily News* published the names of every soldier who attended. Willingham men, as well as those mentioned already, were Privates Haddow, J Hayden, H Elsom, E Smith, J A Todd, A Hayden, G H Askew, A Wayman and Lance-Corporal J Smith.

This huge, rambling, thatched house was on the High Street where the post office and adjoining buildings are today. This picture was probably taken about 1900. It is not known whether the building was demolished or burnt down – which was the fate of many thatched houses if sparks from the fire landed on the roof. The building was probably several hundred years old when this was taken, as evidenced by the huge chimney which would have been over a large, open fireplace, providing the only heating and cooking in the house. It's sad that this house is no longer with us but the cost of maintaining and refurbishing it would have been much higher than the cost of the new buildings that replaced it.

## **From the Parish Council**

#### Crime

The last time I had the pleasure of writing the comments for the Parish Council was for the July edition, when I closed by wishing you all a wonderful summer. Weather wise, it was, but we did have some other problems, not least with crime.

It was at two levels. There was a stream of low-level criminal damage and anti-social behaviour which caused considerable distress and there was more serious criminal activity in a number of raids on the Co-op and One Stop. One of the raids on the Co-op involved the removal of the cash machine, which will not be replaced, and one of the raids on One Stop, during opening hours, threatened staff.

Quite understandably, this crime spree led to widespread concern and some loss in confidence in the police, feeling that cuts to the police budget meant a lack of police presence, difficulty in contacting the police and even more difficulty in getting a response.

It took a little time, but to give due credit to the Cambridge Constabulary, once the scale of the problem became apparent the response was very positive. There was increased presence, much more rapid response and two public meetings, both very well attended.

At the second of these meetings on Saturday 1 December significant progress was reported. The meeting was attended by the Police and Crime Commissioner and our MP, as well as by our local police contacts.

We now have a quieter, calmer village – the kind of place in which we all wish to live. Whether or not that can be maintained long term is not certain. Inevitably, as the focus moves away from Willingham to other hot spots, we shall receive less attention. But we have established some very good contacts and made the point that Willingham residents care deeply about their village and the need to keep it safe.

One of the points raised by Sgt Priestly at the meeting was the positive support provided through the village Facebook page. As he pointed out, social media can be an excellent tool for disseminating information when used correctly but users do need to be mindful that not all information posted may be correct.

Enough for now, but there will be more on this subject in the New Year when we take up some of the issues raised at our meetings.

#### Other Matters in Brief

The precept for 2019/20 has been set at £123,275 which is a 2.8% increase on last year. I will deal with this in more detail in my annual report in May.

The parish office re-opens on **2** January. If you have an urgent problem before then please call one of the councillors listed here or on the website.

And finally, let me close this time on a similar note to last time by wishing you all a very happy New Year. My next contribution to *Willingham News* will be for the July edition by which time I am hopeful that we will have a new and younger Chairman with new ideas.

It has been a pleasure chairing the Parish Council on several occasions over the last ten years or so but definitely time to hand over to new blood. I do know that the Parish Council works hard to deliver services, help and information in our village and understand that their efforts are not always appreciated. Our very hard worked parish clerk tells me that it is a good day when she gets less than three complaints. So be it, better three complaints than no comment.

## **Book Review**

The Boy with the Topknot by Sathnam Sanghera

Sathnam Sanghera is an award-winning journalist who now works for *The Times.* He lives in London but was born to Punjabi parents and grew up in Wolverhampton. His memoir follows Sathnam as he returns home, aged 24, to confess to his mother that he is dating a white girl – her one wish is for him to marry a 'nice' Sikh girl. However, it is then that he discovers that his father and sister both suffer from schizophrenia, which he had been totally unaware of. As he researches their hidden conditions, he starts to piece together his disturbing family history.

However, the book isn't all misery and family repression. There's tragedy, social comment, but it's also warm and funny – especially the scene where he has his hair cut for the first time. The book moves along quickly, never boring, painting an interesting picture of a family dealing with the cultural differences of old and new, East and West.

Our group found lots to discuss and, in general, found it an enjoyable read. Our scores ranged from 5 to 9 out of 10, giving an average of 7.8.
