### Willingham 100 Years Ago

These reports from the *Cambridge Independent Press* of October 1919 demonstrate that the inhabitants of Willingham certainly knew how to enjoy themselves a hundred years ago.

Outing: 'The Girls' Cricket Team arranged a successful and enjoyable trip to Hunstanton on Wednesday September 28th. Favoured with delightful weather the merry party, numbering over 30 including friends, were conveyed to their destination by motor bus. Everyone being in high spirits, all agreed that it proved a very happy ending to the cricket season for this year.'

Tabernacle: 'On Feast Sunday large congregations attended the services, which were conducted by the pastor, the Rev. W F Harris, the large building being crowded in the evening. Mr Harris preached in the morning upon 'The crowd and the cloister', and in the evening upon 'God and bread'. At the evening service Miss Oliver and Mr C Stearn sang the duet 'Watchman, what of the night?' During the evening news arrived of the settlement of the great railway strike\*, and at the invitation of the minister the congregation rose and heartily sang the Doxology.'

\*This nine-day strike ended in a victory for the NUR.

#### A Brief History of Willingham 1200 to 1700

### Part 6 – The St Christopher Wallpainting

#### Reign of Richard II 1377-1399

A new Rector arrived in Willingham in 1377, Roger de Weston. Roger appears to have held the living for an incredibly long time until 1447 although there is also mention of a Richard Weston during this period. It is very likely that the wallpainting of St Christopher was commissioned during Roger's 'reign' at Willingham. A tradition had developed in English churches of painting patterns on all the internal walls (and often roofs). They were a medieval form of our wallpaper. Gradually these were replaced by colourful pictures of legends and biblical events as a means of projecting the Christian message by the priest to his largely illiterate congregation. They were the visual aids of their time.

The occasion of a new Rector gave the opportunity for him to limewash over existing paintings and commission new ones more to his taste. Willingham Church has no less

than five layers of paintings which have been conserved. One of the best, from the second layer, is that of St Christopher, the patron saint of travellers, painted around 1380 on the nave wall almost opposite the main door. He is standing in shallow water, the Christ child on his shoulder. He has a 'fish fork' staff and several fish around his feet. They have been identified as burbot, perch, roach and eel, all fish that were then commonly found in the surrounding fens. It is one of the finest examples of a wallpainting of St Christopher in England.

### **A World Premiere in Willingham**

Many of us like shredded duck as a starter in Chinese restaurants but duck doesn't figure highly in many Indian restaurants – that's about to change!

At the beginning of September the first public tasting, indeed a world premiere, took place of a dish which will compete world-wide with the familiar Chinese shredded duck, and it happened at the Royal Bengal Restaurant in Willingham, thanks to village resident and chef, Kristian (Kris) Wade, who insisted that the first presentation of this new dish be held here.

The idea behind the dish was explained in detail by Kris, a development chef working with import/export business expansion at Northgate Foods, Suffolk, and he also

demonstrated its preparation. Kris has spent five years experimenting with spice blends, methods of preparing duck and wraps just to produce this new mouth-watering, exquisite food. Those residents who were lucky enough to be invited will testify to that! The dish presents a wide-



ranging yet subtle blend of spices with a lovely, lingering aftertaste. The spice blends and treatment of the duck are all trade secrets as are the wraps, to be called cha-pancakes - a cross between a pancake and a chapatti with Indian spices. There is a choice of tamarind or spicy sauce topped off with a hint of lime.

This is not just a local initiative; present at the tasting were representatives of three major global companies who produce the duck, wraps and spices. Kris will now set off to tour the country as the introductory tastings will take place in Indian restaurants throughout the UK and then further afield. We can hope, in the future, Willingham may be known as the home of the Indian Aromatic Duck

and Cha-Pancake and the Royal Bengal will be renowned as the first restaurant in the world to offer it.

### **From the Parish Council**

#### B1050

James Broder from County Highways attended the September meeting. When pressed about the appallingly dangerous state of the B1050 Shelford Road he was only able to offer further patching, with a vague reference to a 'permanent solution' at some distant time and no prospect of a lorry ban. The Council reiterated its deep concern.

#### **Dog Walking**

As detailed in last month's piece a big topic at recent meetings has been dog walking, arising from the closure of the set aside field. Dogs and their owners had enjoyed use of this space for many years as an easily accessible safe area. The Council enquired about purchasing or leasing part of the land but that was not possible.

Dog owners then lobbied the Council to allow dogs onto the Recreation Ground or part of it. The Ground's users lobbied just as hard not to allow this. Clearly, whichever way the decision went a sizeable number of residents would be upset. The Council decided on the status quo and not to allow dogs on the Recreation Ground on the basis of health and safety and the fact that the village already has a shortage of sports space. A working party set up to look at alternatives is due to report back in October.

#### Meadow Road

Another hot topic was the Meadow Road site. For readers that do not know the background, this was once a traveller site set up by the County Council that was eventually abandoned. The Parish Council leased it with the objective of creating an open space. The intention is that it will be a woodland area for parishioners to enjoy with or without their dogs. It is open for anyone that wishes to visit but is far from finished and the ground is very uneven. (See also *Readers' Letters* in this month's issue.)

#### MUGA

Plans are now beginning to take shape. We are looking at an

area next to the Bowls Green of 34 m x 37 m, which can accommodate two tennis courts, a 5-a-side football pitch and a netball court. Catering for different sports on a single surface requires compromise, and sand-dressed artificial grass is the best option. We are drawing up detailed specifications and collecting information to make a preplanning application to SCDC. As the Recreation Ground is in a high flood risk area the Environment Agency's input is key.

#### Vacancies

There have been three resignations, including the Chairman. Derek Law has stepped up from Vice Chair and Phil King has returned from the back benches. If you feel you can help fill the vacancies then please do contact the Parish Clerk for more information. The duties need not be very onerous and you will be able to judge at first hand how well your Council performs. The closing date for applications is noon on **30 October**.

#### Summer Outing

We had a fun and interesting trip to 78 Derngate, the Charles Rennie Mackintosh designed house in Northampton. The guided tour revealed beautifully preserved and restored décor and furniture in this unique style which still looks modern today. It is the only house in England designed by Mackintosh but he never visited it in person. The house was owned by WJ Bassett-Lowke and all the designs and plans were worked out via post in a steady correspondence between the two men. Unexpectedly, Bassett-Lowke turned out to be a very interesting character in his own right. He owned a company which made miniature trains for model railways in both houses and gardens and was devoted to his home town of Northampton, being active in many of the town's institutions and the founder of Northampton Repertory Theatre. We had a lovely lunch at the house and time for a pleasant wander around Northampton on a fine, sunny day.

### **District Councillors' Report**



Many readers will be aware of the excessive number of construction vehicles travelling through our village. We know that some of these vehicles serve the Northstowe development, but some are associated with the A14 upgrade and other private work. SCDC has clear restrictions in place preventing construction vehicles using the B1050 to access Northstowe, and yet some developers (and their contractors) still ignore these conditions.

At the end of August 2019 a meeting was held between SCDC and the six developers operating at Northstowe with the aim of improving the problem of construction vehicles using Willingham as a route to and from Northstowe.

We impressed on the developers how unhappy residents of Willingham are and the likely course of action that will be taken by SCDC if they fail to take steps to prevent their contractors and suppliers from using Willingham. This includes, in extremis, the prosecution of directors of the companies.

The developers agreed to do what they can to improve the situation for local residents and committed to contacting all of their contractors, reminding them of their obligations to the Northstowe transport plan (ie not to use Willingham to get to/leave Northstowe) and insisting that this is made clear to any sub-contractors that they use. CCTV at the entrance to Northstowe (both inward and outwards facing) is being investigated in order to monitor the routes construction vehicles use and to corroborate any complaints of vehicles in breach of the plan. CCTV is also being explored as a method to monitor the individual developer sites for incoming and outgoing traffic. Signage, reminding Northstowe construction vehicles that the B1050 is a prohibited route, will also be installed.

A further meeting is to be held with the developers in early October 2019, when we expect the developers to provide an update on the progress made against the aforementioned actions.

Whilst we are aware that the positive actions of the Northstowe developers will not eliminate all construction vehicles travelling through the village, we should start to see a significant reduction in the number.

### PASTORAL LETTER

As I write, we are all wondering what will happen this year regarding Brexit. Will we leave? Will we stay? Will there be a 'deal'? What will be the consequences of the decisions and actions that governments will take? Over the past 100 years or so people have gained more and more freedoms and individuals now have power over their own lives that was unknown in past generations. This is good of course, but having control places more weight on our shoulders to make the best decisions. And when we are faced with the unknown, as we are now, it's easy to worry, especially when we will be affected by things we can't control.

Worry leads to stress and stress affects our relationships with everybody. The Bible talks about worry. In the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 6, Jesus says: 'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life ... Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life? ... Do not worry, saying, "What shall we eat?" or "What shall we drink?" or "What shall we wear?'... your heavenly Father knows that you need them.'

We are taught from a young age to look out for ourselves and strive for what we want. It's hard to let that pressure go and place your trust in God in all things. But when you do, what peace it brings. Things may go well or things may go poorly but trusting that God knows you and will be with you through good and bad means there is no need to worry about it. Jesus said: 'Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.'

If you would like the reassurance of placing your trust in God, it's easy. Just make a firm decision that things are going to be different now and say a simple prayer to ask Jesus to come into your life. Then seek out like-minded people in the village to help you on your new journey. Leave worry at the door.

Older residents will recall that at one time it was a large traveller site that was not too successful and ended up being trashed. It then lay derelict for many years and the Parish Council became concerned that the County Council might put it up for sale. The Parish Council decided that the best thing was to buy or lease it and turn it into recreational space. The County Council offered the site on a long lease and as this was much simpler for both Councils to implement the Parish Council duly accepted it.

The idea is that eventually it will become a natural recreational space for residents to enjoy whilst encouraging wildlife. Although a huge amount of work has already been

done towards this end the venture is still a work in progress. Conscious of cost, much of the work that has been done involved councillors and other members of our community who gave freely of their time.

### **Book Review**

#### Rivers of London by Ben Aaronovitch

This book is the first in a series of fantasy/detective novels set in modern London. Its hero, Peter Grant, is a young PC of mixed race, who has just finished his probationary period at the Met. He and fellow probationer, Lesley May, are guarding a murder scene at Covent Garden when he accosts a man lurking in the churchyard there. This man, Nicholas Wallpenny, is perfectly willing to testify as a witness of the murder, but the only drawback is that he is a ghost.

This incident sets Peter on a career in an unofficial department of the Met which deals with the supernatural. His master there is the very elegant DCI Thomas Nightingale who sets out to teach Peter how to perform various magical feats and how to recognise and interpret what he calls 'vestigia' – traces of past experiences which can be found around buildings (and corpses). Peter meets a large number of colourful characters, including the spirits of some of the rivers of London and their mother Mama Thames, a Nigerian nurse who walked into the river to commit suicide as a young woman and walked out again as the goddess of the lower reaches of the river.

The book was surprisingly well received by a group of non-fantasy enthusiasts, though all agreed that too much material made it over-complicated and finally harder to read. The average mark was 6.5.

We were delighted to be asked to place a hive at the allotments, and in August we established a small colony there from a swarm collected this summer.

This year has been a particularly 'swarmy' one. We collected about 10 in total, finding them new homes locally. There were a number of swarms from the Orchard bees this year too, which unfortunately reduced their numbers. We decided not to take honey from them, but to leave it this year to help the bees re-establish.

Individually, we are members of the Cambridgeshire Beekeepers' Association, who supported our group recently by purchasing equipment for members to use in and around Willingham. We are also very grateful for support from WAG and the Willingham Beer Festival.

### Waste Incinerator Planned for Fen Edge

Cambridgeshire County Council is being forced to defend its objection to a giant waste incinerator. The application for an incinerator was rejected in 2018 by Cambridgeshire County Council but the developers are appealing so we need your support again before bonfire night.

- The incinerator will be at Waterbeach, opposite the proposed new town and schools on the A10, next door to ancient Denny Abbey, and only two to three miles away from schools in Cottenham. The huge furnaces will burn 24/7 for 35+ years.
- The chimney will tower to 80 metres taller than Ely Cathedral which is 66 metres high.
- Particle emissions, dioxins and heavy metals from incinerators are believed to affect health.
- Incineration reduces recycling rates and contributes to climate change.
- To make it profitable, waste deliveries will come in from 10 counties as well as from Cambridgeshire, making our area a dumping ground. The A10 is already at capacity.
- This is not the right place for an incinerator, being so close to housing and schools.
- It is not the solution that scientists recommend for managing waste, in an age of increased recycling, reducing plastic, creating energy from waste and protecting the climate.

We need your help so that we can make our objections as forcefully as possible. The appeal is to be held on **5 November**. We urgently need to raise more money to fund our representation at the Public Inquiry, so that our powerful reasons for rejection can be given full weight.
