# **Old Willingham**



Although there were very few vehicles 100 years ago, mostly carts, the roads still had to be maintained with ruts and potholes filled in. From time to time a steam roller and crew would arrive to do this work. This month we see one such crew. The reason the photo was taken is that it has become stuck trying to cross the bridge over the Load (now Ploughman Hall). In fact, it looks as though the bridge is partly collapsed under the weight (10 tons). We do not know how they got it out again!

The Steam Roller is an Aveling & Potter 'Invicta', built around 1894. An identical Roller survives today which you can see by entering 'Road Roller 3319' into your search engine.

# Willingham 100 Years Ago

The *Cambridge Independent Press* reported two entertainments as having taken place in Willingham in December 1919.

On the 5 December Mr B Kirby gave two exhibitions with his cinema at the Public Hall on behalf of the Friends of Addenbrooke's Hospital. Apparently the Hall was crowded on both occasions and the amount realised was  $\pounds 15.12s$ .

Later in the month a Christmas Carol Service was held in the Tabernacle in connection with the Young Christians' Fellowship. Mr Toseland, the famous elocutionist from Northampton, recited Dickens' *A Christmas Carol* in fine style, and carols were rendered by the Tabernacle choir. There was a good attendance in spite of the stormy weather.

In the same month Mr Percy Noyes of Rockmill End, employed by Mr James Lack, fell from a cart he was driving and a wheel passed over his chest. However he survived and was reported as progressing under the care of Dr King.

# A Brief History of Willingham Part 8 The Lull Before the Storm of Reformation Reigns of – Henry VI 1422–1471, Edward IV 1461–1483, Richard III 1483–1485

For the 70 years after the death of Roger de Weston in 1447 the records of the Rectors of Willingham do not provide the same level of detail as for earlier Rectors. We know of John Sugden (1447), John Newhous (1472), and Robert Williamson (1475), but we know little of them as individuals. This is particularly disappointing as a tremendous amount was happening between 1450 and 1520 to Saint Matthew's Church in Willingham (as it was still known).

Two internal oak screens were added to form the Vestry and the de Bruyne Chapel (now the Lady Chapel). John de Bruyne (later Bourn) was Lord of the smaller of the two Manors in Willingham, located off the High Street opposite the Post Office (later to be known as Bourneys Manor). His will of 1475 contains a bequest for 'a small bell to harmonise with the other three bells already hanging in the church tower'. So we know that Willingham bells, now increased to six, have been ringing for well over 540 years. A large rood screen was also added filling the whole space under the chancel arch. It is no longer there now, but there still remains intact the small spiral staircase of 12 very wellworn steps up to it. These additions were very typical of late medieval Catholicism.

The wallpainting of the great 'Doom Scene' was also completed around this time on the chancel arch itself. It was meant to dramatise the difference between heaven and hell on Judgement Day. It certainly succeeds. The righteous are shown as naked figures (apparently all women) rising to Paradise, while on the right more naked figures are being dragged down through flames into the jaws of Hell.

It is difficult now to appreciate the sheer power of the Church on day-to-day living at this time. The Bishop of Ely was the landlord, employer and law enforcer (through his manorial court) as well as being the local spiritual leader of a very powerful Catholic Church. He was incredibly wealthy. Bishops received a similar salary to Earls and Ely was high up the salary list of 17 diocesan bishops, with an annual income of  $\pounds 2,500$ , an enormous amount then. Meanwhile most villagers would typically work three days each week on the lord's land, in return for which they could work the rest of the week on their own allocated piece of land. For this they then paid rent, frequently 'in kind' with some of their own produce. But not on Sundays when Church attendance was compulsory and where the villagers would be standing (not sitting) through the Latin ritual service.

However, there were always the Feast Days and Fairs to look forward to for eating, drinking, dancing, trading,



shopping and making music. Three annual Fairs had grown in Cambridge, as well as a weekly market, and were becoming very indeed. large Midsummer Fair lasted several days each June, followed by

Garlic Fair in August, but the largest by far was Stourbridge Fair each September. It was to become known as the largest Fair in Europe with many hundreds of stalls. St Ives had been granted a charter for a weekly market in 1110 and had also developed a large annual Easter Fair.

# **Ending Domestic Abuse**

There were 13,834 domestic abuse incidents reported to Cambridgeshire Police during 2018-19. This has increased by over 600 reports during the previous year. Research shows that, nationally, four in five survivors don't inform the police of domestic abuse that has occurred.

A local charity 'Cambridge Women's Aid' is launching a new community project called 'Ask Me' to help tackle domestic abuse. The project evolved from discussions with survivors of abuse which noted that while communities are often the first to know that domestic abuse is happening, lack of understanding and confidence can make people afraid to talk about it, and unsure of how to respond when someone speaks out.

Ask Me aims to equip everyone with an understanding of domestic abuse and how to respond to survivors. Cambridge Women's Aid is now looking to train members of the community to become Ask Me Community Ambassadors, in order to break the silence surrounding domestic abuse and help eliminate it.

Volunteers will receive 12 hours of free training on domestic abuse, how to raise awareness about it in communities and how to direct survivors to specialist services. Are you passionate about ending domestic abuse? Are you a member of a community, group, or a club interested in learning about domestic abuse and supporting survivors? If so, why not find out more about the Ask Me scheme and sign up for the training. You could then become part of a nationwide network of Ask Me Community Ambassadors working to eliminate domestic abuse in the UK.

# From the Parish Council

#### **New Councillors**

Three casual vacancies arising from the resignations of previous councillors were filled at the November meeting. As there were more applicants than positions, there was a rather complicated voting procedure but eventually Kay Cook, Valerie McKee and Barry Todd were selected to join the council. Our thanks to all who volunteered and a warm welcome to the new councillors.

#### Northstowe Governance Review Drop-In

As the community at Northstowe grows, so South Cambridgeshire District Council is required to carry out a Governance Review to consider future governance arrangements. The Civic Affairs Committee has now commenced the Northstowe boundary review. A drop-in session has been arranged on **Saturday 30 November**, 11 am to 1 pm in the Ploughman Hall. Liz Davey, the Development Officer, and your District Councillors will be on hand to help residents understand the review process and timescale and to answer any questions you may have.

#### Christmas Tree

For the last two years the Christmas tree on the Green has been kindly donated by Mr A Coe. Unfortunately, this year the uncertainty over Brexit has meant that large trees are in short supply and Mr Coe has been unable to obtain one. We are aware how much villagers appreciate having a tree and the council decided to purchase one for installation on the Green this season which will be decorated using new lights.

#### Orchard Dog Walking

A new fence has been installed alongside the B1050 to make the Community Orchard secure for dogs. We are investigating whether we can have a new dog bin installed by the Orchard but until then would ask dog owners to be considerate of others sharing the area when walking their animals. Flat Road bridle path is adjacent to the Orchard and provides over a kilometre of safe grassland where dogs can run, should more vigorous exercise be required.

#### Willingham Youth Trust

After the conversion of a storage area and unused upper floor of the Ploughman Hall into a Youth Centre, the Youth Trust took over the building and now runs an extremely successful Youth Club on Wednesday evenings open to all and free to children. This has been a tremendous effort by the Trustees and has been entirely self-funded for the last four years. However, they now feel that to keep the sessions sustainable into the future, they need support from the Parish Council. We agreed that this is a worthwhile expenditure and will provide  $\pounds 6,000$  a year for the Connections Bus Project staff, starting next April.

#### **BT** Phone Box

The phone box on Station Road by the Willingham Wing bus stop has not been operational for some time. Before it fell into disrepair only a single call had been made in over a year. Under a BT scheme, local authorities can adopt unwanted phone boxes and convert them for new uses. The Council had already decided to provide a third defibrillator for this area of the village and has now agreed to adopt the phone box, refurbish it and use it to house the defibrillator.

#### **Bus Survey**

We wrote to our MP (Lucy Frazer at the time) in response to the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority's strategic bus review. Ms Frazer has replied that the Authority has now commissioned a six week survey 'Have your say on our future Bus Services', which can be accessed at <u>www.smartsurvey.co.uk/s/FutureBus</u> or over the phone on 07377 001512 (9 am - 5 pm, Monday -Friday). Tell us what matters to you about improving local bus services.

Council meetings are generally held on the first Wednesday of the month in the Octagon, starting at 7 30 pm. Agendas are published on the website, the notice board outside the public hall in the High Street, and in the library. Members of the public are welcome to attend and speak briefly or ask questions (see agendas for further details).

#### WI News

In October Peter Scott, from the Norris Museum, came to speak about *Bridges, Brewers and Barges.* Saxons, Romans, Vikings and Christians all shaped the St Ives we know today and the bridge was a very important part of its development. By the early 15th century, the old wooden bridge was in a state of terrible disrepair, so the Abbot wrote to the Pope to request a Papal Bull requiring the townspeople to contribute to the building of a stone bridge with a chapel. In 1486, the chapel on the bridge was consecrated and the monks would sing and chant for the safety of those crossing. Of course, it was also an opportunity to charge a toll (not removed until 1820) and encourage people to visit the remains of St Ivo at the Priory!

During Henry VIII's reign the Priory closed and the last Prior was allowed to live in the chapel on the bridge which he did for 30 years.

In 1736 two extra storeys were added and a mysterious someone with the initials TD lived there but nothing else is known about him. These extra floors were removed in 1930 and the bridge was reinforced to leave the picturesque and enduring crossing we see today. It was a really good talk with many more stories than this. So, if you would like to know more, why not visit the museum in St Ives? It's full of interesting history about the town and the surrounding area and entry is free.

# OWLS Community Car Scheme

For many elderly people wintry weather brings with it worries about falling on slippery ground and concerns about driving in hazardous conditions. A walk to the doctors or local shop which might have been relatively easy in the summer or a drive to attend an outpatient appointment can seem a different prospect entirely in the winter months.

If this applies to you, a family member, friend or neighbour then why not think about using or suggesting OWLS Community Car Scheme for those journeys.

OWLS is a Community Service for eligible residents of Over, Willingham, Longstanton and Swavesey run by DBS cleared volunteers who live locally. It offers a door-to-door return service to those people who are unable to access other means of transport to attend medical appointments or make some social journeys. Customers pay 30p a mile with a minimum charge of  $\pounds 3$ .

# **Memoirs of a Long Term Village Resident**

As part of a family living in the village for some 60 years now, I have memories of the many changes that have taken place here during this time. It has been suggested that I share some of these with newer residents via the pages of *Willingham News*.

Recently I was remembering the previous use of the Public Hall in the High Street as a cinema! Well sometimes anyway – film shows were held there during the week for adults and on Saturday mornings for the children; also ballroom dancing was taught there by Mrs Manning. Possibly not up to 'Strictly' standards but I'm sure enjoyed just as much.

One of the major and annual sights of the village were the boxes and boxes of flowers stacked on the pavements ready to be picked up by the local agents' lorries and be sent to flower markets in London, Sheffield, Liverpool and other cities. Almost every household seemed to have their plot of land where Peonies, Pyrethrums, Statice Dumosa and many other varieties were grown in great quantities. It was a wonderful sight to see the colours in the fields, along with the fruit trees in flower. Those days are long gone. It was hard work for the Willingham folk and those in villages nearby who relied on the flower markets for their living but it was an old and established industry.

Our village was surrounded by acres and acres of fruit trees – apples, pears and the like. Over the years all these fields were grubbed up as supermarkets imported different varieties and the land became more valuable for arable crops. But it is a good that we can still see local varieties of apple here and there.

Mind you, all the work involved with the production of flowers and fruit didn't seem to detract from the enjoyment of sport in the village. Cricket was very popular and we've had a team representing Willingham on and off for decades. Tennis fans were adequately provided for with five courts set out in the Recreation Field and the Willingham Tug of

# **Willingham Remembers**

The annual Act of Remembrance was held on 10 November at the War Memorial in the Cemetery and then in St Mary & All Saints Church, which had been suitably decorated with poppies for the occasion.

About 150 villagers including representatives from the British Legion and Scouting organisations attended the laying of wreathes and observed a Two Minutes Silence at the Memorial before moving into the Church to join together in the Remembrance Sunday service.

A Roll Call of Honour, bearing the names of all the Willingham residents who died in the World Wars whilst in the service of their Country, was read as part of the service before a further period of silence was held with these names very much in everyone's mind. There were 46 names on the list – including several brothers or members of the same families.

At the end of the service a collection was taken and £221 was raised to be donated to the British Legion.

War team brought us honour and entertainment whenever they hosted local contests. Sporting attractions didn't seem to detract from a social visit to the pub, I understand there used to be 23 in the village. Land work combined with sport can make for being thirsty!

I have memories of several of the village personalities of those days – does anyone else remember Billy Raven at the High Street corner shop? He always gave a friendly welcome and his home cooked ham was the best you've ever tasted. Some of the old men of the village spent their days sitting outside his shop on the crossroads watching the world go by. Many of us remember Dennis Jeeps, who left the village such a lot of photos of Willingham, with great fondness. My own memories of the local doctor start with Doctor Flower, an appropriate name for a village where there were so many flowers blooming, his surgery was held in part of his house which was The Limes in Long Lane. I understand there were times when it was also used as a nursing home.

What is now the Cambridge Melchior College in Church Street used to be part of the church and was at one time home for the Rector. In later years it was a local authority care home and garden parties were regularly held there ,always it seemed, on sunny Saturday afternoons.

I'm certain there are many other memories to be told, always interesting and at times very entertaining. Hopefully they will be documented for the coming years before they become part of forgotten history.

Following meetings with L & Q (previously Gallaghers) and Cambridgeshire County Council Highways, it has been agreed that the developers will fund a number of signs designed to deter construction vehicles serving Northstowe from travelling through Willingham.

The following signs have been agreed:

- Two Signs at the B1050 Earith Roundabout
- Two Signs at the junction of Links Lane and Stirling Way, Northstowe
- One Sign in advance of the Right Turn Traffic Signals into Pathfinder Way

Preparations are now being made to satisfy the relevant County Council approvals process and other required notices. Unfortunately, because there is insufficient room to turn a HGV vehicle at the Earith Road layby on the B1050, it won't be possible to install a sign there.

It is expected the signs will be installed before Christmas, although this is will largely depend on other Highways work that is scheduled in the area around the same time.

Options for installing CCTV in and around Northstowe are now being explored. A system is being sought to detect and identify construction vehicles that turn in and out of Stirling Road, Northstowe. We hope to provide a further update on progress made in sourcing a suitable CCTV system in the next edition of *Willingham News*.

While there appears to be a reduction in the volume of unauthorised Northstowe construction traffic through Willingham, unfortunately residents of Oakington and Cottenham have reported a significant increase. SCDC has once again written to the developers to remind them of the approved routes and also raised the matter at developer forums.

If you witness any construction vehicles using the B1050 to enter or exit Northstowe, please do report these breaches. Evidence of any breaches will help our enforcement officers to take action. Please report directly to planning enforcement via the SCDC website: www.tinyurl.com/yxj83t5h.
