VE Day 80 Proclamation in the Village

Victory in Europe (VE) Day is the day on which the official surrender of German military operations in 1945 is remembered. It is commemorated across Europe as a holiday or a national observance of the end of the Second World War in Europe.

This year, 80 years on, communities came together to remember and pay tribute to those who fought for the freedom we enjoy today and the millions of men and women who died for that cause.

On Thursday 8 May, a proclamation to commemorate the occasion was read on the threshold of the Parish Church by the Chair of our Parish Council, Derek Law. Many residents attended to listen and pay their respects.

Willingham History Group Spy Talk and Walk

On the night of 17 September 1940, Wulf Schmidt, code name Leonhard, jumped from a Luftwaffe Heinkel aircraft in the skies above Willingham to start his crucial mission in England – part of Operation Lena on behalf of the German Abwehr, the German intelligence service.



The next morning Wulf headed down Priest Lane towards Willingham in search of some aspirin and a new watch to ease some of the damage from his disastrous landing in England. Then on to destiny as the Allies' most important double agent in World War 2.

Mystery Photo

Old Willingham



A view from the Green, probably around 1930, before the Cambridge Gas showroom (now the Library) was built. These are small cottages – note that there are five front doors, meaning that each cottage probably had one downstairs room and one upstairs with a scullery at the back. There would be no running water or bathroom. The Mannings owned these cottages and sold them for redevelopment. Note there is no gap between the cottage and the Methodist Chapel so that everything, including rubbish, had to be brought through the Chapel front door. When the land was sold, the Methodists bought a strip to solve this problem, and the strip still exists today.

Our Village Churchyard

Our village churchyard is the large parcel of land surrounding the Parish Church in the centre of the village. It is a 'closed' churchyard, containing ornate gravestones dating from the 18th and 19th centuries. For some years it has been rather neglected – ivy and weeds covered the walls of the Church and the graveyard became overgrown. We were faced with a choice: to leave it or to care for it!

In 2024 a small group of volunteers, a working party of gardeners, began a careful restoration. We cleaned the Church walls of ivy and weeds and weeded the drain. We stripped the wall that forms the graveyard perimeter with Church Street and cleaned the gravestones. We also stripped ivy growth from the yew trees. South Cambridgeshire District Council has responsibility for the maintenance of the churchyard; however, at present they mainly cut the grass, maintain the footpaths and care for the trees.

We began work again this April by clearing cow parsley and ivy from gravestones on the west side of the churchyard and weeded along the wall dividing the churchyard from the council cemetery. We are now doing a simple restoration of the flower beds surrounding the Octagon, but this will still leave large areas of ground to restore. The outcome will be to recreate four distinct restored areas:

- the Memorial Garden overlooked by the two beautifully restored garden seats and is left 'wild' for spring flowers.
- a long strip of shrubs and small trees following the wall footing, which divides the churchyard from the council cemetery. The council has agreed to undertake tree pruning to facilitate this.
- a 'wild' garden area against the Church Lane perimeter wall, west of the Church steeple
- a central area of restored gravestones facing the entrance to the Octagon Hall.

We are glad that the churchyard is a place for the village community to enjoy at weddings, gatherings and for quiet remembrance.

The working party meets on **Thursday mornings from 10 am to 12 noon**. If anyone is interested in helping with this work, please contact our Churchwarden Group at wardengroupwill@gmail.com.

Willingham Memory Box Café – What's it all about? It's about a warm welcome for all our guests, with refreshments, a chance to relax, to chat, to sing songs and have fun.

Why did we start the Memory Box Café, who are we and who runs it?

Having volunteered at the Memory Café run by Cambridge South Rotary Club in Girton, we realised that there was nothing similar in Willingham. Covid prevented us from starting until May 2022, when we were finally able to open Willingham Memory Box Café.

It was difficult at first as we had no way of knowing if anyone would come along. We had four guests and eight volunteers at our first Café. Now, three years later, we still never know if we will have any guests until they come through the door, but on average we welcome 16 to 20 guests each month.

Our Memory Box Café is held monthly on the **second Saturday of the month** from 10 am to 12 noon and, though not a 'Dementia Café', we are open to anyone living with memory loss of any kind to come along, accompanied by their carers.

For safeguarding reasons, we do have to ask that all guests are accompanied by a family member or carer. We don't give advice; our aim is just to welcome and entertain our guests so that everyone has a good time.

We welcome guests from anywhere, not just Willingham, to the Octagon, which is behind the Parish Church. There is a path suitable for wheelchairs and no steps. It's all free.

Our team are all volunteers, the leaders are DBS-checked and are trained in the safeguarding of vulnerable adults. We are supported by the Parish Church, but we don't have any religious content, are very diverse and welcome anyone of any faith or no faith.

Our next meetings will be on **14 June** and **12 July** at 10 am.

Travel Information

As the summer holidays are fast approaching many of us are turning our attention to booking holidays and making our travel plans. If you are planning to travel abroad, please consider whether you will require any vaccinations. By booking a Travel Clinic appointment (at least six weeks before your date of travel) with one of our practice nurses, they can offer a general travel consultation with advice. They are also able to administer the following vaccinations (free of charge): **Hepatitis A, Typhoid, Tetanus, Diphtheria and Polio and the MMR**. For any other vaccinations we would recommend you attend the Willingham Pharmacy and Travel Clinic (see below) or MASTA, a private travel clinic, located on Hills Road in Cambridge. Please visit our website for further information and to fill out a Travel Questionnaire, which must be completed BEFORE your appointment.

For those who are on repeat medication, please plan ahead and make sure you have enough medication to last for your time away, remembering to re-order with plenty of time before you travel and allowing at least three working days before collection. And, just in case of emergency, we would advise that you take a list of your repeat medication with you (your repeat prescription slip would be ideal).

Finally, just a reminder that the GP is unable to sign (as proof of identification) any passport/visa applications, and they will not write 'Fit to Travel/Fly' letters for our patients.

Change of Personal Details

Please let us know if you change your name, address or telephone number. A change of address may mean that you are outside our practice area and our reception team will advise you on this. It is important we have your up to date contact details in case we need to contact you at any time. You can update us by visiting <u>www.willinghammedicalpractice.nhs.uk/practice_information/change-of-personal-details</u> or by calling in to the surgery and completing a change of details form for you and other members of your household, remembering to bring your photo ID for identification.

Dispensary Telephone Lines

To avoid any delays, we politely ask that you do not use our reception team as a first port of call for your dispensary enquiries. Instead, please telephone our dispensary team directly on **01954 207602** for any medication queries or hospital discharge concerns. Any questions will be dealt with as swiftly as possible, however you may still require an appointment with the GP if a medication needs authorisation. Our dispensary telephone lines are open DAILY from **10 am to 12 noon** and **3 to 4 pm** but please note that we do not take orders for repeat medications over the telephone.

Vaccinations

- The Pneumococcal Vaccine is available year-round for everyone who is aged 65 years and over.
- The RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) Vaccine is available year round for everyone who is aged between 75 and 79 years of age and for all pregnant women who are over 28 weeks.
- The Shingles Vaccine is available year round for everyone who is aged between 70 and 79 years of age and has never received a shingles vaccine, for individuals who reach the age of 65 or 70 years of age during the period 01/09/23 and 31/08/28 (these individuals should be vaccinated on or after (but not before) their 65th or 70th birthday), individuals who are aged 50 years and above and meet the definition of severe immunosuppression and for those who are aged between 18 and 49 years and are receiving a stem cell transplant. Please note, when booking your second (booster) shingles vaccination, that this cannot be administered any sooner (even by one day) than six calendar months after the first vaccination was given.

Patient Participation Group (PPG) Meetings

The PPG brings together patients, GPs and staff from a GP practice. They meet to discuss issues relating to their surgery and the services provided to patients. This allows GPs and staff to work with patients to plan services which best meet the needs of the people who use those services. All our patients are welcome. The next meeting will be held on **Wednesday 9 July**, **1 30 to 3 30 pm** at the Longstanton Surgery.

Annual Meeting of the Parish Council

At the Annual Meeting, all Council posts are elected. The Chair and all lead councillors remain in post. Councillor James Hutchcraft was unanimously elected as Vice Chair. All councillors and their rôles are listed on the Council website.

Flooding

The Council Chair and a local expert continue to attend (remotely) meetings of the Multi-Agency Group for this area with representatives from Anglian Water, Cambridge Water, the Environment Agency, Cambridgeshire County Council, South Cambridgeshire District Council and other Parish Councils, to discuss and co-ordinate flooding responses. The focus has been trying to find ways to keep surface water out of the sewage system, particularly from new building. The main problem is, as always, lack of funding. Secondly, current planning legislation only allows water companies to comment on new builds. This is unlike other consultees, such as Highways, which can insist on compliance.

Community Policing Quarterly Survey

Each quarter Cambridge Constabulary asks you to fill out an online survey to build up a picture of what is happening in our area and what is concerning you most. There is then an online meeting where you will hear direct from the officers policing our area about recent activity, listen to any concerns, present the results of the survey and allow you to shape future activity.
