## **Nature's Names**

The wren is a bird which, around our village and beyond, is heard more than it is seen, being quite elusive as it hunts on the ground beneath vegetation. Even in autumn, it is often keen to hold its territory, and does so with the help of its loud whistling and trilling, and an angry 'tic, tic, tic.' For a tiny bird that is about the same weight as a £1 coin, it can certainly belt out a song!

The name originates from *werna*, a name from the Old High German language. It morphed into Old English *wrenna*. In Old High German, the wren was also called *kuningilin* — translated as *kinglet* — due to the *King of Birds* fable in which it competed with the eagle for the bird that could fly the highest.

In terms of home building, wrens have a tendency of being opportunistic. They will make use of other birds' nests if possible, often a swallow's nest and even those of large birds like the heron.

If a male feels inclined to build, it will construct the outer parts of several nests, maybe up to eight or nine, and a chosen female, in their wren version of *Dragon's Den*, will select the best and finish it. Often the male wren will then try to attract another female and she will choose the best of what's left. Apparently, wrens have only a one-inthree chance of surviving through their first year; all this amorous behaviour can obviously be quite wearing.

In literature over the centuries there are many warnings of suffering coming to any person who harms a wren. In William Blake's *Auguries of Innocence*, which he wrote around 1800, he said, 'He who should hurt the little wren / Shall never be belov'd by men'. You have been warned!

#### **Trivia Corner**

Chocolate. Who doesn't like it? Not many, but here are some snippets of trivia associated with the confectionary. It was consumed as a cold or hot drink well before it became a solid treat. In England the drink was taken by intellectuals and thinkers — a nervous Charles II tried to close down coffee and chocolate cafés in the 1660s to discourage such alarming behaviour as thinking!

Reportedly, the first known shipment into Britain of cocoa beans, from a seized Spanish ship off our south coast in the 1500s, was mistaken on arrival for bags of sheep droppings and destroyed. It's understandable to ask yourself the question – why didn't they taste it first?

Fry's chocolate is one of the best-known products; J S Fry and Sons Ltd began in Bristol around 1760. In 1866, they launched the first mass-produced chocolate bar, Fry's Chocolate Cream. Their Turkish Delight was launched in 1914. And who remembers Fry's Five Boys? The boy's expressions on the five photos on the wrapper represented desperation, pacification, expectation, acclamation and realisation as he tucked into the bar. The boy model who was photographed for the original design recalled later that his father had made him cry for the first photo by wrapping a cloth soaked in ammonia around his neck. (It's called suffering for one's art.)

And let's not get too far into the Snickers / Marathon wrangle. Snickers was the name of the bar in the USA but, obviously, Marathon was initially chosen for the UK market because 'Marathon' didn't rhyme with anything remotely saucy. Or so the story goes...

#### Weight Management Injections

Despite recent media attention, our GPs are currently unable to prescribe weight management injections directly to our patients. Only a very small number of people will meet the strict eligibility criteria for the initial NHS roll out of this medication. These criteria have been set nationally:

 You have a BMI of 40kg/m2 or above (or 37.5 kg/m2 for people from South Asian, Chinese, other Asian, Middle Eastern, Black African or African-Caribbean ethnic backgrounds).

AND at least FOUR out of the following five health conditions which have already been diagnosed by your GP or other health professional:

- Established Type 2 diabetes
- Hypertension requiring blood pressure lowering therapy
- Atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease
- Obstructive sleep apnoea where treatment is indicated i.e. continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP)
- Dyslipidaemia requiring treatment

If you meet these criteria, your GP can refer you to the Tier 3 Weight Management Service provided by Healthy You. Patients not meeting the criteria listed above should not seek referral for Tirzepatide (Mounjaro®) at this time.

#### Healthy You Weight Management

Would you like help to lose weight? *Healthy You* offer a weight management service FREE of charge for those that are residents of Cambridgeshire. If eligible, you can register for *Slimming World, Weight Watchers* or the *Healthy You* programme for a duration of 12 weeks. To refer into this programme please call 0333 005 0093 or fill in the self-referral form via their website <u>Healthyyou.org.uk</u>.

#### **Hospital Bloods**

Unfortunately the surgery does not have the capacity to carry out hospital-requested blood tests. If you have been asked by your hospital consultant / clinic to arrange a blood test then please use the Phlebotomy Clinic at the hospital or the drive-through Outpatient Phlebotomy Service at the Newmarket Road Park & Ride, referring to your hospital clinic letter for further information. Please also note that the surgery does not carry out blood tests requested by private consultants or those required for private appointments.

#### **Repeat Prescriptions**

Repeat medication can be ordered via SystmOnline, using the NHS App or by handing in paper repeat prescription slips to the surgeries at Willingham or Longstanton as well as the Willingham Pharmacy.

current turnaround for regular repeat prescriptions is THREE WORKING DAYS (this DOES NOT include weekends) so please be aware of this when ordering and give yourself plenty of time to ensure you don't run out of medication.

We will always help where we can with urgent orders. However, this is always subject to stock availability so we cannot guarantee we can fulfil a prescription quickly. In these circumstances we will be in contact to advise.

#### **Private Insurance Work**

The GPs will complete most private insurance documentation (e.g. claim forms for holiday cancellations, private healthcare questionnaires, factual medical reports etc.) however, these are not covered under the NHS contract. As a result, because the GPs need to prioritise their clinical work, these types of requests may take a while so please allow 30 days for your request to be completed and be aware that charges will apply.

#### Vaccinations

The Pneumococcal Vaccine is available year round for everyone who is aged 65 years and over.

The RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) Vaccine is available year round for everyone who is aged between 75 and 79 years of age and for all pregnant women who are over 28 weeks.

The Shingles Vaccine is available year round for everyone who is aged between 70 and 79 years of age and have never received a shingles vaccine, for individuals who reach the age of 65 or 70 years of age during the period 01/09/23 and 31/08/2028 (these individuals should be vaccinated on or after (but not before) their 65th or 70th birthday), individuals who are aged 50 years and above and meet the definition of severe immunosuppression and for those who are aged between 18 and 49 years and receiving a stem cell transplant. Please note, when booking your second (booster) shingles vaccination, that this cannot be administered any sooner (even by one day) than six calendar months after the first vaccination was given.



# Young Readers'

#### Hello Young Readers and, maybe, Young Writers!

Have you ever wanted to write a book? Maybe you should start with writing a short story — here are some tips on how to get started.

Don't just start writing and hope that somehow you might end up with a story. You need a plan! First, you will need to have a good idea of the main character or characters — this is called a Character Profile. Here are some ideas: think of details of the character: their name, their hair colour, how tall they are, how they speak, their hobbies, their family, etc. Write all this on the first of the pages in a planning notebook. Then you need to think of a plot! The plot of a story is often called a 'Story Mountain' it begins with the opening, in which you introduce your characters. Then the plot 'climbs' as you build up the story with something to be solved; then you create a problem or some difficulty for the character, making the story more thrilling. Then it's down the 'story mountain' as your hero solves the problem — this is called the **resolution**. To end, there's a conclusion, where all ends up okay... or, if you want to make it different, create a clever twist, in which something you wrote about earlier turns out to be not quite what it seemed.

So, on your plan, write down headings... Opening, Build-Up, Problem, Resolution, Conclusion.

To start, it might be useful to think about the character first then the problem they will have to overcome. To help you, look for inspiration in books of facts, newspaper headlines, people you see in the street, unusual things you see in a shop, a museum or even at home!

And don't rush! Keep a notebook, and eventually an idea will come. And maybe, in a future issue of *Willingham News*, you might see your story in print!




## Willingham History Group (WHIG)

#### Flowers on Graves

There was a recent BBC article regarding flowers on graves in Haddenham, but it also mentioned that Willingham had similar 'lawn only' regulations in place. However, our response is that in Willingham we do not put restrictions on the flowers or plants put on a grave space, provided they comply with cemetery terms and conditions and are not a safety issue. We have a wild growing area which is only cut at the end of each growing season, and our cemetery management is often commended by visitors.

#### **Postal Voting**

If you are someone who relies on postal voting, you may be one of the 15,000 South Cambs postal voters whose applications are due to expire in January 2026, after their three operating statutory years. Voters are currently being contacted to invite them to reapply, but if you have any questions you may message the elections team on elections@scambs.gov.uk.

#### **Recreation Ground**

Sadly, there was some nasty graffiti around the pavilion in July, which was swiftly dealt with by our excellent office team. Clear pictures of the perpetrators were captured on our CCTV. Fingers crossed, at the time of writing this has not been repeated.

Last July there was standing water on a very soggy lower recreation ground. This July it was so dry that, while one of the few grassy areas in Willingham that was still green due to it being low lying flood plain, it unusually showed clearly visible darker stripes marking the locations of drainage pipes into the lode. We photographed them with a drone for future reference.

It is lovely to see this open space being well used, and the cricket and football clubs are among those groups able to make good use of it. We would ask that the No Dogs signs please be respected, both there and on the QEII field: even small traces of dog faeces can be a health hazard.

#### Safety on our Roads

The Council are hoping to introduce some give-way traffic calming on Earith Road near the Orchard. If the project goes ahead, it would be using \$106 monies ring-fenced for specific highways issues. We would like some specific yes/no feed back on the idea. Please let the council office know by **25 September** whether you support the idea or not. Similar details will be found on the Facebook pages.

Thankfully the nesting season is ending and hedges can be cut back to help those using our cycle paths. It is a big thank you to the patient motorists who give more room for cyclists, and there are currently more on our village roads. Horses also need to be afforded a similar margin when being passed. Also, can the drivers of horse boxes be given a gentle reminder that their box wheels are much wider than their vehicle pulling the box, meaning an even greater gap is needed when passing other road users.

#### 20 mph Scheme Update

Although these new schemes need two years to really understand their effectiveness, teething problems can arise and those relating to roads in Willingham are being investigated. So please be patient, don't speed through – or worse, overtake – as such selfish driving can be really dangerous to all.




