

Only long-time village residents will recognise this. It is Short Lane as seen from Green Street. On the left was a rather odd farm house – long and with windows placed asymmetrically. Behind it was a large farmyard stretching down the lane. On the right was a single story industrial building that was, at one time, a petrol station and workshop but, in more recent years, a furniture maker. The farmhouse lasted until the early 2000s but is now attractive new houses – part of the gradual transition of Willingham from a working farm village to a desirable residential one.

Nature's Names

What would Christmas be without holly? A bit less prickly, maybe, but its folklore and traditions go back many centuries, even before Christianity used it as a symbol of belief and eternal life. Back in Roman days, holly was closely associated with the god Saturn, and the mid-December Saturnalia festival was traditionally celebrated with boughs of holly. Symbolically, the smooth, shapely leaves of some varieties represented the female gender, whilst the spiky ones were the masculine. (Discuss!)

How about the actual origin of the word? *Holly* is a reduced form of the Old English *holegn* (5th to 12th century) and later, in Middle English (12th to 15th century) it was *holin* or *hollen*. The Proto-Germanic *hulin* is likely to be the ultimate origin. The word *hollin* is still used as a dialectal name for a group of holly trees.

There are many songs and poems which mention holly. King Henry VIII, probably not your dream date but well known as a lyricist in his early days, wrote the love song *Green Groweth the Holly*, years before he became a bit of a tinker and (spoiler alert) started his collection of wives. It went like this...

Green groweth the holly, So doth the ivy.

Though winter blasts blow never so high, Green groweth the holly...

It goes on and, to be brutally honest, doesn't get any better. It's not banging, as they say. Maybe it sounded okay when belted out by a couple of fair Tudor maidens backed by lute and harpsichord with a few random key changes.

Let's end on an 'ah, nice!' note, with fairly local poet John Clare. His poem *Winter Walk* talks about the beauty and resilience of nature in winter...

*The holly bush, a sober lump of green,
Shines through the leafless shrubs all brown and grey,
And smiles at winter be it e'er so keen
With all the leafy luxury of May...*

If you're so minded, look up the rest of the poem and, while you're at it, try and find John Clare's poem *Christmas*. It has holly, ivy, 'mistletoe', 'Morrice dances', spicy ale, shepherds kissing giggling maids, plus bucketloads of other festive jollity which will certainly help create an image of an 18th century family Christmas. In the words of Tiny Tim: *God bless us, every one!*

The Night Sky in December

Jupiter is the brightest planet visible in December, rising in the east, for example, about 6 pm on Christmas Eve. Our closest neighbours Venus and Mars aren't readily detectable due to being lost in the Sun's glare. (Venus will reappear in Spring's evening sky.) However, tiny Mercury, only slightly larger than our Moon and the Solar System's innermost world, is easily visible this month in a clear morning sky just before the Sun 'gets up'. It's a planet that, from our perspective, is never very far from the Sun and will be low in the east. For example, on 17 December at around 7 am, it will be seen rising very close to a slim crescent moon before dropping back below our horizon. Such naked-eye sightings of Mercury aren't common!

Advent Window Trail



Willingham Gardening Club

On Monday 3 November, we welcomed guest speaker Jim Paine with his talk *Climate Change: the long-range gardener's forecast*. This wide-ranging talk asked how, as gardeners, we can respond and adapt to climate change, offering practical solutions to enjoy continued success in our gardens and ways in which we can conserve and nurture biodiversity. Here are some approaches:

1. Grow from seed to reduce carbon footprint.
2. Plant resilient perennials, such as sedum, echinacea purpurea, helianthemum and eryngium, that can withstand the challenges posed by extreme weather conditions.
3. Use raised beds – with warmer, wetter winters, raised beds offer better drainage and easier maintenance.
4. Harvest water – add water butts to your garden to capture rainwater that you can use for watering. Any overflow can be used to create a pond.
5. Soil management – nurture the soil ecosystem: healthy soils are much less prone to flooding.
6. Plant trees – they reduce carbon dioxide and have a cooling effect.

Our next meeting will be our Christmas party, a members-only event. There is no meeting in January.

The Gardening Club meets on the first Monday of the month at the Social Club, with refreshments from 7 pm. The meeting begins at 7.30 pm. There is an entrance fee of £4 for non-members.
